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Preface

The 2006 edition of *Latin America and the Caribbean: Selected Economic and Social Data* (the LAC Databook) includes the most recent data at the time of publication from a multitude of international and national sources. The Bureau for Latin America and the Caribbean of the US Agency for International Development presents this Databook with the goal of gathering and presenting the most up-to-date information possible from official country sources and leading international institutions compiled in a single reference. Data tables provide statistics useful for regional analysis, and more summary charts have been added throughout the book compared to previous editions. Presentation of many of the tables and figures in the LAC Databook allows for comparisons to be made across both countries and time. If interpreted with care, the data in this publication can present a useful picture of the state and progress of socioeconomic development in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The LAC Databook has a publicly available online counterpart at <http://qesdb.usaid.gov/lac> where the data that is reported in the Databook is continuously updated. A link to this website is provided on the USAID website. From www.usaid.gov, select "Latin America and the Caribbean" under the "Locations" heading. Then select "Economic and Social Database" in the sidebar at the top right of the page. At the LAC Databook's website, users can construct their own data tables that can be saved in html, spreadsheet, and text formats. The online database and the print publication share the same organizational scheme. From the same Internet site, a copy of this print edition can be downloaded in PDF format in its entirety and by individual chapter.

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Table Format

Tables are numbered by section and display the table name and data unit when appropriate. For most tables, countries are listed alphabetically within the appropriate sub-region of Latin America and the Caribbean (i.e. Caribbean, Central America, and South America). Sub-regional headings, as well as totals and averages are listed below each list of corresponding countries. Note that several countries located in Central and South America (Belize, Guyana, Falkland Islands, French Guiana, and Suriname) have been placed in the Caribbean sub-region for the purposes of this analysis. An explanation of the geographic breakdown employed in the 2006 LAC Databook follows.

Rationale for LAC Geographic Breakdown

The LAC Bureau's rationale for placing Belize, Guyana, Suriname, and French Guiana in the Caribbean sub-region is based not on geography but on economics (trade relations), politics (international relations), and culture (European heritage). Belize, Guyana, and Suriname define themselves as Caribbean as they are members of CARICOM (the Caribbean Community). Belize and Guyana also share membership in CARICOM with ten other ex-British colonies in the Caribbean/Atlantic area. Suriname and French Guiana are politically related to The Netherlands and France, respectively, as are a number of islands in the Caribbean. Guyana, Suriname, and French Guiana are oriented more to Europe and to the Caribbean—economically, politically, and culturally—than to the ten South American countries whose European heritage lies in the Iberian peninsula. Similarly, Belize is oriented more to the Caribbean region and to Europe than to the other six countries of Central America.

The same rationale applies to the Falkland Islands, which are remote from the Caribbean, but oriented much more toward Europe than to South America.

Data Standards and Methodology

The 2006 edition of the LAC Databook, like earlier editions, relies on national estimates reported by US and foreign government agencies, and internationally recognized organizations. As such, the veracity of this report depends on the standardization and consistency of data produced by these offices.

Even when standardized international sources are used, a number of problems remain for any user of statistical data. Despite the considerable efforts to collect, process and disseminate social and economic statistics and to standardize definitions and data collection methods, limitations remain in the coverage, consistency and comparability of data across time and countries. Also, significant shifts and breaks in statistical series can occur when statistical bodies and research institutions update or alter their estimates using new sources of data, such as censuses and surveys. Discrepancies in data presented in different editions of the LAC Databook reflect updates by countries as well as revisions to historical series and changes in methodology. Thus readers are advised to compare data series between editions of the LAC Databook with caution.

Series Duplication

The LAC Databook functions as a survey of the most current, reliable statistics on the state of development in Latin America and the Caribbean. As such, in some instances, the same indicator is presented more than once, using different sources. This is the case for the population, poverty, and gross domestic product series and for many of the regional comparison indicators as well. This method, along with detailed technical notes for each indicator, allows readers to choose what they consider to be the most accurate data set based on source, definition, and methodology, and the purpose for which they are seeking the data.

Conventions

As used in this publication, the term “country” does not in all cases refer to a territorial state entity as understood by international law and practice; the term also covers some non-sovereign territorial entities for which statistical data are maintained and provided internationally on a separate and independent basis.

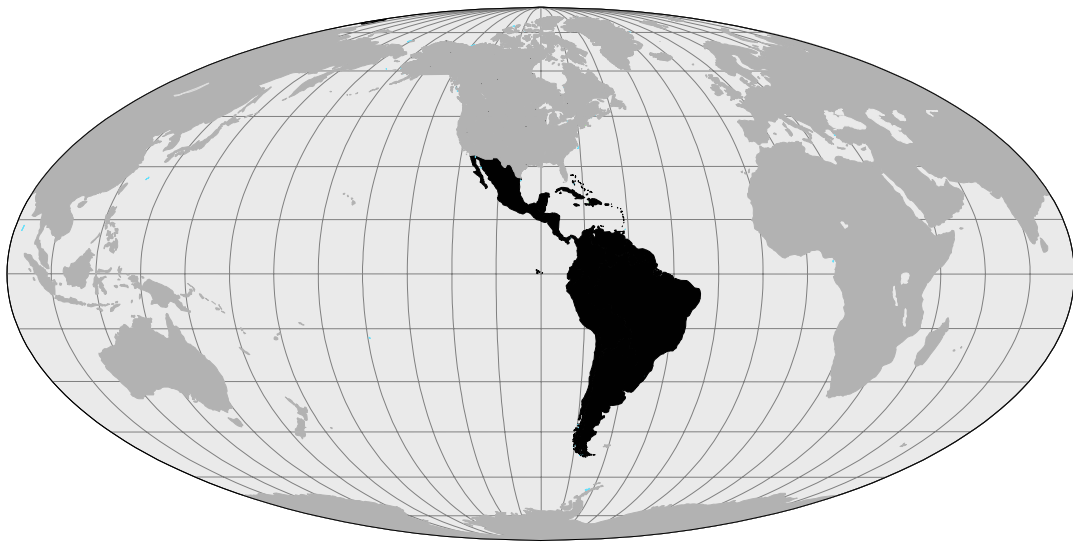
Unless otherwise stated, all dollar amounts are expressed as current U.S. dollars.

OVERVIEW

The United States Government supports a democratic hemisphere that trades freely and works toward regional integration. To help analyze the progress that has been achieved in the region's development, USAID's Bureau for Latin America and the Caribbean annually publishes *Latin America and the Caribbean: Selected Economic and Social Data*. Since the early 1990s, the LAC Databook has offered its users a single reference that draws from a wide range of reliable data sources and provides cross-country and trend data on various dimensions of economic and social development in the LAC region. Examination of the data included in this edition of the LAC Databook provides a view of a region that has grown economically in the aggregate but continues to face broad issues of inequalities and social exclusion.

The regional economy of Latin America and the Caribbean has continued to expand since 2002. Since then, aggregate real GDP growth has averaged about 4% annually, macroeconomic volatility has subsided, regional inflation has fallen to single digits, unemployment has decreased, foreign investment in the region has picked up, and total external debt in the region has fallen. Two forces have received significant credit for driving this economic performance: escalating world prices in commodities that LAC countries export, and effective fiscal and monetary policy as practiced by LAC countries. These positive results notwithstanding, other data lead one to consider whether such performance and circumstances are sufficient to deliver the gains of such growth more equitably to the region's residents and to alleviate the region's persistently high rates of poverty.

To study this question, we can examine the data presented in this publication to see that the health sector is improving, but with mixed results. The prevalence of HIV/AIDS continues to climb, and the region continues to face inconsistent quality and access to health services. In almost every country, roughly one-half of all health expenses must be financed privately. Child and infant mortality rates have fallen over time but still demonstrate wide disparity between countries. For example, Costa Rica's infant mortality rate is 9.7 deaths per thousand infants, and Honduras' rate is 25.8. Looking at immunization rates, although the gap between the best performing country and the poorest performing country was larger in 1985 than it was in 1999, it has not narrowed since.

Further analysis of the region's development reveals a mixed story in the education sector as well. In a region known for poor teacher preparation, government expenditures on educating the region's future workforce have grown in some countries but fallen in others. Literacy rates are noticeably higher for children than for adults; and both primary and secondary enrolment rates are generally improved, with few exceptions. However, the difference between secondary and primary enrolment rates persists to a high degree.

In addition to human capital formation, social and economic advancement still relies on each person's ability to pursue their economic and democratic freedoms. In March, 2006, Secretary Rice remarked that "it's not enough just to have economic growth. You then also have to have a commitment of governments, particularly democratic governments, because they are held accountable by their own people to address those issues of upward mobility, the issues of social

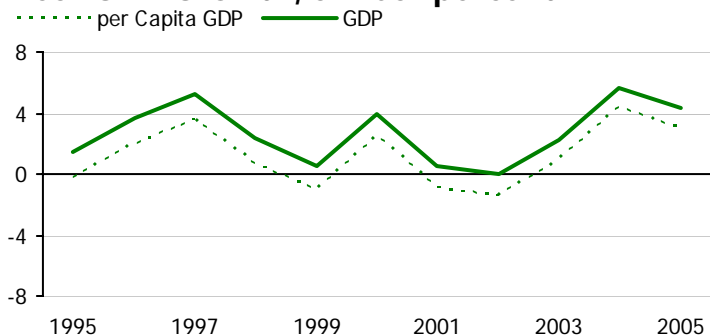
welfare.” Some notable cases of political expression have borne out this idea in 2006. We can see a strong correlation between higher living standards and democratic freedoms. Although perceptions of political rights have eroded recently, regional indicators of governance, including control of corruption, the rule of law, and government effectiveness, have improved over the past years.

While improvement in governance and democratic institutions affect a country’s residents directly, the consequences of such progress don’t stop there. Foreign investors are more likely to invest in countries where they expect their investments to be protected and respected in legal and governmental fora. Given the improved economic and democratic performance, it is therefore not surprising that foreign investment in the LAC region as a whole has grown recently. Compared to the late 1990s, net investment inflows to Central America are similar to previous levels, and the Caribbean’s net inflows have far surpassed what they used to be. In contrast, however, South America’s net foreign investment inflows, though continuing to lead the entire LAC region, are far below the levels seen in the late 1990s.

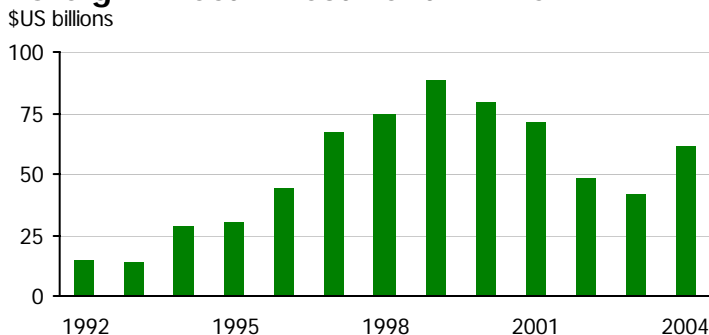
Since South America’s aggregate economy is larger than the other sub-regions, its continued high level of foreign assistance income belies its low reliance on foreign aid compared to the other sub-regions. As measured relative to recipients’ Gross National Income, the average Caribbean country’s reliance on foreign assistance has greatly diminished since the early 1990s. Central America, on the other hand, continues to rely on high levels of bilateral and multilateral foreign aid. For the LAC region as a whole, the United States, Japan, Spain, and Germany have been leading donors since 2001. However, donor assistance to the region continues to be outstripped and outpaced by investment from the United States and the rest of the world.

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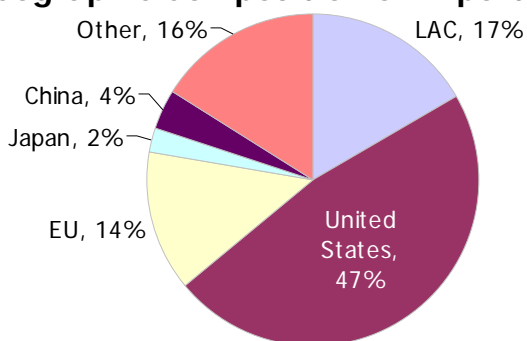
Real GDP Growth, annual percent



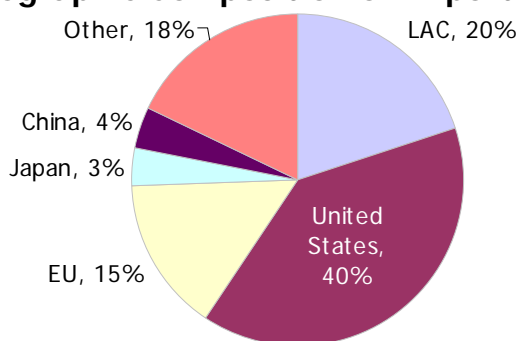
Foreign Direct Investment in LAC



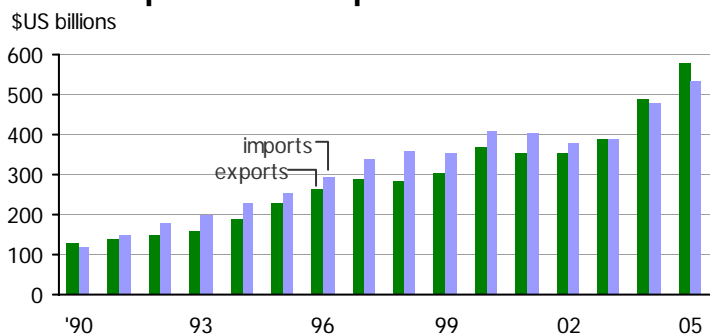
Geographic Composition of Exports — 2005



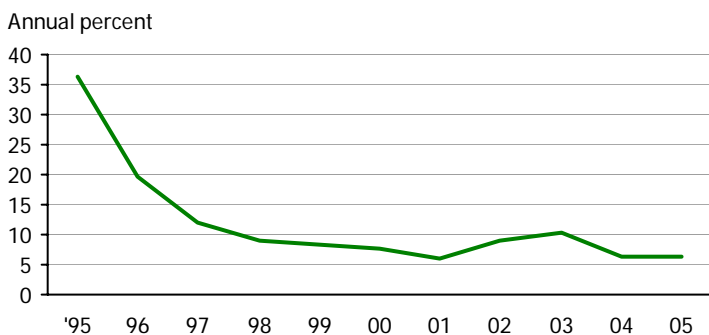
Geographic Composition of Imports — 2005



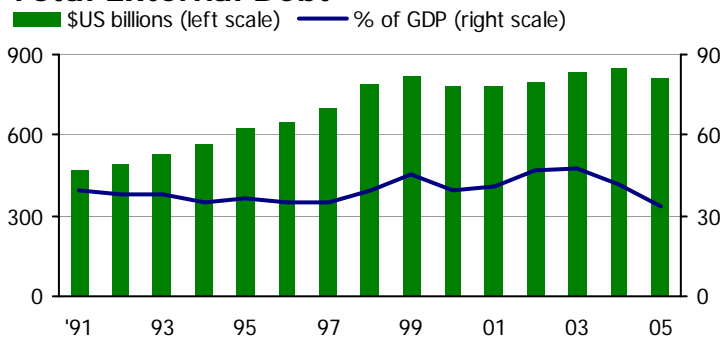
Total Exports and Imports



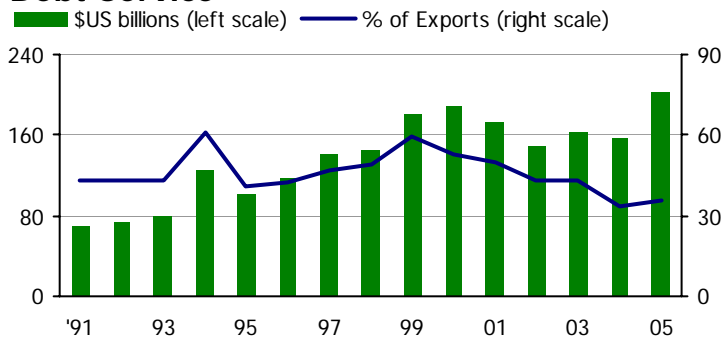
Inflation

The HDI is based on three indicators: longevity, as measured by life expectancy at birth; educational attainment, as measured by a combination of adult literacy (two-thirds weight) and the combined first-, second-, and third-level gross enrollment ratio (one-third weight); and standard of living, as measured by real GDP per capita in purchasing power parity dollars (PPP\$). *HDI Rank* Rankings are made using HDI values to the sixth decimal place. *Gender Development Index* Measures achievements in the same dimensions as the HDI but captures inequalities in achievement between men and women. The GDI is the HDI adjusted downward for gender inequality so that the greater the degree of gender disparity in human development, the lower the GDI would be relative to the HDI. Therefore, a country with a high HDI and low GDI would imply a high degree of human development, but that most of that development accrues to men more than to women. *GDP Per Capita in purchasing power parity dollars (PPP\$)* The market value of total output of goods and services for final use produced by an economy, divided by its population, and converted into U.S. dollars on the basis of the purchasing power parity of its currency. The *purchasing power parity* of an economy's currency reflects the number of units of that currency required to purchase the same (or similar) representative basket of goods and services that a U.S. dollar (the reference currency) would buy in the United States. *Life Expectancy At Birth* The average number of years a person can expect to live at current levels of mortality. *Adult Literacy Rate* reflects the percentage of people aged 15 and above who can, with understanding, both read and write a short, simple statement about their everyday life. *Gross Enrollment Ratio* is the number of students enrolled in a level of education, whether or not they belong in the relevant age group for that level, as a percentage of the population in the relevant age group for that level. As such, a high ratio does not necessarily indicate a successful school system because the gross enrollment ratio includes overage and underage enrollments.

