Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program 2003 Budget Cut Report

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides financial aid to low income households in order to help them meet their energy needs. The Bush Administration has cut \$300 million dollars out of the 2003 LIHEAP budget, reducing New York State's share by \$38 million. The effects of these cuts will be drastic. Approximately 80,000 fewer New Yorker households than last year will receive aid, while the number of households eligible for the program will likely increase because of this winter's skyrocketing price of heating oil and natural gas.

Below is a county-by-county estimate of the number of LIHEAP recipient households that will no longer receive funding as a result of the Bush Administration budget cuts. These estimates were made by assigning each county a proportion of the statewide cuts based on the county's number of LIHEAP recipients in 2001:

The Capital Region: In 2001, 37,889 households in the Capital Region received LIHEAP assistance. As a result of the Bush Administration budget cuts, 3,987 fewer households in the area will receive funding, lowering the overall number of households that receive LIHEAP funding in 2002 to 33,902.
