Major Developments

Update: ConocoPhillips Says Rates Still Reduced at Westlake, Louisiana Refinery Citgo Says Lake Charles, Louisiana Refinery at Normal Processing Rates

According to ConocoPhillips, production is still running at reduced rates at its 240,000 b/d Westlake, Louisiana refinery despite the reopening of the Calcasieu Ship Channel. According to Citgo Petroleum, production has returned to normal processing rates of 425,000 b/d at its Lake Charles refinery due to the reopening of the ship channel and the completion of planned maintenance work on a crude distillation unit, which has been out of service for two months. During the Calcasieu Ship Channel closure, both refineries were approved for loans from the U.S. Strategic Petroleum Reserve. Citgo said that it received its 250,000 barrel shipment by pipeline from the reserve by June 30. The third Lake Charles refinery, Calcasieu Refining Co.'s 85,000 b/d facility, has not recently reported its status but was running at 20 percent of capacity last Friday. The three Lake Charles area refineries, which make up about 4 percent of U.S. refining capacity, were forced to cut rates when the Calcasieu Ship Channel was shut due to an oil spill for 10 days beginning June 21. On Tuesday, the U.S. Coast Guard said tanker traffic on the ship channel was still running at reduced speed.

Shell Worker and Oil Rig Security Guard Kidnapped in Nigeria

A worker at an unfinished Shell gas processing plant in the Niger Delta was kidnapped on July 6 in the latest in a series of kidnappings and attacks by militants directed against oil and gas interests in Nigeria. In addition, a security guard was also kidnapped following a failed raid on an offshore oil rig. The first victim, a Dutchman, was taken following protests in the local community concerning jobs and investments in the community. The security guard was taken from a rig operated by Transocean for Conoil. According to sources, the attack had no affected on operations at the rig.