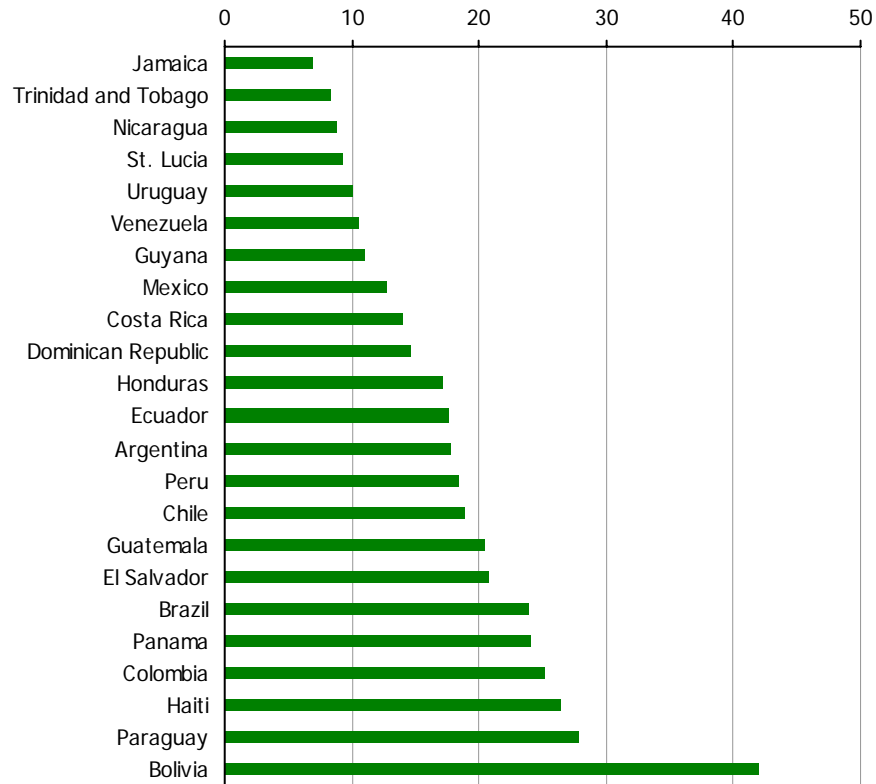

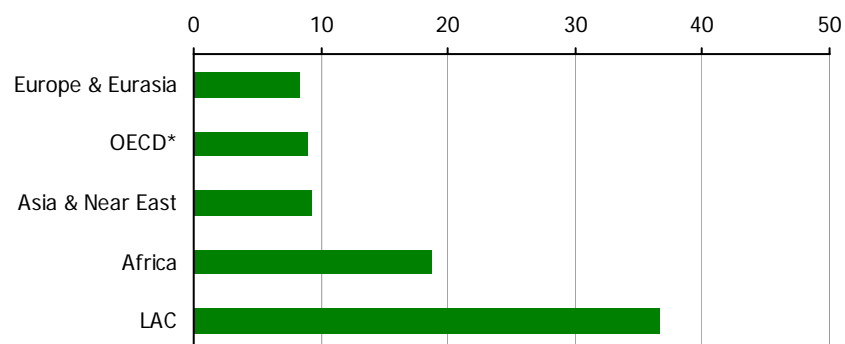
Income Inequality in LAC

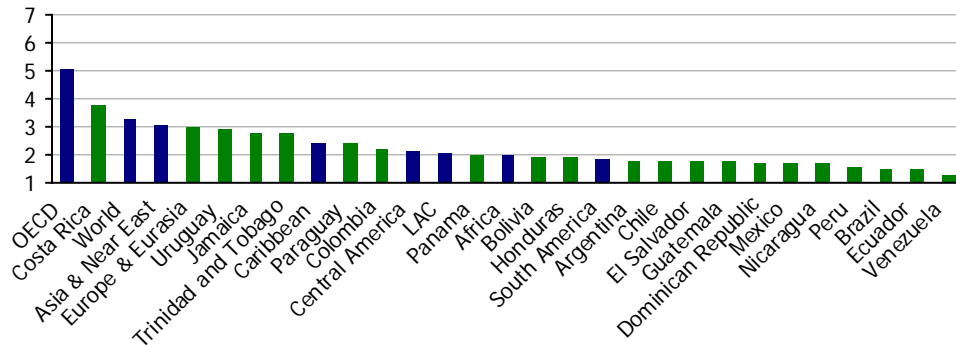

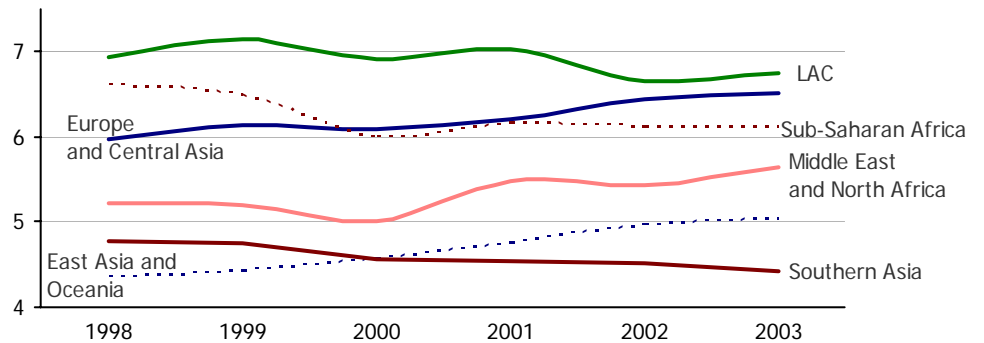
Difference in Quality of Healthcare between Rich and Poor

Total Regional Health Expenditures

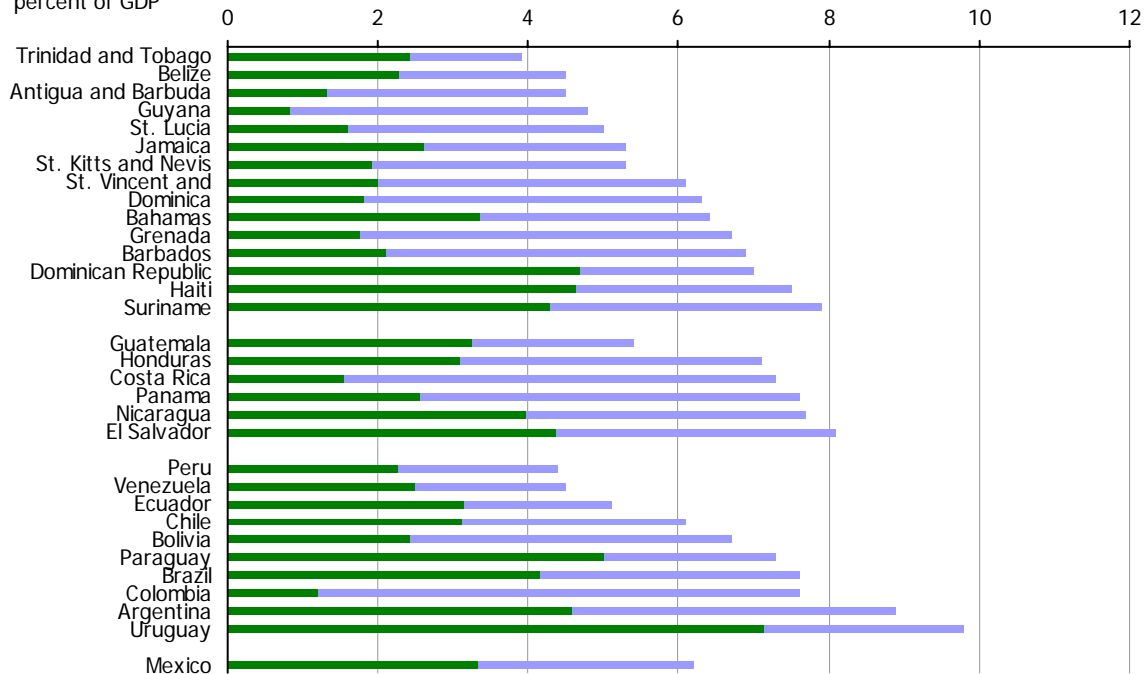
percent of GDP

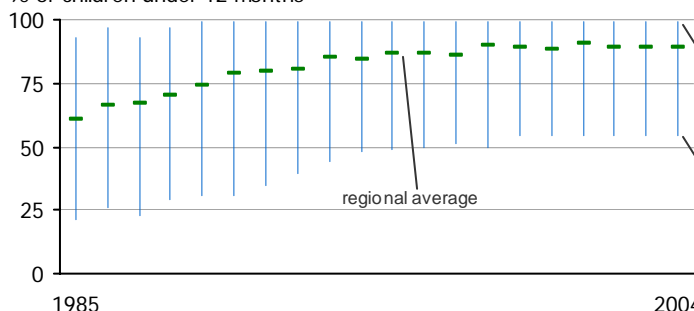

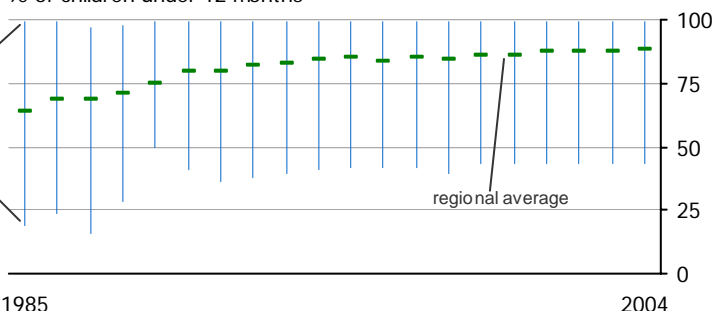
Measles Immunization Rate in LAC

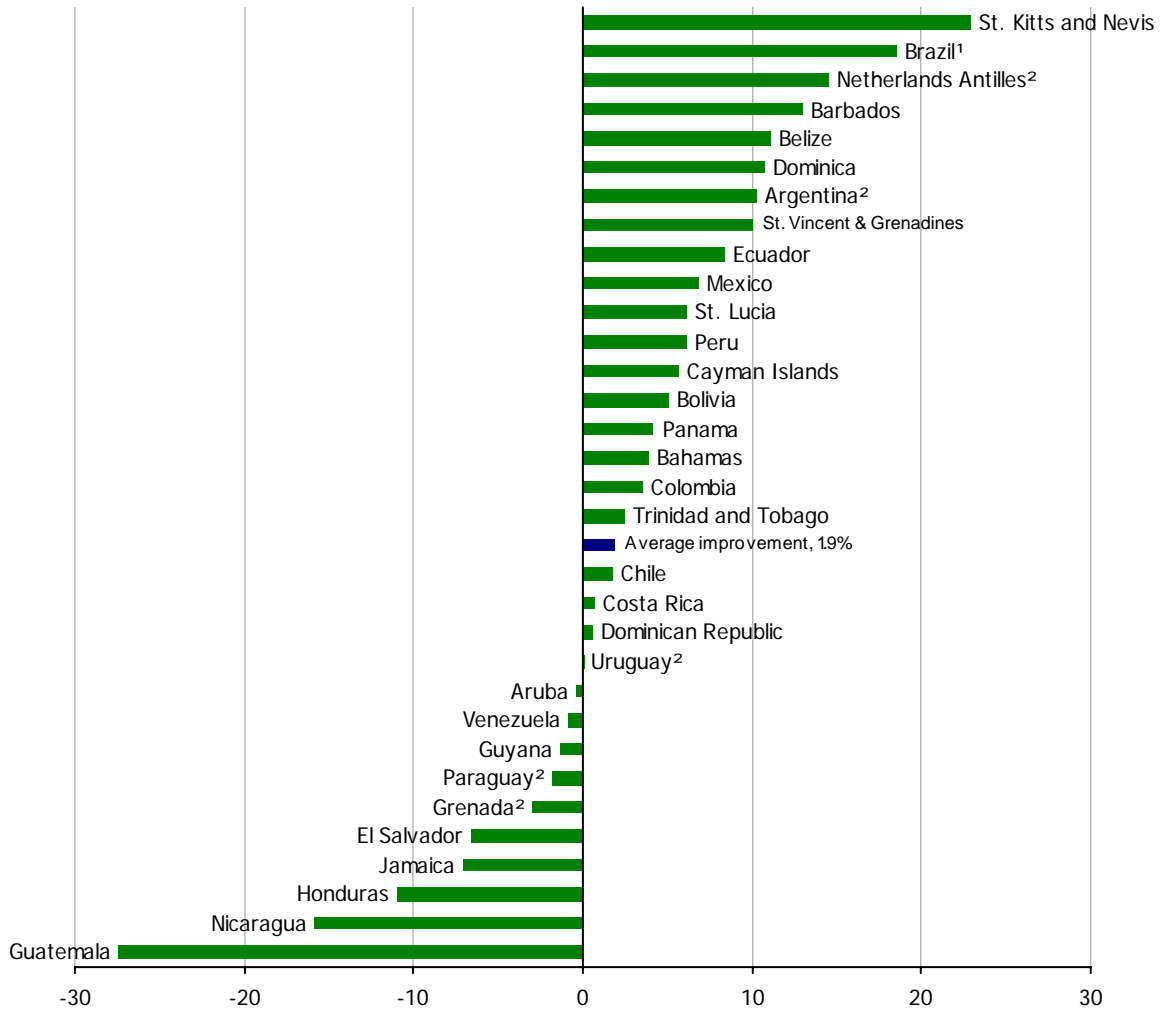

Owing to under-reporting of deaths, these case fatality rates are lower than the true values. *Reported cumulative cases Adults & Children* is the total number of AIDS cases in adults and children officially reported by the country since the beginning of the epidemic.

