Mike Wallace has been a CBS NEWS/60 Minutes Correspondent and Co-editor and now Correspondent Emeritus, since its premiere on Sept. 24, 1968. Among his recent journalistic triumphs was his headline-making sit-down with Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, the president of Iran, in Aug. '06, which won him his 21st Emmy award. His awards and honors include a Lifetime Achievement Emmy, three Alfred I. duPont-Columbia University Awards, three George Foster Peabody Awards and a Robert F. Kennedy Journalism Award in the international broadcast category. In June '91, he was inducted into the Television Academy Hall of Fame and, in Sept. 1991, and was named Broadcaster of the Year by the International Radio and Television Society in 1993. Wallace was born May 9, 1918, in Brookline, Mass. He graduated from the University of Michigan in 1939 with a B.A. degree. He has a son, Chris, a journalist with FOX News, a daughter, Pauline, and lives in New York with his wife, Mary.
