

Hawaii Program Description

The mission of the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division (ADAD) is to provide the leadership necessary for the development and delivery of quality substance abuse prevention, intervention and treatment services for the residents of the State of Hawaii. ADAD's functions include grants and contracts management, clinical consultation, quality assurance, training, accreditation of substance abuse treatment programs, certification of substance abuse counselors and program administrators, policy development, planning and interagency coordination, client/program data collection/information systems, and needs assessment.

ADAD is the primary source of public funds for substance abuse treatment. ADAD's treatment efforts are designed to promote a statewide culturally appropriate, comprehensive system of services to meet the treatment and recovery needs of individuals and families. Treatment services have, as a requirement, priority admission for pregnant women and injection drug users.

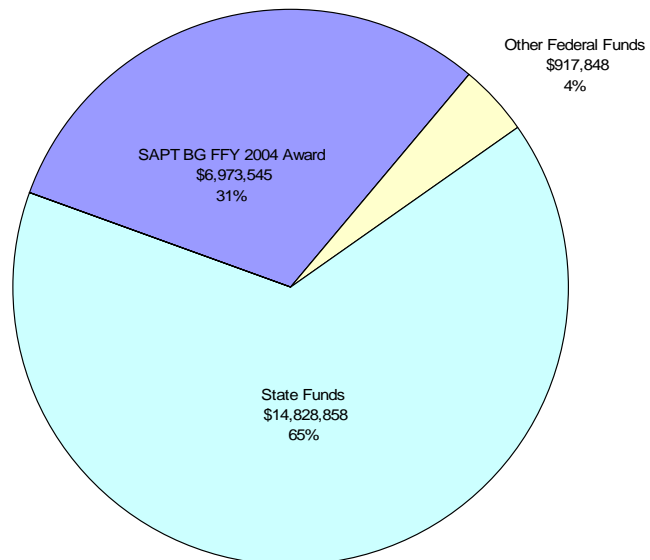