Deaths, children estimated range is the estimated number of children (under age 15) who died of AIDS. Depending upon the reliability of the data available, there may be more or less uncertainty surrounding each estimate. Therefore, both low and high estimates are presented. The wider the range between the low and the high, the greater the uncertainty surrounding the country's estimates, which in turn depends mainly on the quality, coverage and consistency of the country's surveillance system. *AIDS orphans* is the estimated number of children aged 0-14, as of end 2001, who have lost one or both parents to AIDS. *Estimated number of people living with HIV/AIDS* include all people with HIV infection, whether or not they have developed symptoms of AIDS, alive at the end of 1997 and 2003. *Adults (15-49)* is the estimated number of adults living with HIV/AIDS includes all people with HIV infection, whether or not they have developed symptoms of AIDS, that are alive at the end of the year of reporting. *Adult rate* is the estimated number of adults living with HIV/AIDS divided by the adult population. *Women (15-49)* is the estimated number of women (aged 15-49) living with HIV/AIDS. *Children* is the estimated number of children (under age 15) living with HIV/AIDS.

Notes The global HIV epidemic currently involves two viruses: *HIV-1 and HIV-2*. Data in this table refer to both viruses. HIV-1 is the dominant type worldwide. HIV-2 is found principally in West Africa, but cases have been reported in East Africa, Europe, Asia and Latin America. While the means of transmission for the two viruses are the same, HIV-2 appears to be less easily transmitted than HIV-1 and the progression from HIV-2 infection to AIDS appears to be slower than that for HIV-1. *AIDS* is a late-stage infection characterized by a severely weakened immune system that can no longer ward off life-threatening infections and cancers.

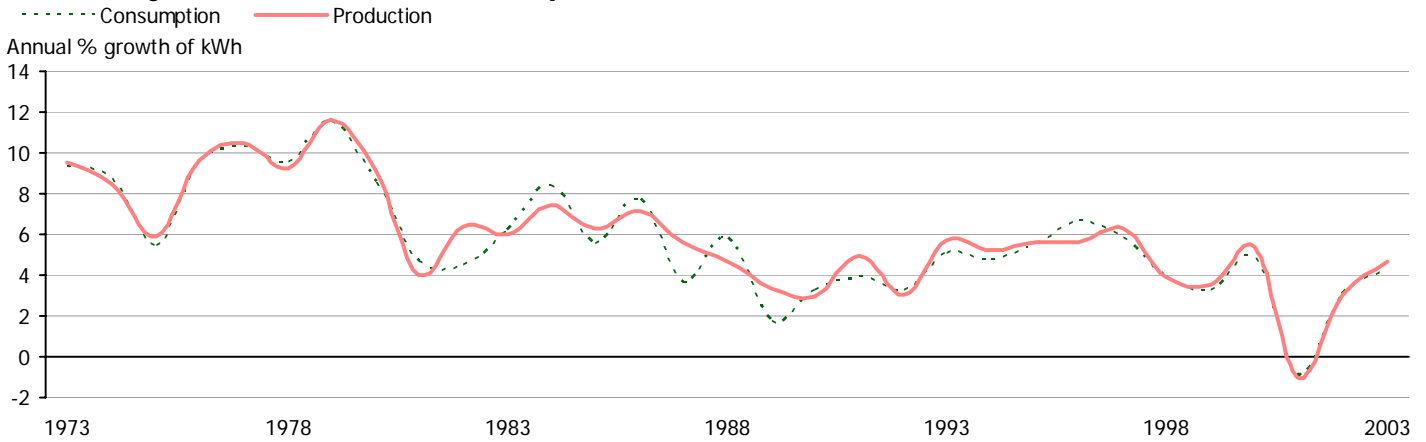

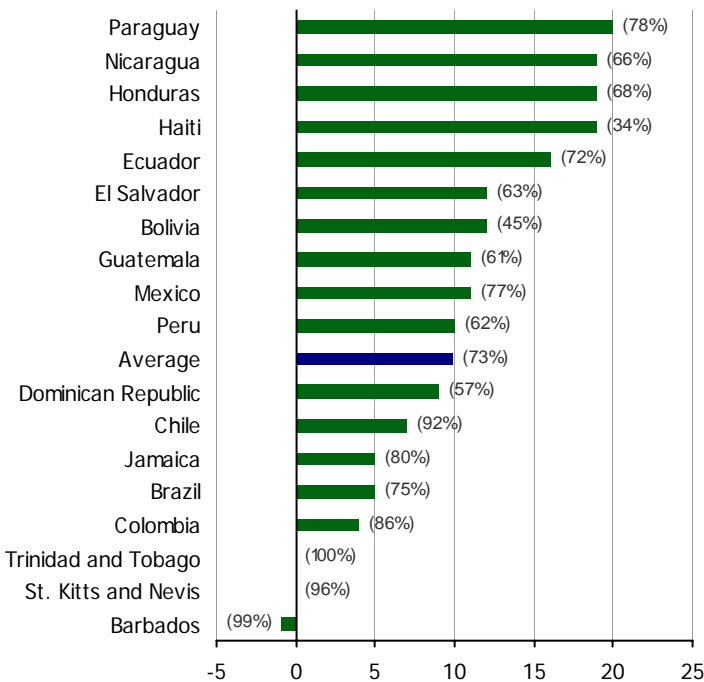

Electricity Production and Consumption Growth in LAC



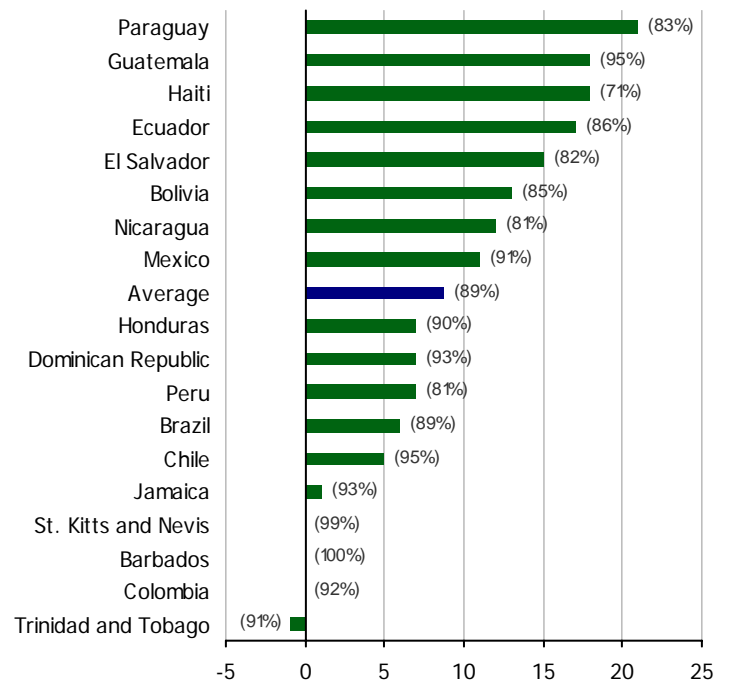
Increase in Access to Sanitation Services (and current level of access)

1990-2002 increase in population percentage with access to facilities

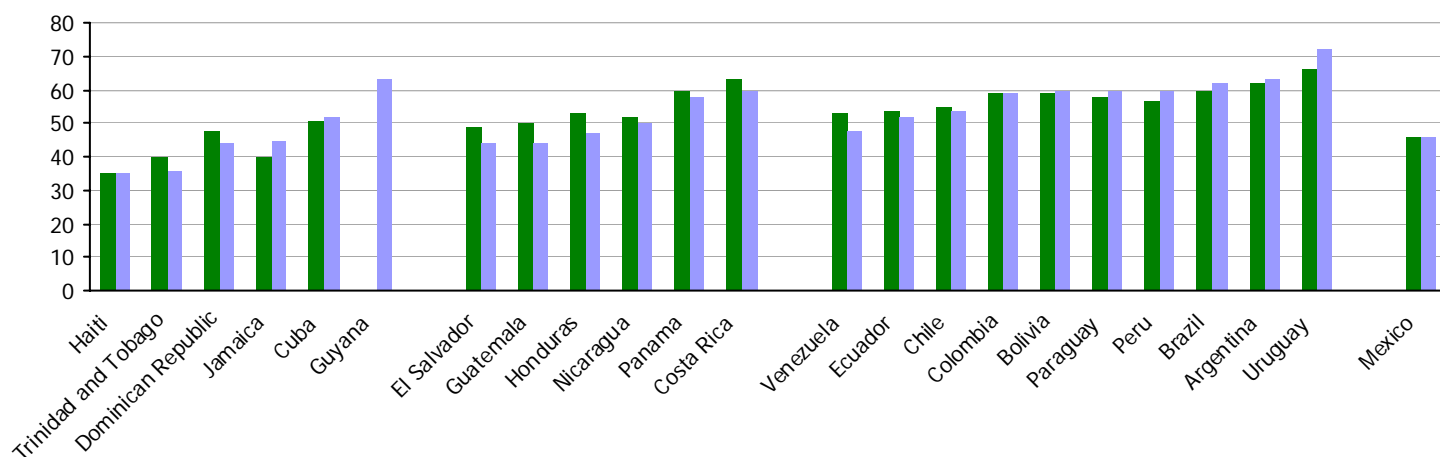

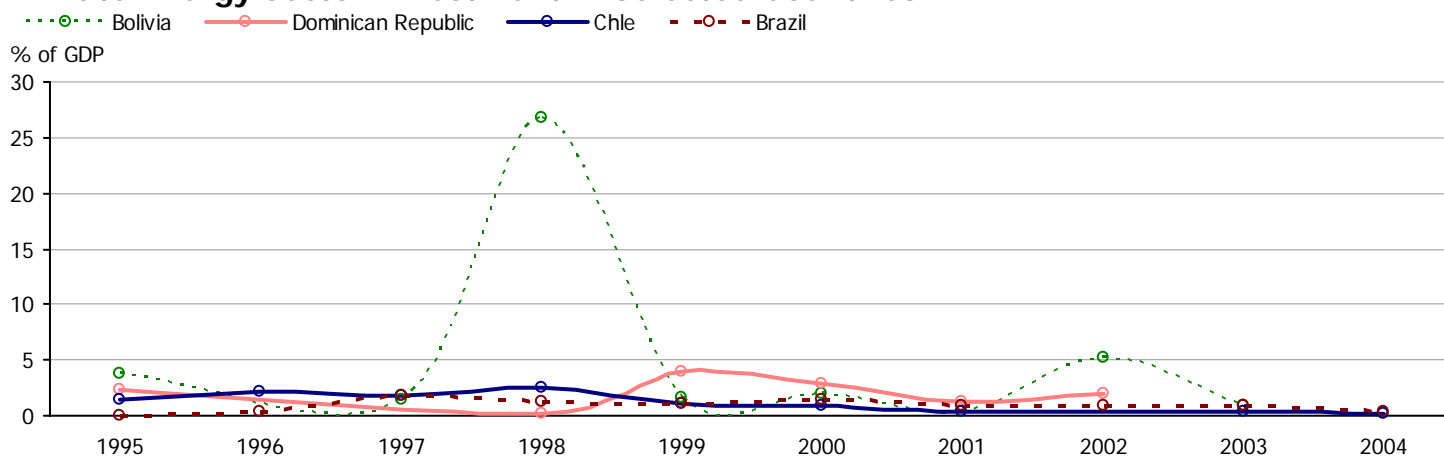

Private Energy Sector Investment in Selected Countries

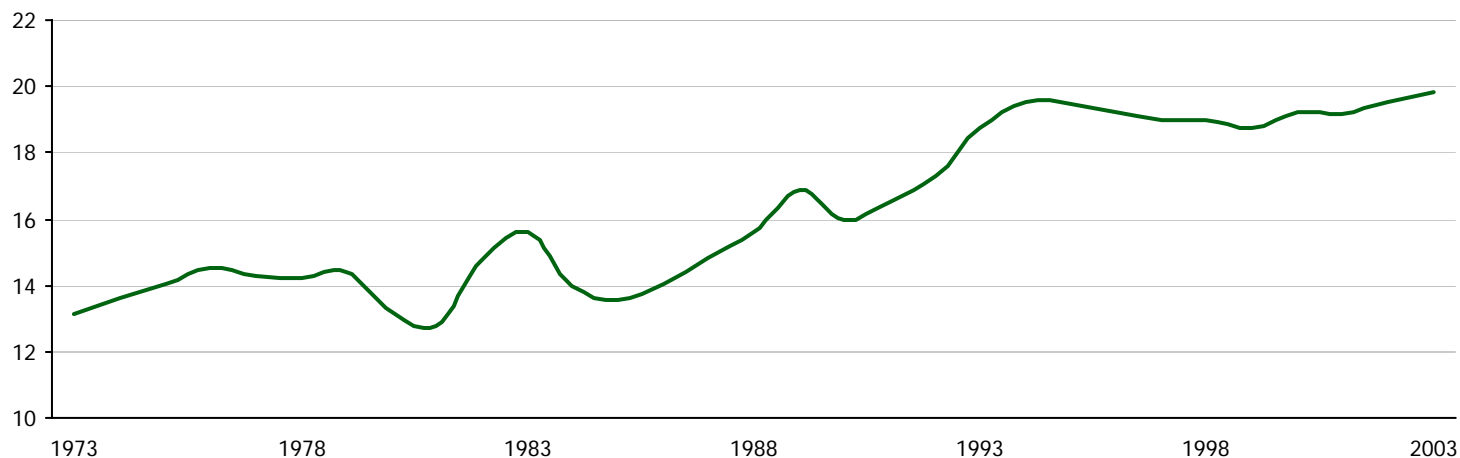

Definitions *Electricity consumption* The annual total of Kilowatt Hours demanded per year. *Electricity production* The annual total of Kilowatt Hours indigenously produced per year.

Increase in Access to Sanitation Services

Source World Bank, *World Development Indicators* (online version) as of May, 2006.

Definition *Access to sanitation services* the percentage of the population with at least adequate excreta disposal facilities (private or shared, but not public) that can effectively prevent human, animal, and insect contact with excreta. Improved facilities range from simple but protected pit latrines to flush toilets with a sewerage connection. To be effective, facilities must be correctly constructed and properly maintained.

Increase in Access to Improved Water Sources

Source World Bank, *World Development Indicators* (online version) as of May, 2006.

Definition *Access to improved water sources* the percentage of the population with reasonable access to an adequate amount of water from an improved source, such as a household connection, public standpipe, borehole, protected well or spring, and rainwater collection. Unimproved sources include vendors, tanker trucks, and unprotected wells and springs. Reasonable access is defined as the availability of at least 20 liters a person a day from a source within one kilometer of the dwelling.

Definitions Paraphrasing the 2005 Environmental Sustainability Index Report, the *Environmental Sustainability Index* (ESI) benchmarks the ability of nations to protect the environment over the next several decades. It does so by integrating 76 data sets into 21 indicators of environmental sustainability; tracking natural resource endowments, past and present pollution levels, environmental management efforts, and a society's capacity to improve its environmental performance. That is, "The ESI score quantifies the likelihood that a country will be able to preserve valuable environmental resources effectively over the period of several decades. Put another way, it evaluates a country's potential to avoid major environmental deterioration." (ibid p.23) Higher scores are more favorable. The index is reported as an aggregate index and its five component scores listed below.

