## ORDER DENYING DEFENDANT'S MOTION (Doc. No. 113) FOR PRODUCTION OF ALL DOCUMENTS REFERENCED IN ALL PLEADINGS FILED BY THE PROSECUTION

Before the court is the October 7, 2004 motion of the defendant, Rande Lazar, requesting that all documents which the government has referred to in its pleadings, but which were not attached, be produced forthwith. This motion was referred to the United States Magistrate Judge for a determination. The government responded to the motion on October 15, 2004. For the following reasons, the motion is denied.

Lazar's request for all documents referred to in the government's pleadings is overbroad and vague. In order for the court to grant such a motion, Lazar must cite to specific examples of documents that the government has not filed or left unattached from its pleadings. It would be hard for this court to order the government to produce an array of documents when Lazar has failed to identify exactly what documents it is referring to. If Lazar renews his motion, he must cite specifically to the unattached and unfiled documents quoted by the government in its pleadings, and the court will consider the renewed motion at that time.

Accordingly, Lazar's motion for production of all documents referenced in all pleadings filed by the prosecution is denied.
