have sent out hundreds of résumés. Why haven't I heard anything?" As the Career Center Coordinator, I hear this often from Returned Peace Corps Volunteers, most of whom have outstanding résumés. They have all of the essentials: impressive educational credentials, significant work experience (including, of course, their incomparable achievements working as Peace Corps Volunteers), and eyepleasing layouts that grab their reader's attention. However, in a competitive marketplace, it often takes more than credentials and a well-worded résumé to distinguish oneself from potentially hundreds of other applicants. So how do you set yourself apart from the other names in the pile? Oftentimes, one of the best ways to literally get your foot in the door at an organization is to accept a temporary position through a local staffing firm.

For some, the idea of temporary employment—or temping invokes images of thankless work stuffing envelopes. Although some positions certainly do involve some mundane tasks, temping in the 21st century includes far more than the stereotypical, day-to-day work of answering phones and performing data entry. Many of the largest federal agencies and nonprofit organizations utilize staffing firms and temporary employees to develop their personnel. For example, a staffing agency that works closely with the RPCV Career Center often fills temporary positions for several nonprofit organizations, including AED, the Defenders of Wildlife, PBS, among many others. Temping can be the first step toward a rich and rewarding career.

Benefits of Temporary Employment

The first benefit of temporary employment is obvious. Unless you are independently wealthy, job searching without an income will undoubtedly take a toll on your finances. Whether you're plotting your career path, sending out résumés, or in the interviewing process, working for a temporary agency can keep you afloat without having to rely on credit cards or the generosity of your parents. More importantly, temporary work can be the bridge to a permanent position. Chances are, if you have been a reliable employee and the company has a full-time opening, you are in the perfect position to interview and secure the full-time position. And this is a two-way street. Temporary work also provides you with an opportunity to see if an organization is really the right match for you before you accept a permanent position.

What You Should Know

First, you should know that there are actually three different types of job placement in the staffing industry: temporary (sometimes referred to as contract), temp-tohire, and direct hire. Temporary is when an individual works for a staffing firm's customer on an interim basis. A temp-to-hire works for a staffing firm's customer on a trial basis in order to determine if the job is a good fit for your skills, interests, and career goals. A direct hire or permanent employee is recruited by the staffing firm and then hired by its customer. Be sure you're clear with the staffing firm's representative about which types of placements you are interested in.

Second, just as there are different types of job placements, there are also different types of staffing firms. As the industry becomes more competitive, firms are increasing specialization or niche servicing, for instance, on one sector of the economy. My first recommendation would be to know exactly what type of work you would like to do and find a temporary agency that frequently places people in that field. If you already know exactly which organization you would like to eventually work for, call the organization's human resources Continued on page 13

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department to find out which staffing firm they work with when they have an immediate need for temporary staff. You can also obtain a list from staffing firms, which outlines the organizations they regularly work with. Oftentimes, individual government agencies or nonprofit organizations have established a rapport with a specific temporary agency to fill their temporary positions.

The Process

Although it may vary slightly, most staffing firms have similar procedures in registering with a temporary agency.

- Fill out an online application and résumé.
- Schedule an interview with a representative from the staffing firm to discuss your skills and career goals. (Do not forget to bring a photo ID and your Social Security Card.)
- Take computer-base skill evaluation tests, usually in MS Word and Excel.

How The RPCV Career Center Can Help

Every first, second, third, and fourth Tuesday of the month, from 4:00-5:30, four different staffing firms conduct résumé reviews exclusively for RPCVs at the Peace Corps Career Center in Rosslyn, Virginia. This not only gives the RPCV an opportunity to have someone look at their résumé, but the chance to discuss temporary opportunities with the firm. However, if you live outside the D.C. Metro area and are unable to participate in these events, begin your research at the American Staffing Association's (ASA) website, www.american staffing.net. ASA is the nationally recognized association that is responsible for regulating staffing organizations across the country and is regarded as the voice of the staffing industry. Their website provides a list of reputable staffing firms searchable by location, types of service, and occupational categories.