Environmental Systems component The extent to which a country maintains its environmental systems "at healthy levels, and to the extent to which levels are improving rather than deteriorating" (ibid p. 11).

Environmental Stresses component The extent to which "the levels of anthropogenic stress are low enough to engender no demonstrable harm to its environmental systems" (ibid).

Human vulnerability The extent to which "people and social systems are not vulnerable to environmental disturbances that affect basic human wellbeing" (ibid).

Social and Institutional Capacity component The extent to which a country "has in place institutions and underlying social patterns of skills, attitudes, and networks that foster effective responses to environmental challenges" (ibid).

Global Stewardship component The extent to which a country "cooperates with other countries to manage common environmental problems, and if it reduces negative transboundary environmental impacts on other countries to levels that cause no harm" (ibid).

The per capita net production of a country's agricultural sector, excluding production of seed and feed and intermediate agricultural inputs: Each year's figure is the ratio of that year's production relative to the average production during 1999-2001, multiplied by 100. *Food production index* excluding, coffee and tea, the per capita production of a country's agricultural products that contain nutrients. Calculated relative to the 1999-2001 period and multiplied by 100. *Fertilizer* refers to nitrogenous, phosphate and potash fertilizers. *Water use* the proportion of a country's total water use that is used by its agricultural sector.

Notes *Agricultural production index* and *Food production index* reliability is limited by the accuracy and precision of production and price data as production data is derived rather than directly measured. Presented figures are calculated using the FAO's method.

Notes *Agricultural use* usually refers to livestock and irrigation; however some countries categorize livestock under domestic use. Therefore, inter-country comparisons should be done with care.

It corresponds to the maximum theoretical amount of water available for a country in an average year. *Tap water safety* the average response to the World Economic Forum's 2001 Executive Opinion Survey asking "Tap water in your city is (1=unsafe and inaccessible for drinking, 7=safe and easily accessible for drinking)."

Definitions *Energy production* refers to primary electricity as well as forms of primary energy—petroleum (crude oil, natural gas liquids, and oil from non-conventional sources), natural gas, solid fuels (coal, lignite, and other derived fuels), and combustible renewables, and waste. *Energy use* apparent consumption of commercial energy, which is equal to native production plus imports and stock changes, minus exports and fuels supplied to ships and aircraft engaged in international transport. *Energy imports* calculated as the difference between energy use and energy production; a negative number indicates a net exporter of energy. *Energy supply per \$1000 GDP* the ratio of energy use per unit of gross domestic product measured in terms of purchasing power parity (PPP). Total primary energy domestic supply is calculated as production of fuels + inputs from other sources + imports - exports - international marine bunkers + stock changes. It includes coal, crude oil, natural gas liquids, refinery feedstocks, additives, petroleum products, gases, combustible renewables and waste, electricity, and heat. Domestic supply differs from final consumption in that it does not take account of distribution losses. The supply and use of energy commodities are converted to Kg oil equivalent using standard coefficients for each energy source. *Private energy sector investment* covers infrastructure projects in energy (electricity and natural gas transmission and distribution) that have reached financial closure and directly or indirectly serve the public. Movable assets and small projects such as windmills are excluded. The types of projects included are operations and management contracts, operations and management contracts with major capital expenditure, greenfield projects (in which a private entity or a public-private joint

venture builds and operates a new facility), and divestiture.

Notes *Private energy sector investment* unmarked points represent interpolation between surrounding marked data points.

Electricity Production by Source

Definitions *Electricity production* is measured at the terminals of all alternator sets in a station. In addition to hydropower, coal, oil, gas, and nuclear power generation, it covers generation by geothermal, solar, wind, and tide and wave energy, as well as that from combustible renewables and waste. Production includes the output of electricity plants that are designed to produce electricity solely as well as that of combined heat and power plants (i.e., cogeneration plants). *Electric power transmission and distribution losses* include losses in transmission between sources of supply and points of distribution and in the distribution to consumers, including pilferage. Production less transmission and distribution losses, own-use, and transformation losses is equal to end-use electricity consumption.

Notes *Natural gas* refers to natural gas but excludes natural gas liquids. *Oil* refers to crude oil and petroleum products. *Regional electricity transmission losses* is the unweighted average of the following countries: Mexico, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Haiti, Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Paraguay, El Salvador, Uruguay, and Venezuela.

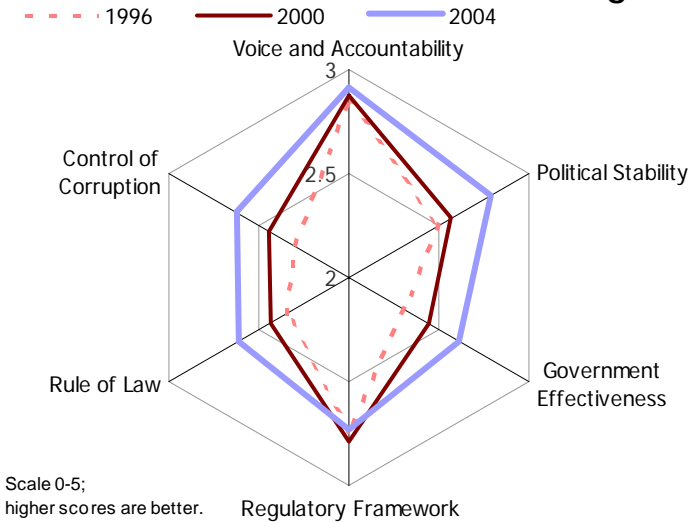

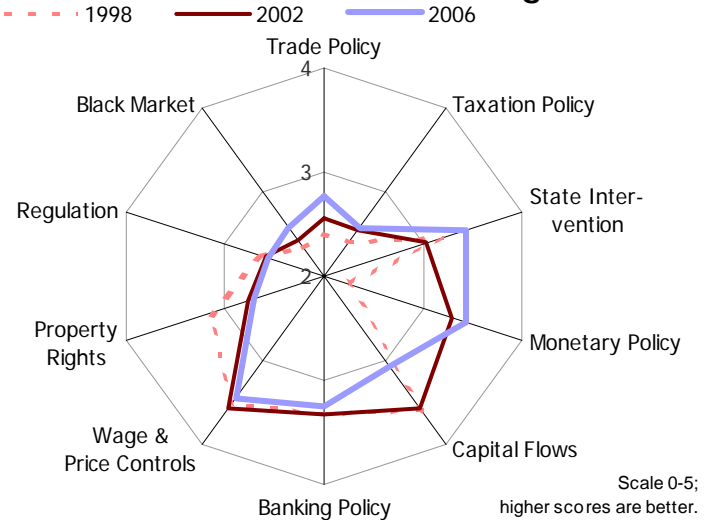

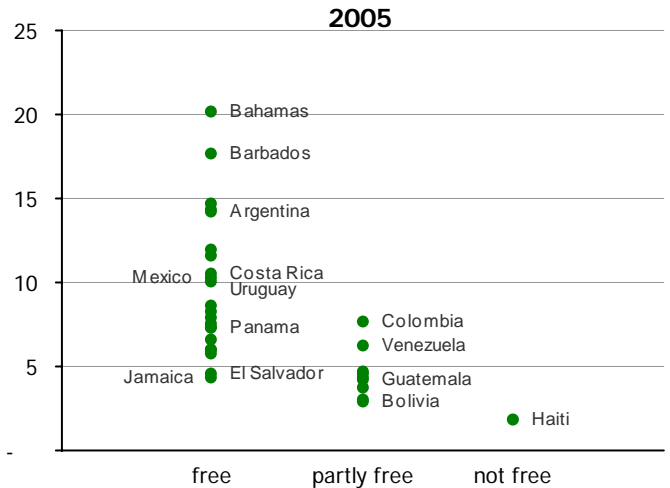
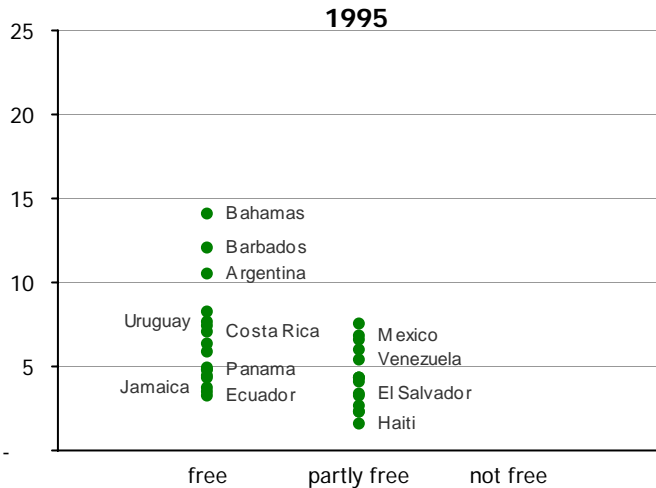


Economic Freedom in the LAC Region



Freedom and per capita GDP in LAC

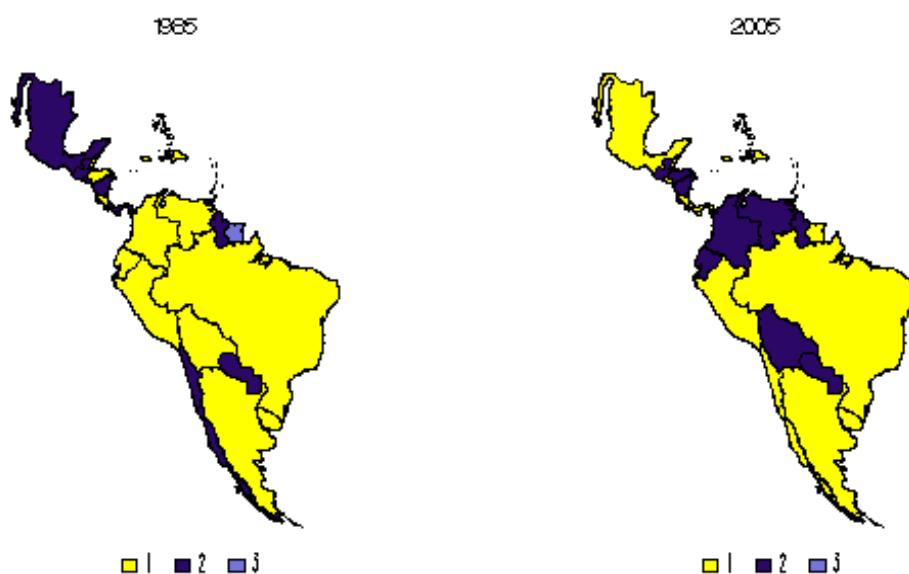
Thousand PPP dollars vs. Freedom House score

