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Report Highlights:

In 2001/02 fresh orange production is 45,000 MT higher than last year's crop, but tangerine and lemon production are both lower. The estimate for the production of orange juice concentrate in 2000/01 is lower and as a consequence both production and stocks are lowered from previous estimates. Brazilian orange juice concentrate enters the Greek market as transhipments from other European posts; at current prices Greek OJC is competitive.

I. Situation & Outlook - Narrative

Production

The 2001/02 fresh orange production is presently forecast to be close to 1,020,000 MT or 45,000 MT, higher than last year's crop, which is estimated at 975,000 MT. Weather conditions this season have been characterized by significant fluctuations in temperature. High temperatures in May coupled with a lack of precipitation that continued through late October resulted, with the exception of oranges, in substantial reductions of both tangerines and lemons. Tangerine production for the 2001/02 season is presently forecast at about 75,000 MT while that of lemons is estimated at about 115,000 MT.

Orange juice concentrate production (65 Brix basis) during the 2000/01 season was revised downwards to 15,350 MT from the estimate included in the previous semi-annual report GR-1007 of May 8, 2001 due to a smaller tonnage of oranges delivered to processors than expected, totaling 277,000 MT. As a result of the smaller production, stocks of OJC dropped to 334 MT. Present forecasts for the 2001/02 OJC production stands at about 14,700 MT with stocks remaining at low levels. The price paid to growers for oranges delivered for processing during the 2000/01 year ranged from 33 to 37 drs/kg (8.5 to 9.5 cents/kg) as compared to 34 to 38 drs/kg (10.2 to 11.4 cents/kg) a year earlier due to the higher fruit supply.

The average yield of OJC during the 2000/01 season was close to 18 kgs of oranges (mostly navel and common varieties) needed to produce one kilogram OJC (basis 65 Brix) compared to 23 kgs of oranges the prior year. That very significant difference in yield is due to the very good quality of oranges delivered for processing.

Trade

In spite of the keen competition that the Greek citrus industry is facing from the other Mediterranean countries, especially Spain, the 2000/01 export season reached record levels, in the case of oranges, due to the following reasons: a) Increased value of the dollar, b) the earliness of the crop c) improvement in the economic situation of Eastern European and neighbouring countries and d) abolishment of the required certificate from the importing countries. Export of oranges totaled 371,000 MT, tangerines 34,000 MT and lemons 32,000 MT during the 2000/01 MY as compared to 267,000 MT, 30,000 MT and 24,000 MT respectively for the three citrus fruits the prior year. The timing of the citrus exports by variety were given in detail in our last year's annual report GR-0032 of Nov. 15, 2000 p3.

As stated in past reports, because of its large production levels, Brazil effectively controls the international market of OJC (65 Brix). While little of the Brazilian OJC is exported directly to Greece large quantities are shipped to EU destinations via Rotterdam and Hamburg. During CY 2000, imports entering the EU at these ports totaled 9,204 MT of a total imported tonnage of 19,351 MT, while imports from the US dropped to only 584 MT. Comparable CY 1999 figures were 10,800 MT, 21,307 MT and 1,005 MT respectively. The Brazilian price for OJC (65 Brix) has recently increased to about \$1,100/MT due to a Brazilian crop which is reduced by about 15 percent. Comparable Brazilian product prices of a year ago ranged between \$750 to \$850 per MT. At these current prices Greek OJC (65 Brix basis) is competitive.

Policy

The general opinion has been that EU Reg. Numbers 2200/96 and 2202/96 had negatively affected citrus growers through 2001. The EU issued Reg No 2699/2000 on Dec.4, 2000 to revise a number of provisions covered by prior regulations. These provisions are: a) The withdrawal of fresh citrus for the 2001/02 season is set at 10 percent of the tonnage marketed through groups of growers. This is further reduced to 5 percent for the period 2002/03. b) Sets national quotas for quantities of citrus to be processed in relation to a total community quota. The total community quota for oranges is now increased from 1,189,000 MT to 1,500,236 MT; for tangerines from 320,000 MT to 384,000 MT; and for lemons from 444,000 MT to 510,600 MT. For Greece specifically the national quotas are set at 280,000 MT for oranges; 5,217 MT for tangerines; and 27,976 MT for lemons. These new quotas are to become effective as of this 2001/02 season.

These aid prices paid to growers reflect drops of 30 percent for oranges, 29 percent for tangerines and 36 percent for lemons from those provided in EU Reg. No 2202/96. The latter were calculated based on deliveries to processors which over the previous three years, averaged excesses over levels established by the EU.

Consumption

Domestic fresh consumption data shown in the PS & D tables include farm use, losses (waste) as well as withdrawal tonnages, in addition to fresh sales. The analysis of these figures for oranges, tangerines, and lemons for the 1999/00, 2000/01 and an estimate for 2001/02 in metric tons are as follows:

Domestic per capita consumption of orange and lemon juices in Greece is quite stable and ranges between 10.5 and 11.0 liters of single strength orange juice and about 0.9 to 1.0 liter of single strength lemon juice.