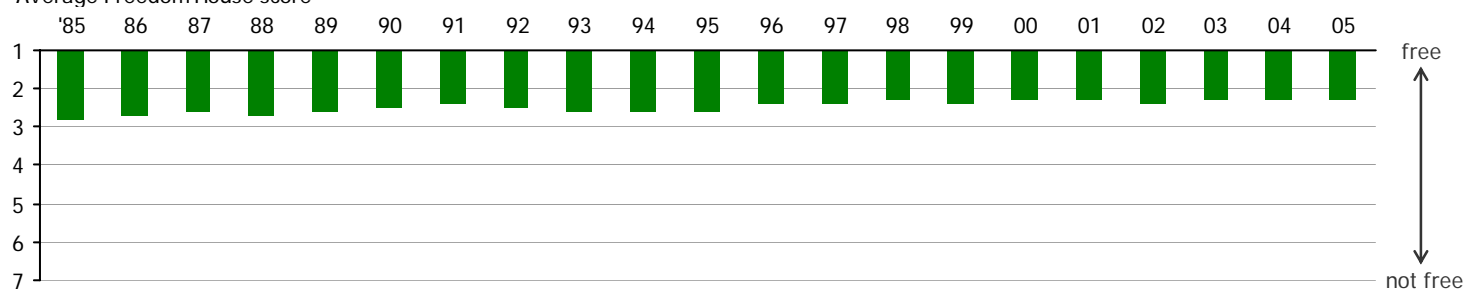

Average Freedom House score



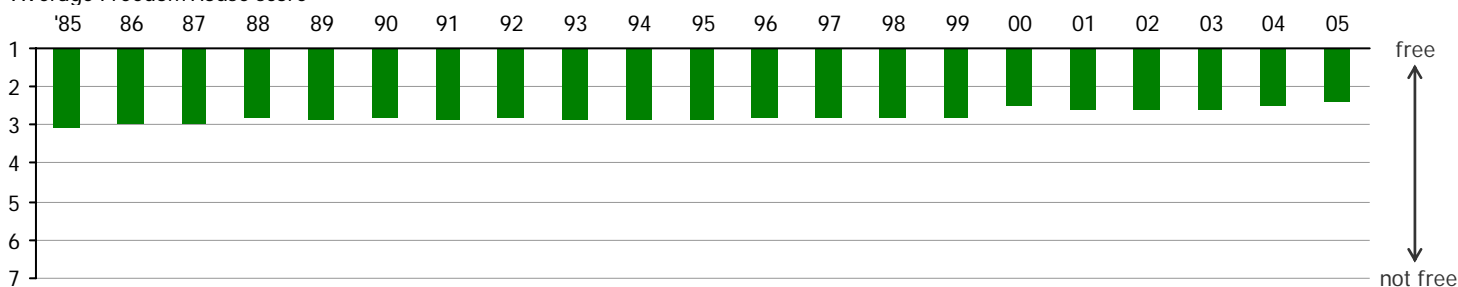

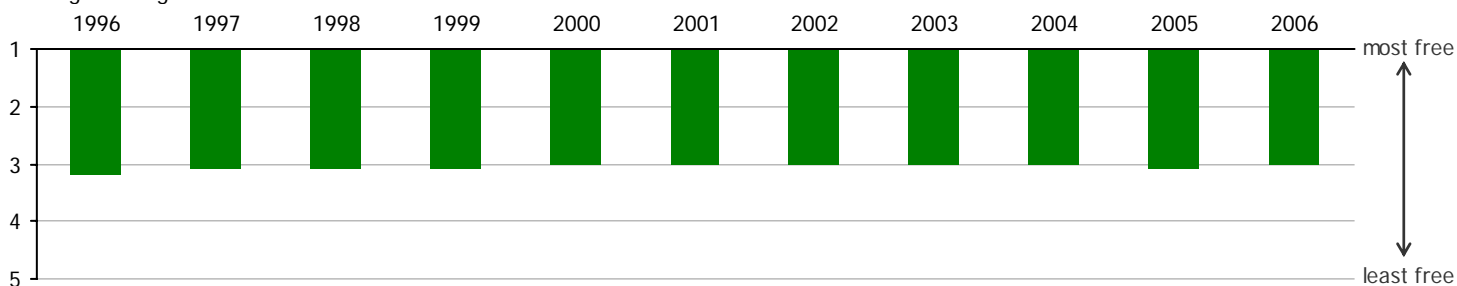

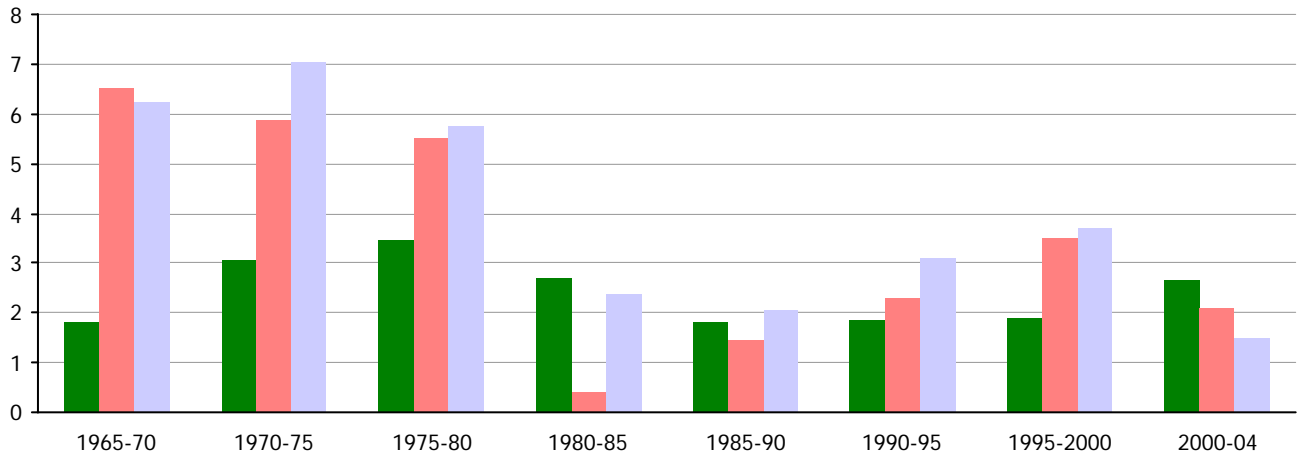

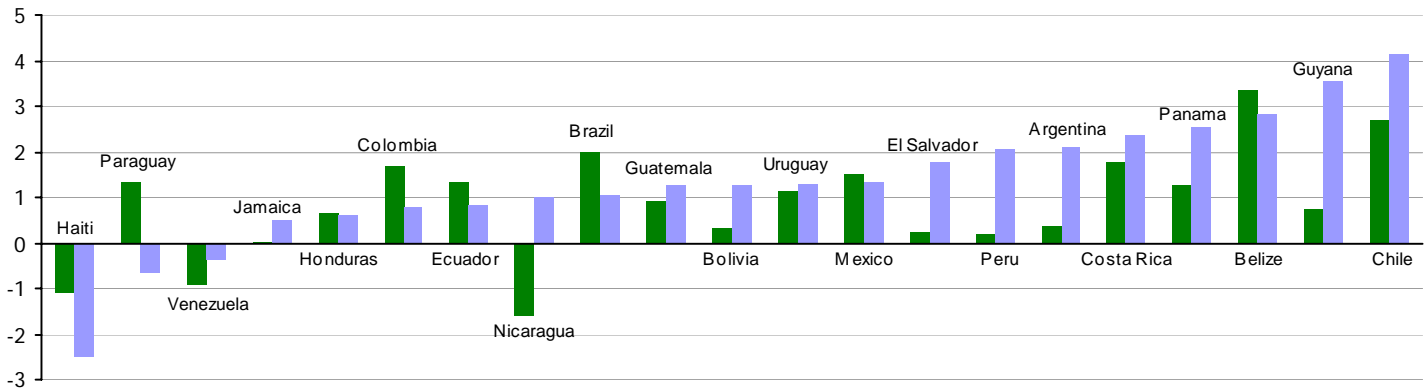
Average Annual Sectoral Growth in LAC

percent real growth of sectoral value added



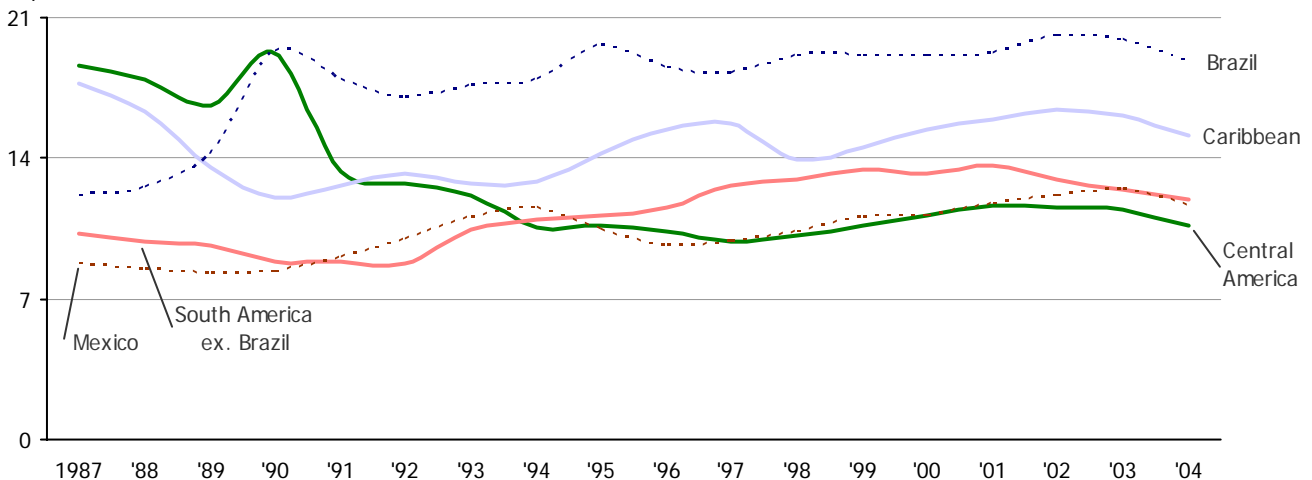
Real Per Capita GDP Growth

expenditures % of GDP

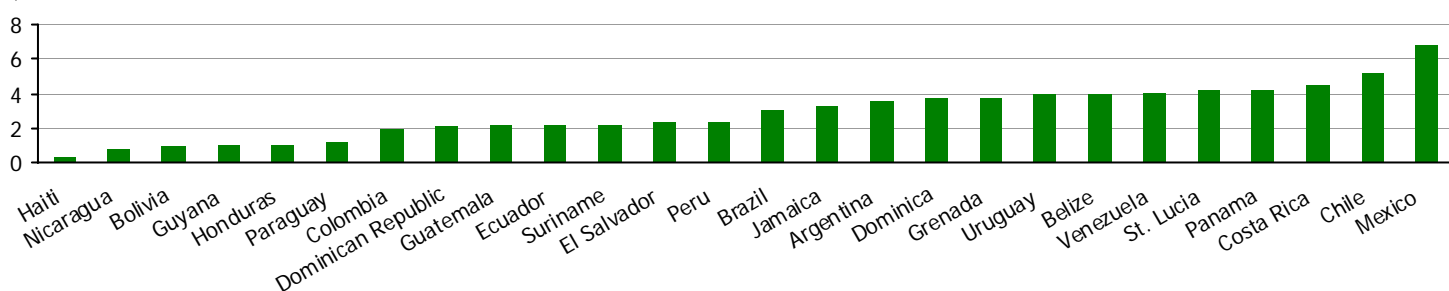

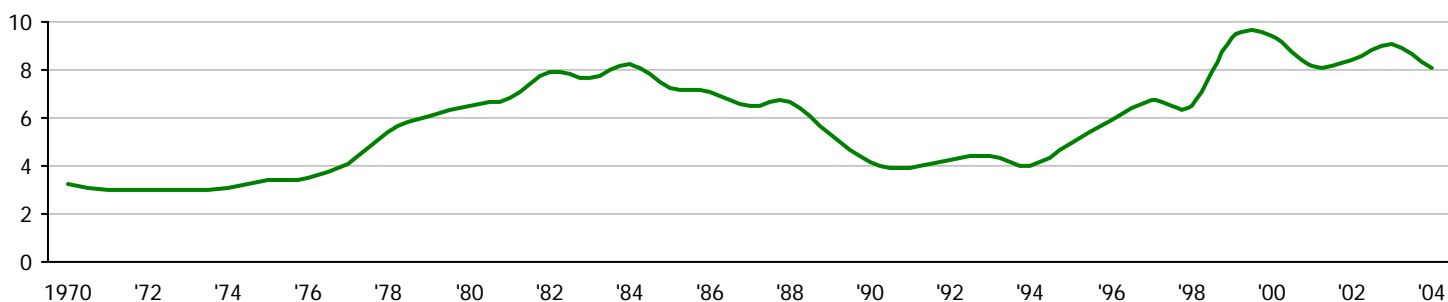

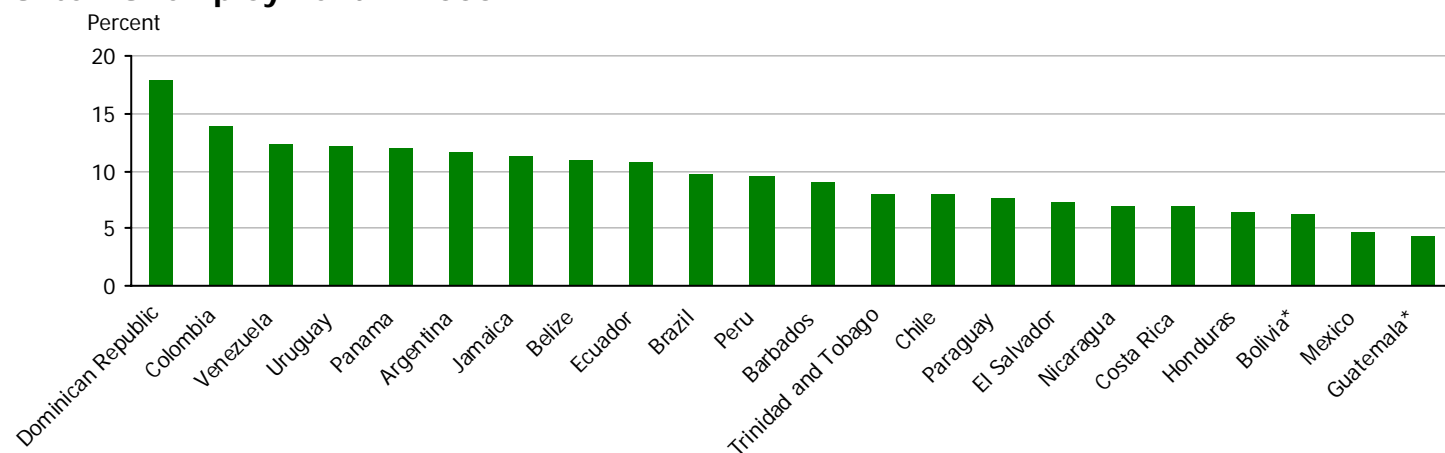
LAC Regional Debt Service As Percent of GNI

Urban Unemployment in 2005



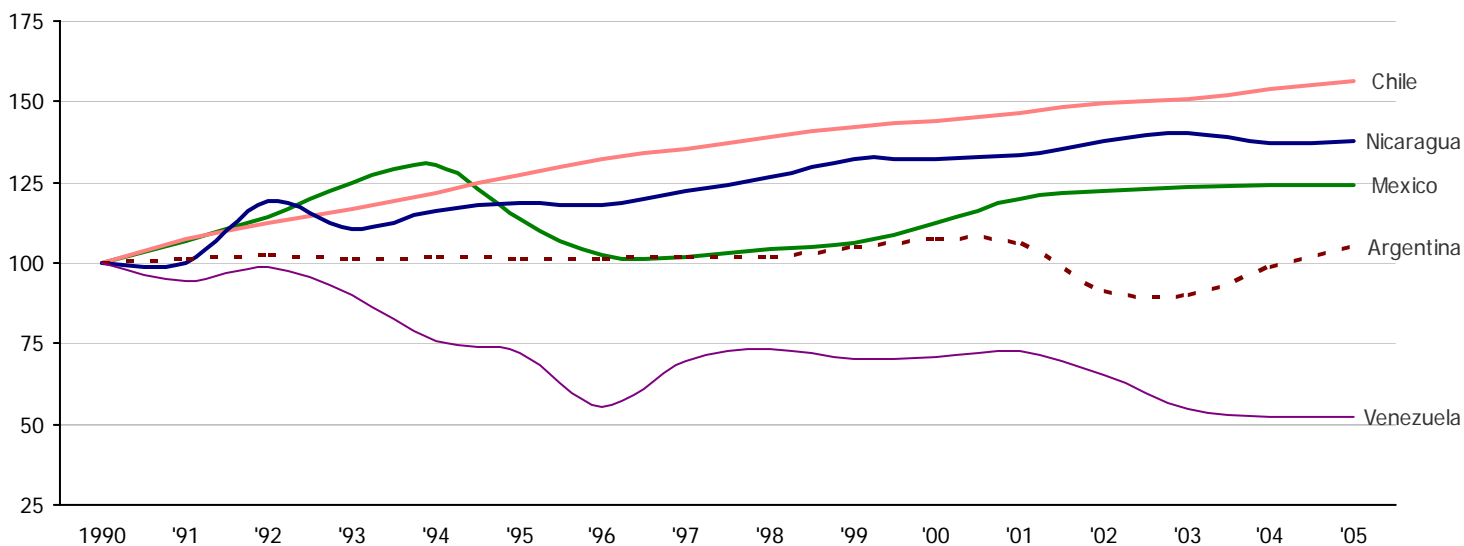

Definitions *Value added* is the net output of a sector after adding up all outputs and subtracting intermediate inputs. *Agriculture* Corresponds to ISIC (revision 3) divisions 1-5 and includes forestry, hunting, and fishing, as well as cultivation of crops and livestock production. *Industry* Corresponds to ISIC divisions 10-45 and includes manufacturing (ISIC divisions 15-37). It comprises value added in mining, manufacturing (also reported as a separate subgroup), construction, electricity, water, and gas. *Services* correspond to ISIC divisions 50-99 and includes value added in wholesale and retail trade (including hotels and restaurants), transport, and government, financial, professional, and personal services such as education, health care, and real estate services. Also included are imputed bank service charges, import duties, and any statistical discrepancies noted by national compilers as well as discrepancies arising from rescaling. *Government share of GDP* represents general government final consumption expenditure (formerly general government consumption), which includes all government current expenditures for purchases of goods and services (including compensation of employees). It also includes most expenditures on national defense and security, but excludes government military expenditures that are part of government capital formation.

Notes Average annual growth is calculated using the geometric mean, which has the form $[(2004/1970)^{(1/34)} - 1] \times 100 =$ average annual growth for 1970-2004. *Sectoral compositions* of the LAC regional economy are calculated using the sums of Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Guyana, Mexico, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Peru, and Uruguay, weighted by GDP. *Government share of GDP* country groups are defined as follows: The Caribbean is the unweighted average of The Dominican Republic, Trinidad and Tobago, Jamaica, St. Vincent and Grenadines, and Guyana. Central America is comprised of the unweighted average of Guatemala, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Panama, and Costa Rica. *South America ex. Brazil* is constituted by the unweighted average of Paraguay, Ecuador, Peru, Uruguay, Argentina, Chile, Venezuela, Bolivia, and Colombia. *Real per capita GDP growth* depicts average annual growth using constant 2000 US dollars through 2004.

Selected Definitions and Notes

Atlas Method For purposes of cross-country comparison of national incomes, the World Bank's Atlas conversion factor is used to reduce the impact of exchange rate fluctuations. This involves using a three-year average of exchange rates to smooth the effects of transitory exchange rate fluctuations. The Atlas conversion factor is the

average of a country's exchange rate (or alternative conversion factor) for that year and its exchange rates for the two preceding years, adjusted for the difference between the rate of inflation in the country and that in the G-5 countries (France, Germany, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States). A country's inflation rate is measured by the change in its GDP deflator. The inflation rate for G-5 countries, representing international inflation, is measured by the change in the SDR deflator, (Special drawing rights, or SDRs, are the IMF's unit of account.) The SDR deflator is calculated as a weighted average of the G-5 countries' GDP deflators in SDR terms, the weights being the amount of each country's currency in one SDR unit. Weights vary over time because both the composition of the SDR and the relative exchange rates for each currency change. The SDR deflator is calculated in SDR terms first and then converted to U.S. dollars, using the SDR to dollar Atlas conversion factor. The Atlas conversion factor is then applied

Balance of Payments The balance of payments is a set of accounts recording all flows of value between a nation's residents and the residents of the rest of the world during a period of time. More specifically, it is a double-entry accounting system that lists all flows of goods and services into and out of a country; all transfers that are the counterpart of real resources or financial claims provided to or by the rest of the world, such as donations and grants; and all changes in residents' claims on, and liabilities to, nonresidents that arise from economic transactions. The balance of payments is divided into three groups of accounts. The current account (balance) refers to the sum of net exports of goods and services, income, and current transfers. The capital account (balance) consists of some unilateral transfers including those of ownership of fixed assets, acquisition of intangibles such as patents and leases, and also debt forgiveness. The financial account (balance) refers to the sum of financial assets and liabilities including foreign direct investment, portfolio investment, financial derivatives, and reserve assets as deemed by respective monetary authorities. All transactions are recorded twice--once as a credit and once as a debit. In principle the net balance should be zero, but in practice the accounts often do not balance. In these cases a balancing item, usually net errors and omissions, is itemized separately.

For some countries, data are presented according to the methodology adopted in the IMF's *Balance of Payments Manual, 5th edition* (1993). In other cases, the methodology is that of the *Balance of Payments Manual, 4th edition* (1977), modified to place official transfers in the capital account (as the IMF often did beginning in the 1980s).

The fifth edition redefined as capital transfers some transactions previously included in the current account, including debt forgiveness, migrants' capital transfers, and foreign aid to acquire capital goods. As such, under the fifth edition the current account balance reflects more accurately net current transfer receipts in addition to transactions in goods, services and income.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) The CPI is a price index based on surveys of the cost of a

typical "market basket" of goods and services purchased. Generally, the CPI is geared toward the middle- to lower-middle-income consumer. The CPI focuses on a narrower category of goods than does the GDP deflator. While the GDP deflator is the price index of all the goods and services produced in an economy, both consumption goods and investment goods, the CPI represents the prices of only consumption goods. One problem with any fixed-bundle index as a measure of cost of living is that it does not account for substitutions that consumers might make in response to price changes. As a result, the CPI somewhat overstates changes in the cost of living.

The cost of a typical market basket of goods and services is determined by household income-and-expenditure surveys conducted approximately every 10-20 years. In some countries, however, the latest income-and-expenditure survey is more than 20 years old, thus making the market basket out-of-date and distorting consumer-price trends to an undetermined degree. Consumer price indices are based on yearly-average prices.

External Public Debt refers to debt owed to nonresidents repayable in foreign currency, goods, or services. Total external public debt is the sum of public and publicly guaranteed medium- and long-term debt. Public debtors include the central government, the rest of general government, and autonomous state agencies and enterprises. The debt outstanding/GDP ratio is a frequently used measure of a country's debt burden, although it does not take into account the degree of concessionality of the debt. The ratio of debt service to exports of goods and nonfactor services (the debt-service ratio), another indicator of debt burden, does take concessionality into account by relating debt-service payments to a country's capacity to generate its own foreign exchange for making these payments. Debt figures reported by the World Bank, IMF, IADB, and countries' own official data sources often disagree on the size of the public debt and the debt-burden percentages.

GDP Deflator The GDP (gross domestic product) deflator is an overall measure of prices in an economy—a price index for GDP. It is equal to the ratio of nominal GDP to real GDP multiplied by 100. Specifically, the value of all newly produced final goods is calculated in current prices, resulting in nominal GDP. Then the same set of goods is valued at the prices that prevailed in the base year, resulting in real GDP. The ratio of nominal GDP to real GDP is the GDP deflator. The GDP deflator is the broadest based price index available—it is considered by many to be the best overall indicator of inflationary pressures in an economy.

Government Finance Reporting of Government Finance supports analysis of fiscal policy of the general government sector in a given accounting period. Transactions of government operations are therefore recorded and classified to demonstrate the effect of

fiscal policy on the net worth of the general government sector, its demand for credit, and on its holdings of assets and liabilities. Statistics presented here are based on the IMF's 2001 *Government Finance Statistics Manual*, which revised the original GFS Manual by seeking to harmonize with the 1993 *System of National Accounts*.

The Statement of Government Operations records flows (as opposed to stocks) by presenting details of transactions in revenue, expense, net acquisition of non-financial and financial assets, and net incurrence of liabilities. Resulting from transactions, *Revenue* is defined as those transactions that result in an increase in net worth and *Expense* as the decrease in net worth. Revenue tends to come from three main sources: *Taxes* (compulsory transfers and fees, but not social contributions), *Social Contributions* (which can be either compulsory or voluntary and benefit both the contributor and other beneficiaries), and Other Revenue. For many governments, however, revenue is supplemented by *Grants* (noncompulsory transfers from other governments or international organizations). As grants increase the government's net worth, they are recorded as a component of Revenue. *Other Revenue* is not presented in this publication, but it can be derived by subtracting the sum of the other Revenue components from the *Revenue* total.

Expenses can be classified in two ways: by economic classification and functional classification. Economic classifications describe how (i.e., the method) the government supplies goods and services to society. *Compensation of Employees* is remuneration in cash or in kind (including social insurance contributions) to employees in return for work performed. *Use of Goods and Services* is the total value of goods and services purchased by the general government sector for use in production processes (it therefore excludes goods and services not used in production processes). *Interest* is payments paid by a debtor government on debt instruments. *Subsidies* are current transfers paid to enterprises including transfers to public corporations. *Grants* are noncompulsory transfers paid to other government units or international organizations. *Social Benefits* are current transfers paid to households (social benefits paid in kind to households are excluded). *Other Expenses and Consumption of Fixed Capital* make up the remainder of the Expense category—these can be derived by subtracting the presented expense categories from the *Expense* total.

Functional classifications of expense describe why (i.e., for what purpose) an expense was incurred. It is important to note that functional classifications include acquisitions of nonfinancial assets which would not be captured under the economic classification of Expense (because such an acquisition would not affect net worth). A distinction is drawn, therefore, by the use of the term *Outlay* for functional categorization. The Classification of Functions of Government (COFOG) was produced by the OECD and is used herein (see

Classifications of Expenditure According to Purpose (New York, 2000), United Nations). All outlays for a particular function are collected in one category regardless of the method of implementation (e.g., cash transfers, vs. in kind transfers). *Public Debt Transactions* is a sub-category of the general functional category *General Public Expenses* and describes interest payments and outlays for underwriting and floating government loans but excludes administrative costs and public debt management.

Gross Capital Formation Formerly referred to as Gross Domestic Investment (GDI), this measure consists primarily of outlays on additions to the fixed assets (capital) of an economy, as well as net changes in the level of inventories. Fixed assets cover land improvements, plant, machinery, and equipment purchases, and infrastructure development and maintenance. Inventories are stocks of goods held by firms to meet temporary or unexpected fluctuations in production or sales. By adding to capital stock, investment increases an economy's capacity to grow over time. Investment is financed by savings, either national or foreign.

Gross National Income (GNI) Formerly referred to as Gross National Product (GNP), this measure reflects the total value of final goods and services produced by domestically owned factors of production. Whereas GDP measures the total value of production within the geographic boundaries of an economy—that is, by a country's *residents*—GNI measures the total value that is produced by a country's *nationals*, whether they are located inside or outside the boundaries of the particular country. Therefore, GNI will be equal to GDP plus income from abroad, minus foreign-owned production. GNI is thus used to reflect a country's total sources and uses of income, and thus the total amount of resources available to the citizens of a country.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) GDP is a measure of an economy's total production of final goods and services for domestic consumption and investment, and for export. The value of intermediate (non-final) goods and services is not included as that would represent double-counting. Alternatively, GDP can be thought of as the sum of value added in production at each successive stage of the production-marketing chain. GDP can be used to reflect the state of production, and hence *development*, in a country.

Interest Rate Refers to payments to and by financing institutions and are arithmetic averages of monthly interest rates reported by the countries. *Deposit rate* usually refers to rates offered to resident customers for demand, time, or savings deposits. Frequently, rates for time and savings deposits are classified according to maturity and amounts deposited. In addition, deposit money banks and similar deposit-taking institutions may offer short- and medium-term instruments at specified rates for specific amounts and maturities. *Lending rate* is the bank rate that usually meets the short- and medium-term financing needs of the private sector. This rate is normally differentiated according to creditworthiness of borrowers and objectives of financing.

PPP Indicates the use of Purchasing Power Parity (PPP) rationale to convert total annual output to

international dollars. An international dollar adjusted for PPP has the same purchasing power over GDP as a U.S. dollar in the United States and buys an equivalent amount of goods or services irrespective of the country. PPP rates provide a standard measure allowing comparisons of real price levels between countries, just as conventional price indexes allow comparison of real values over time. Values are in current dollars and are not adjusted for inflation. The PPP rates for each country are estimated through extrapolation and regression analysis using data from the International Comparison Programme (ICP). Computation of the PPP involves deriving implicit quantities from national accounts expenditure data and specially collected price data and then revaluing the implicit quantities in each country at a single set of average prices. PPP estimates tend to lower per capita GDPs in industrialized countries and raise per capita GDPs in developing countries (more information on ICP is available online at <http://www.worldbank.org/data/>).

Population Figures are mid-year estimates derived from national census data. Projections are based on information regarding mortality rates, fertility trends, and net external migration.

Public Debt Outstanding Public and publicly guaranteed debt comprising long-term external obligations of public debtors, including the national government, political subdivisions (or an agency of either), and autonomous public bodies, and external obligations of private debtors that are guaranteed for repayment by a public entity. Data are in current U.S. dollars.

Definitions *Total external debt* is the sum of public, publicly guaranteed, and private non-guaranteed long-term debt, use of IMF credit, and short-term debt. Short-term debt includes all debt having an original maturity of one year or less and interest in arrears on long-term debt. *Use of IMF credit* denotes repurchase obligations to the IMF for all uses of IMF resources (excluding those resulting from drawings on the reserve tranche). These obligations, shown for the end of the year specified, comprise purchases outstanding under the credit tranches, including enlarged access resources, and all special facilities (the buffer stock, compensatory financing, extended fund, and oil facilities), trust fund loans, and operations under the structural adjustment and enhanced structural adjustment facilities. *Long-term debt* is debt that has an original or extended maturity of more than one year. It has three components: public, publicly guaranteed, and private non-guaranteed debt. *Total debt service* is the sum of principal repayments and interest actually paid in foreign currency, goods, or services on long-term debt, interest paid on short-term debt, and repayments (repurchases and charges) to the IMF.

Note Figure depicts the weighted sum of all countries listed in Table 7.3 except those countries with missing data in any year from 1970 to 2004, which were: Grenada, St. Kitts and Nevis, and St. Lucia.

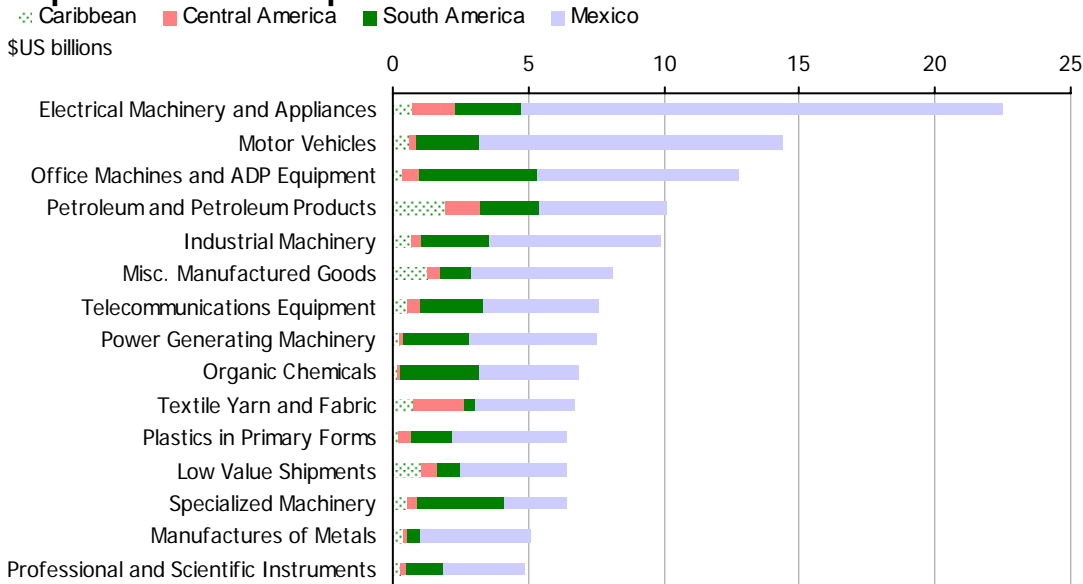

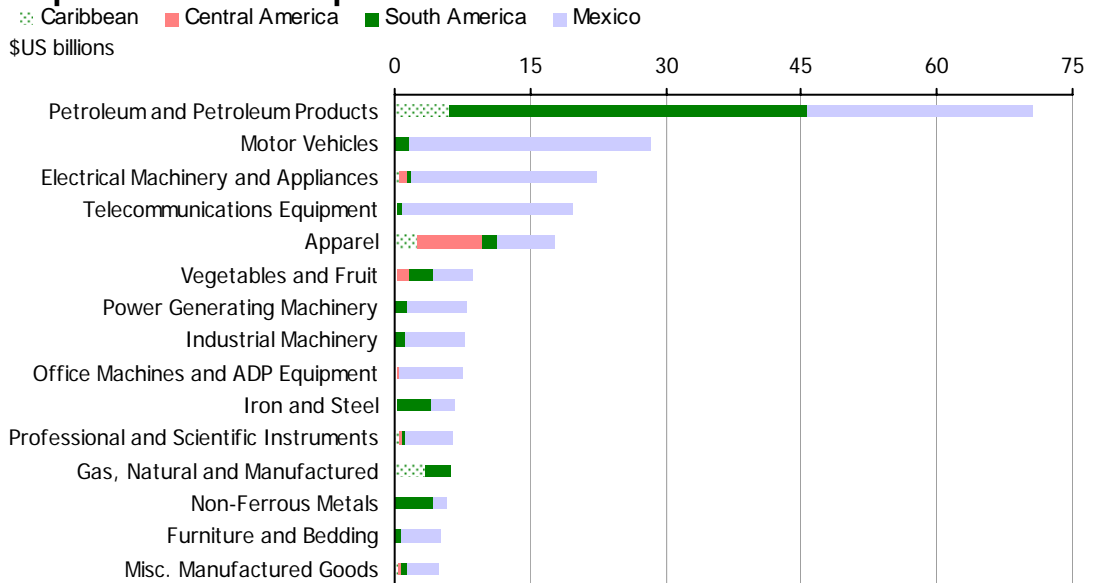

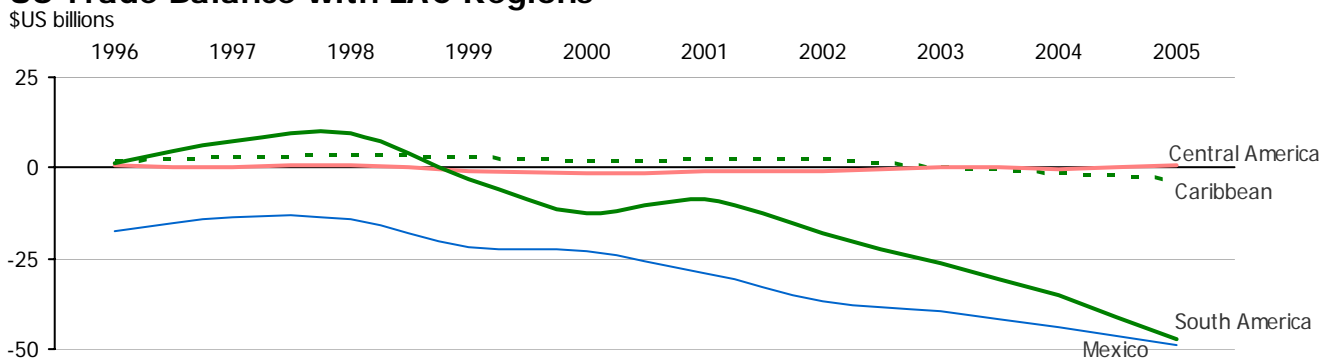
Top US Products Exported to LAC in 2005

Definitions and Notes

This section presents data on US merchandise exports to and imports from the LAC region. Corresponding export and import tables reflect total trade, as well as trade by in various goods sectors. Tables 8.8 and 8.16 present data on the top products exported and imported by the US to and from the largest LAC markets.

The data in this section were compiled using SITC, Revision 3, total exports (f.a.s) and imports for consumption (customs value) data. *Standard International Trade Classification* (SITC) is a statistical classification of the products entering external trade maintained by the United Nations Statistics Division. SITC nomenclature classifies codes at the one-digit level as Sections, two-digit codes as Divisions, and three-digit codes as Groups.

Exports indicate the total physical movement of merchandise out of the United States to foreign countries, regardless of whether such merchandise is exported from within the US Customs territory or from a US Customs bonded warehouse or a US Foreign Trade Zone. This includes foreign military sales, Grant-Aid shipments under the DOD Military Assistance Program, shipments of agricultural commodities under P.L. 480 as amended, and satellites launched by US space vehicles. *Free alongside ship* (f.a.s.) value is the value of exports at the US seaport, airport, or border port of export, based on the transaction price, including inland freight, insurance, and other charges incurred in placing the merchandise alongside the carrier at the US port of exportation. The value, as defined, excludes the cost of loading the merchandise aboard the exporting carrier and also excludes freight, insurance, and any charges or transportation costs beyond the port of exportation.

Imports for consumption measures total merchandise that has physically cleared Customs either entering consumption channels immediately or entering after withdrawal for consumption from bonded warehouses under Customs custody or from Foreign Trade Zones. *Customs import value* is the value of imports as appraised by the US customs Service in accordance with the legal requirements of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. This is generally defined as the price actually paid or payable for merchandise when sold for exportation to the United States, excluding US import duties, freight, insurance, and other associated charges.

Top traded products are based on SITC (revision 3) product divisions, i.e., 2-digit product codes and are determined based on US dollar value.

Growth rates are calculated using formulas 1 and 2. Formula 1, used to calculate the annualized growth rate (1996-2005) is a geometric mean equation, which is based on end-points. Formula 2 was used to calculate the annual growth rate (2004-2005). *Formula 1:* $[(2005/1996)^{(1/9)}-1] \times 100 =$ average annual growth for 1996-2005. *Formula 2:* $[(2005-2004)/2004] \times 100 =$ annual growth rate for 2004. An asterisk (*) appears when the first or the last year's figure is zero (except those zeros that represent trade of less than \$500,000) or missing.

Note *Top traded products* are those products that the United States trades the most—in terms of US dollar value—with the entire LAC region.

Trade Categories

Total exports/imports include SITC (revision 3) Sections 0 through 9, that is, all goods.

Manufactured goods include SITC Sections 5 (chemicals and related products), 6 (manufactured goods classified by material), 7 (machinery and transport equipment), and 8 (miscellaneous manufactured goods).

Capital and consumer goods include SITC Sections 7 (machinery and transport equipment) and 8 (miscellaneous manufactured goods).

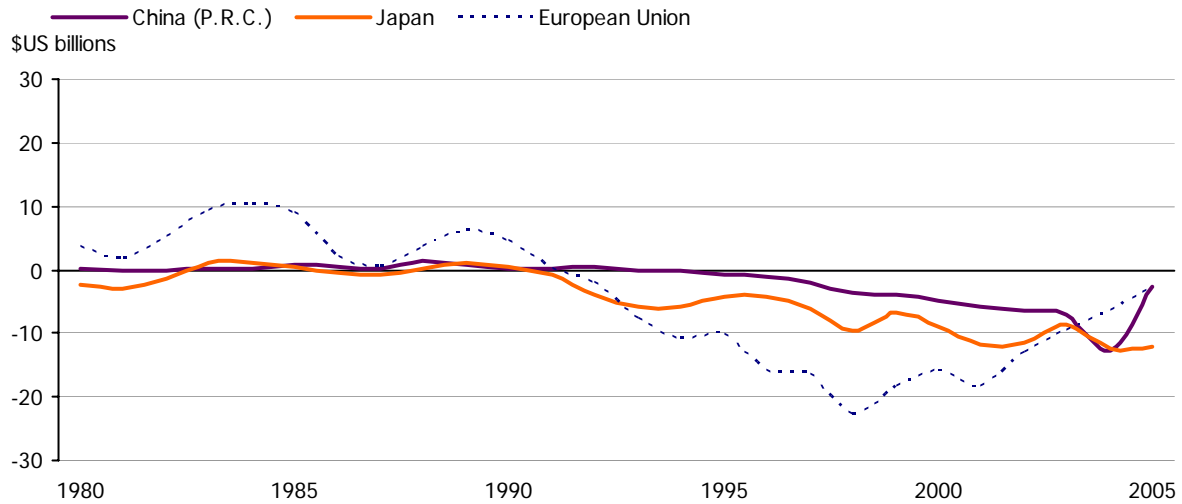
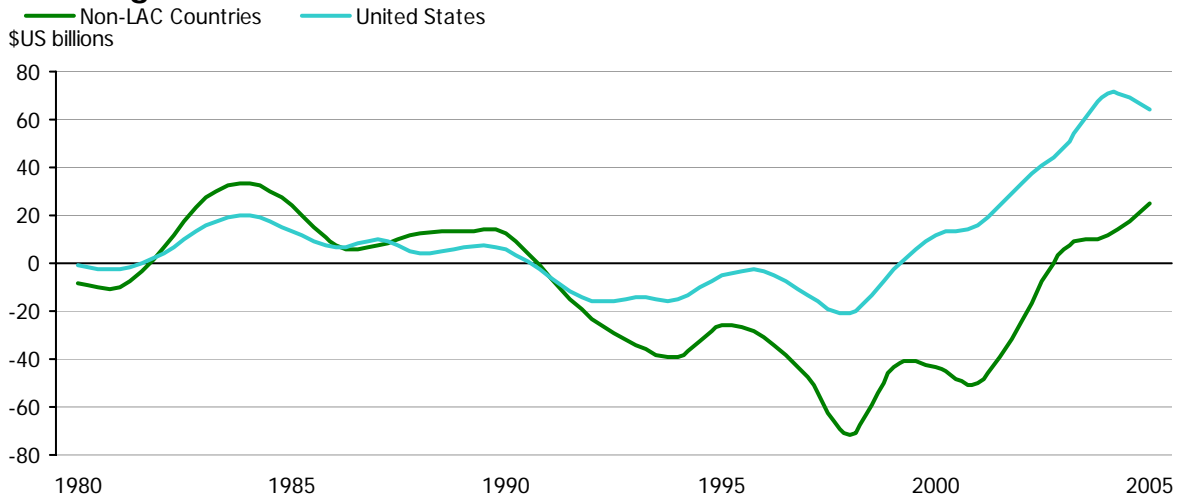
Textiles, Apparel, and Footwear includes SITC Groups: 261, 263, 264, 265, 266, 267, 268, 269, 651, 652, 653, 654, 655, 656, 657, 658, 659, 841, 842, 843, 844, 845, 846, 848, and 851.

Primary products include SITC codes 0 (food and live animals), 1 (beverages & tobacco), 2 (crude, inedible materials excluding fuel), 3 (mineral fuels and lubricants), and 4 (animal and vegetable oils, fats, and waxes).

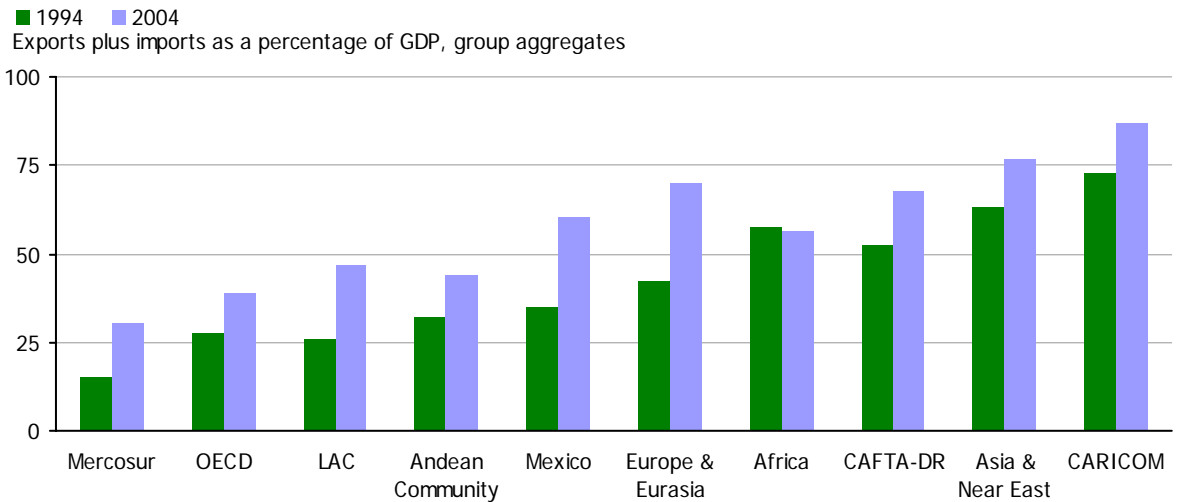
Total agricultural products include SITC Sections 0 (food and live animals), 1 (beverages & tobacco), 2 (crude, inedible materials excluding fuel), except for Divisions 27 (crude fertilizers & crude minerals) and 28 (metalliferous ores & metal scrap), and Section 4 (animal and vegetable oils, fats, and waxes). In order to align reporting methodologies with those of the general reporting community, agricultural products were re-defined starting with the 2003 edition. The present edition continues the 2003 definition.

Oil and petroleum products includes SITC Division 33 (petroleum, petroleum products and related materials).

Notes and Definitions

Source Except where indicated: IMF, *Direction of Trade Statistics*, CD-ROM (August, 2006).

This section presents data on total intra-regional LAC trade in merchandise goods (i.e. trade between LAC countries). *Merchandise exports*, as defined by the IMF, include all merchandise exported to another country, except goods transported through a territory (i.e. transit trade). Included are non-monetary gold, government trade (including foreign aid programs), military goods, sales and purchases of electricity, gas, and water, postal items, and transactions representing a service installed on a support device (such as data on computer tape, movies on videotape, or film). In general, goods do not include improvement and repair trade, trade moving between countries and their diplomatic representatives abroad, and monetary transactions of gold securities, banknotes, and coins. Exports are valued on a *free on board* (f.o.b.) basis. F.o.b. valuation is the transaction value of merchandise at the frontier of the exporting country.

Notes The IMF continuously updates and refines its data collection and estimation procedures as methodologies and original trade statistics reporting improve. With each publication of the *Direction of Trade Statistics*, data resulting from those updates and refinements will replace previously reported data, sometimes resulting in wide deviations from previous publications. Each edition of the LAC Databook reports the most recently published data from the IMF, including those data that have been changed.

Figures for China represent only mainland China (P.R.C.).

Other Caribbean Aruba, Bermuda, Falkland Islands, French Guyana, Guadeloupe, Martinique, and Netherlands Antilles.

World All countries of the world (i.e. exports/imports to the world reflect a country's total exports/imports).

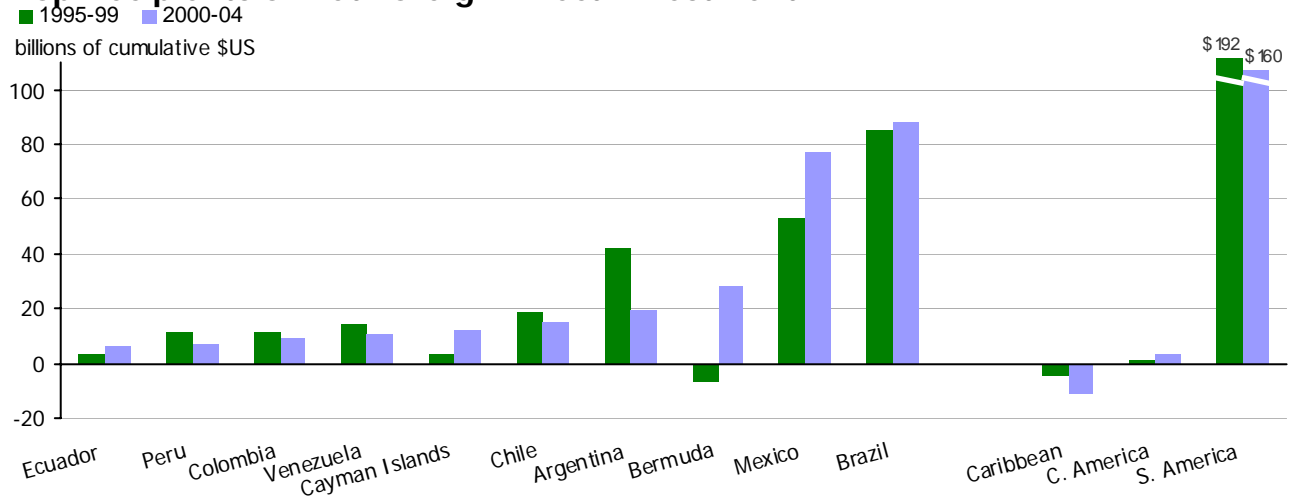

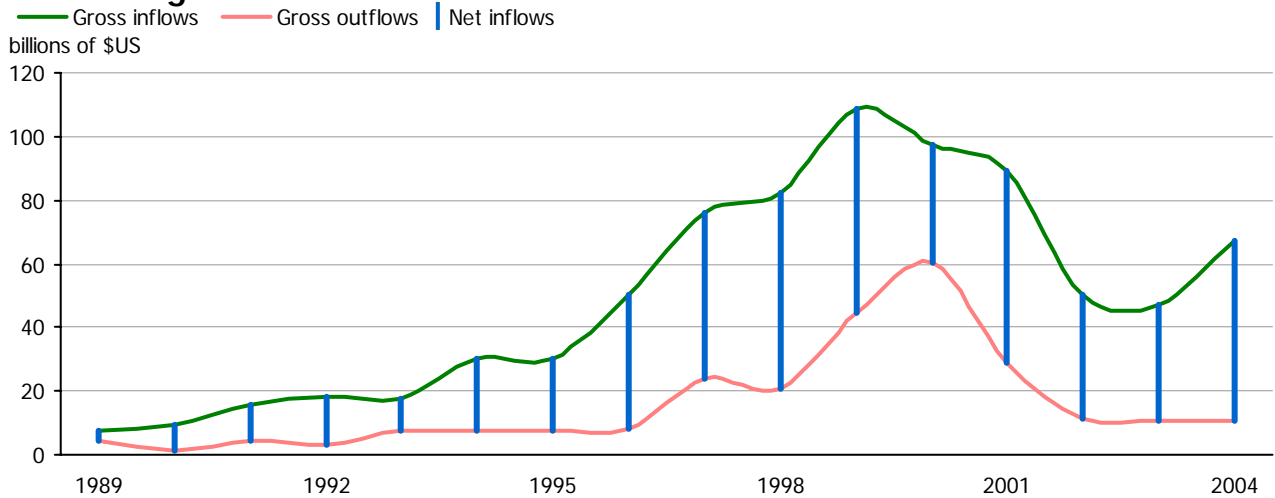

All figures are reported in current US dollars. The intra-regional table format differs from the format found throughout most of the LAC Databook. Each LAC sub-region (Caribbean, Central America and South America) is organized according to the trade/economic groups (e.g. CARICOM) that exist in the respective sub-regions. For instances in which a country does not belong to a trade group, it is assigned to an "other" category within its sub-region (e.g. "Other Caribbean"). Sub-regional trade groups and "other" category totals, shown in bold, are not included in sub-regional sums (unless the category is an individual country). Exports to the *World* represent a country's total exports; likewise, imports from the *World* represent a country's total imports.

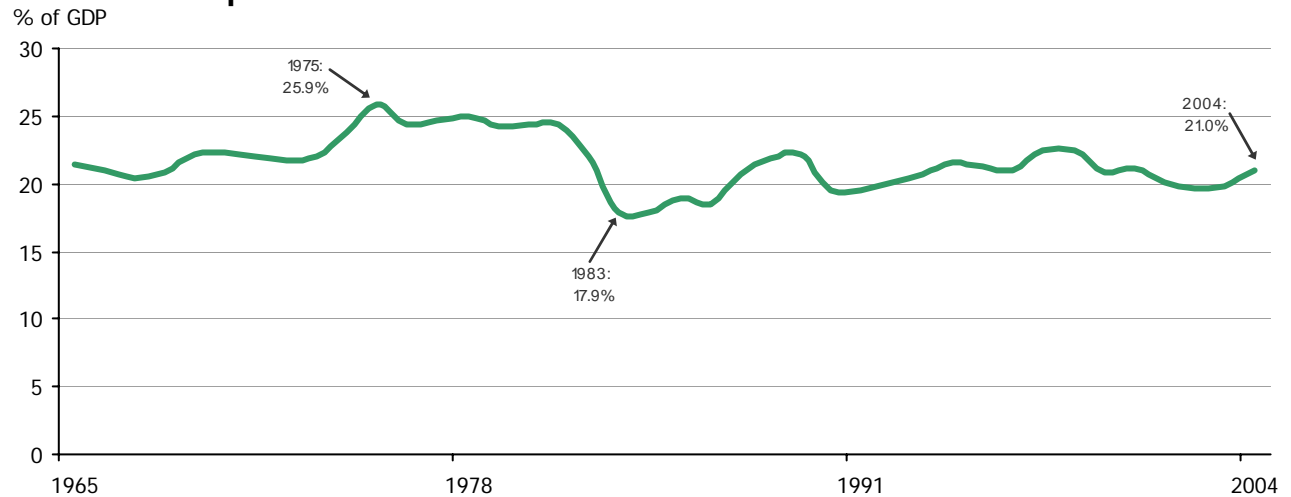
Top Recipients of Net Foreign Direct Investment

Definition *US direct investment position (on an historical-cost basis)* the book value of US direct investors' equity in, and net outstanding loans to, their foreign affiliates. Specifically, it is the ownership or control, directly or indirectly, by one US resident of 10 percent or more of the voting securities of an incorporated foreign business or an equivalent interest in an unincorporated foreign business enterprise. It measures the value of the net accumulated stock of capital (equity or debt) that US parents (companies) have provided to their foreign affiliates. The direct investment position at the end of the year is equal to the position at the end of the previous year plus the change in the position during the year. Changes in the US direct investment position result from capital flows (see Table 10.2) and valuation adjustments (which are made to account for currency-translation and other valuation changes, such as capital gains and losses).

Definition Detailed flows data are prepared only on an historical cost basis, so such estimates largely reflect price levels of earlier periods. Historical-cost estimates are not ordinarily adjusted to reflect the changes in the current costs or the replacement costs of tangible assets or in the stock market valuations of firms. Over time, the current costs of tangible assets and the stock market valuations of firms tend to increase. As a result, the historical-cost estimates of the

positions are less than the current-cost and market-value estimates of the positions. *Capital outflows* generally represent a US company's acquisition of assets abroad and occur when a US parent company increases its equity investment in one of its existing foreign affiliates or makes a new equity investment in a foreign business enterprise. *Capital inflows* decrease the US direct investment position and are thus indicated by negative figures. They arise from transactions that increase US liabilities or decrease US assets and therefore occur when a US parent company reduces its equity interest in an existing affiliate, including reinvestment of earnings (parents' claim on the current-period undistributed earnings of their affiliates) and inflows of inter-company debt (changes in net outstanding loans between parents and affiliates).

Notes Zeros (0) represent figures between \$500,000 and -\$500,000. The switch in capital flows from positive (i.e., outflows) to negative (i.e., inflows) between 2004 and 2005 have been attributed by the US Bureau of Economic Analysis to a sharp fall in equity capital outflows, a net inflow of debt from foreign affiliates to their US parents, and the first switch to negative reinvested earnings since 1950 that was encouraged by the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 and concentrated in Europe and LAC. Definition *US direct-investment income (without current-cost adjustment and net of withholding taxes)* measures the return on the US direct investment position abroad. It comprises US parent companies' claims on earnings (or profits) of foreign affiliates and interest payments on loans from their foreign affiliates. It is calculated as the sum of earnings (distributed and re-invested) and interest payments (the net result of US parents' foreign receipts and payments), minus withholding taxes on interest and distributed earnings, and excludes any current-cost adjustment on earnings that account for depreciation, depletion, and exploration expenses. Negative figures could result either from losses by the US parent company or interest obligations to foreign affiliates exceeding interest due plus the share in their affiliates' net income.

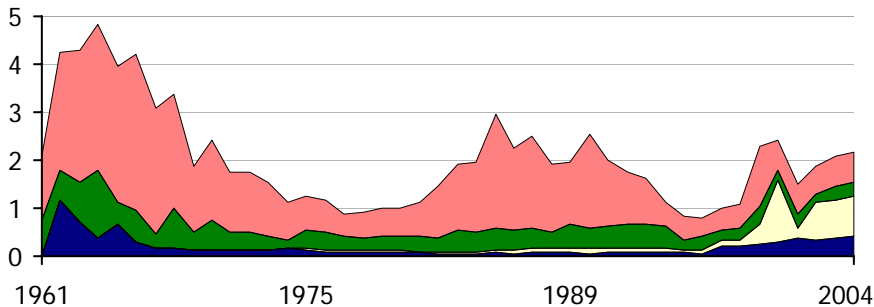

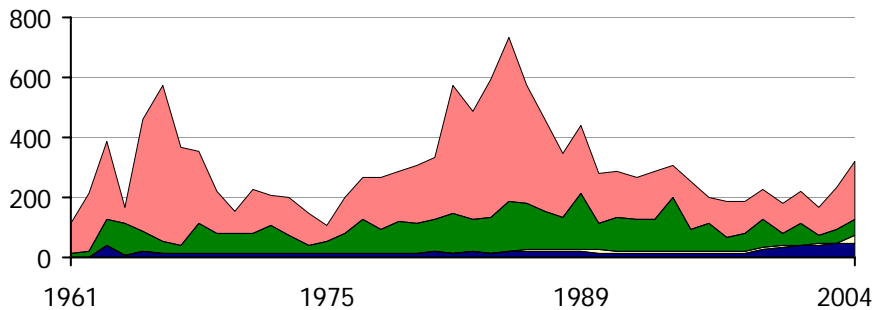

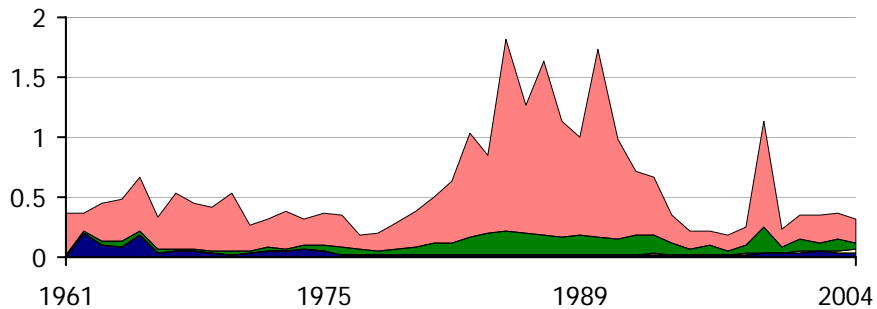

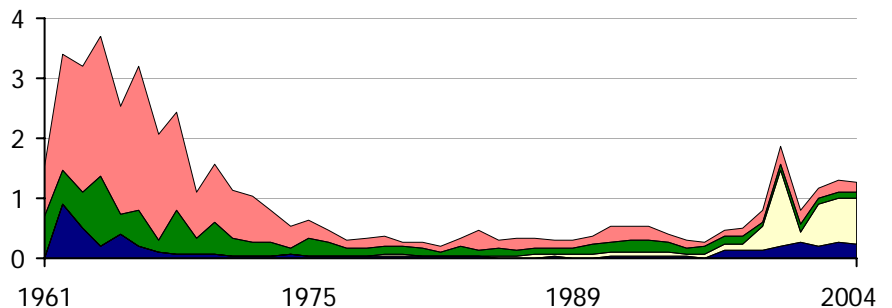

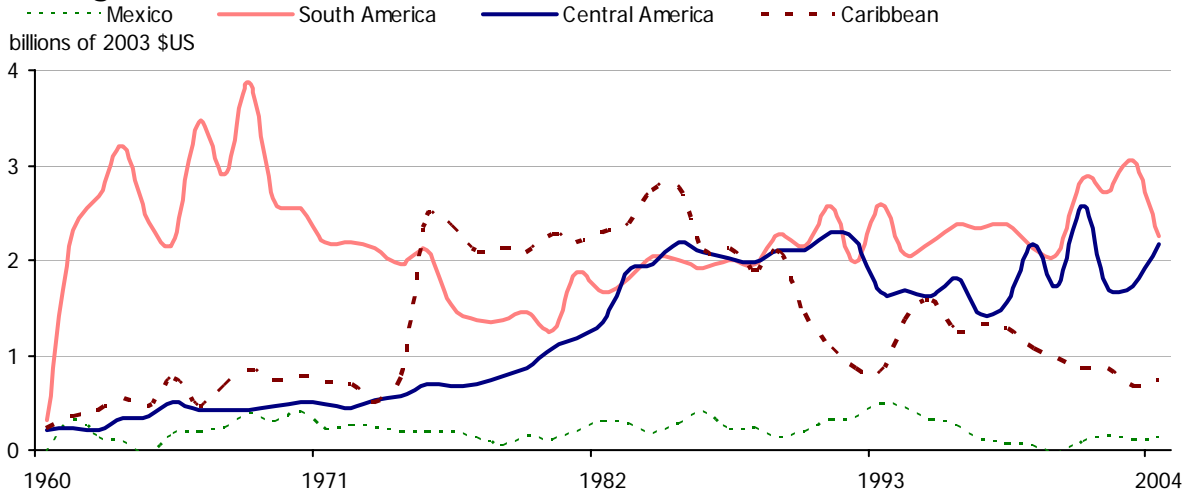

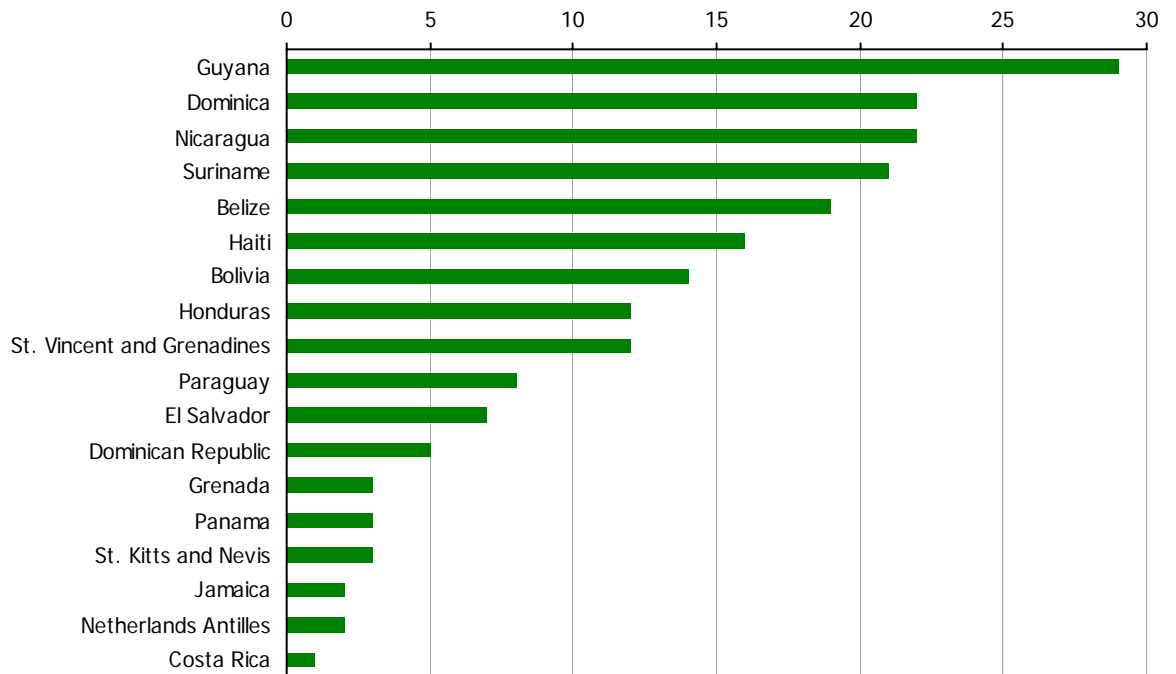

Notes and Definitions

This section provides data on official development assistance from Development Assistance Committee members and from multilateral development institutions. *Development Assistance Committee* (DAC) member countries include: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, and the United States. *Official development assistance* (ODA) is defined as disbursed flows to developing countries and multilateral institutions provided by official agencies, each transaction of which meets the following criteria: a) it is administered with the promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries as its main objective; and b) it is concessional in character and conveys a grant element of at least 25 percent.

ODA data are reported "net" after deductions for amortization payments on loans and for the impact of other measures reducing debt (e.g. forgiveness, repatriation of capital and occasionally recoveries on grants). Data on interest receipts and other debt servicing costs are not included in the statistics unless capitalized into the value of loans as part of debt rescheduling. Net disbursement flows equal total new flows (gross disbursements) in any single year minus repayments of outstanding loan obligations during that same time period. As a result net disbursements in some years can be negative. In such cases values are indicated with a minus (-) sign in the tables. Assistance from Russia is not included in any totals as a constant series of data from Russia is not available.
