Report Highlights:

Excise tax increases and restrictions on cigarette advertising will lead to reduced cigarette consumption in Poland. Lower consumption and reduced cigarette exports to Russia are expected to result in lower tobacco imports. Expiration of obligations for cigarette manufacturers to purchase domestic tobacco should begin a trend toward decreased tobacco production in Poland.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since the end of 1999, all cigarette manufacturing plants in Poland have been privately owned or controlled. The plants which were privatized earliest have completed their five year obligation under their privatization agreements to maintain 40 percent domestic tobacco content within their domestic brand cigarettes. Tobacco area is expected to decrease slightly reflecting indications from some tobacco processors that they intend to contract for less domestic tobacco in 2000. Larger area decreases may be in store within the next few years. However, efforts to protect domestic production by raising import taxes which surfaced in late 1999 could resurface again given the relatively well organized efforts of the tobacco producers association.

The predicted decline in tobacco area will be tempered to some extent by Polish farmers efforts to switch from dark to the preferred light tobacco varieties used to produce Western brand cigarettes. The efforts to switch to light tobacco varieties have been supported with technical assistance from some cigarette manufacturers. Increasing Polish production of Western brand cigarettes has led to a decline in cigarette imports from 549 million pieces in CY 1998 to 450 million pieces in CY 1999. Cigarette imports are expected to remain at 450 million pieces in CY 2000.

Cigarette exports leapt from 4.6 billion pieces in 1998 (an unusually low figure caused by collapse of the Russian market) to 26.3 billion pieces in first nine months of 1999 including 22 billion pieces exported to Russia. Cigarette exports are expected to decrease from 26.3 billion pieces in 1999 to 24 billion pieces in 2000 as producers gradually shift production toward Western brands for the domestic and Western European markets.

Poland's restrictions on cigarette advertising and sharp excise tax increases on cigarettes are expected to result in a decrease in cigarette consumption from 68.7 billion pieces in 1998 to 68.5 billion pieces in 2000. Reduced export quantities and, to a lesser extent, lower domestic consumption are expected to result in a decrease in domestic cigarette production from 94.6 billion pieces in 1999 to 92 billion pieces in 2000. Reflecting the decrease in cigarette production expected to occur in 2000, imports of raw tobacco are expected to decrease from 50,000 tons in 1999 to 41,000 tons in 2000.

TOBACCO

Production

Tobacco area in 2000 is expected to decrease slightly from 1999 levels reflecting indications that some tobacco manufacturers intend to contract for less tobacco. The tobacco leaf harvest in 2000 is expected to amount to 37,800 as it did in 1999 in anticipation of slightly higher yields. While the 1999 crop was slightly larger than 1998, poor weather quality was worse.

Polish tobacco production still consists primarily of traditional varieties of dark tobacco. However, farmers continue to shift toward lighter varieties. In the southern part of Poland, one of the largest tobacco growing regions in the country, most farmers have already changed to these new varieties. This shift may accelerate as obligations for cigarette producers to use a set portion of domestic tobacco in their manufacturing process expire. According to privatization agreements, tobacco companies are required to purchase minimum quantities of domestically-produced tobacco (40 percent of processed tobacco has to be local one), usually for a period of 5 years. Some of these contracted periods ended in 1999.

Tobacco is grown in Poland by around 50 thousand farmers on the total area of slightly more than 21,000 hectares. The average size of a typical tobacco farm is approximately 0.4 hectares. The largest tobacco growing areas are located in the south near Zamosc (5,000 hectares), Kielce (4,000 hectares) and Krakow (3,000 hectares). The dominant variety grown in these regions is Virginia tobacco. Near Augustow (north-west of Poland), Brazilian varieties have been replaced by Virginia, Burley, Skroniowski strong and Kentucky varieties. The average area of tobacco plantations in the northwestern region is growing and could reach 0.5 hectares in 2000, compared with 0.3 hectares in 1997.

Consumption

Total leaf utilization in 2000 is expected to contract to 1998 levels reflecting expectations of reduced cigarette exports to Russia and lower domestic consumption.

Stocks

There were no data on stocks for unmanufactured light air cured tobacco in the past. Actually stocks are privatized and no information is available. In 1999 tobacco importers were afraid that the government would increase tariff on an unmanufactured tobacco. They were trying to import as much as possible of tobacco before. Unfortunately the processors cannot consume all imported quantities. As a result, the importers stockpiled tobacco for the first time.

Trade

Imports of raw tobacco in the first nine months of 1999 reached 48,825 metric tons exceeding total imports in 1998 (45,720 metric tons). Only imports of Burley were lower than in the previous year. Companies appear to have imported "extra" tobacco in 1999 and stockpiled it out of concern that the Polish government would raise tobacco

tariffs in 2000 from 30 percent up to 180 percent. After strong pressure from both foreign and domestic interests including Polish tobacco farmers, the Polish government decided to leave tobacco import tariffs unchanged in 2000.

Tobacco imports in 2000 are expected to decline to 41,000 tons from 50,000 tons in 1999. The decrease in tobacco imports stems from lower expected cigarette production and exports. Also, cigarette manufacturers will use stocks acquired in 1999. Traditionally, imports consist primarily of light tobacco varieties. The main suppliers of unmanufactured tobacco to Poland are Zimbabwe, the United States, Brazil, Malawi and Turkey. It is estimated that in 2000 exports will be slightly higher because for the first time not all locally produced tobacco will be sold to tobacco processors. The biggest importers of Polish tobacco are Russia, Kazakhstan, Ukraine and Lithuania.

Tariff changes and non-tariff barriers

Tariffs for unmanufactured tobacco have been largely unchanged since 1993 when a minimum tariff of 1.13 ECU per kilogram was introduced in addition to the basic ad valorem tariff. Tobacco is one of the few agricultural commodities which has tariffs which are the same for all suppliers regardless of whether they are in least developed, developing, or developed countries. All exporting countries face the same tariff treatment for entry into Poland. The following tariff schedule is applicable to unmanufactured tobacco in CY 2000:

In CY 2000, Poland will again maintain applied tariffs as noted in the preceding table which are much lower than WTO bound rates. According to bilateral agreements, tariff rate quotas in CY 2000 are available for 700 tons of non-processed tobacco imported from Hungary, 200 tons from Bulgaria and 2000 tons from Turkey with in-quota rates of 15 percent, minimum EUR 0.565 per kilogram.

In April 2000, the Polish Customs office abandoned their plan to retroactively reclassify imports of some classes of tobacco into a higher tariff category based on a ruling made by the World Customs Organization (WCO) decision. The reclassification would have impacted imports going back to 1995 and potentially could have resulted in additional import taxes of PLN 721.8 million (around U\$ 400 million). WCO decided that mixtures of unmanufactured tobacco leaves should be classified as unmanufactured tobacco and the lower tariff should remain in effect.

Marketing

Polish tobacco is produced on private farms and sold to tobacco processing plants primarily on a contractual basis. Processing companies operate independently in all areas including foreign trade.

CIGARETTES

Production

Poland primary tobacco product is cigarettes with 94.6 billion pieces produced in 1999 down from 96.5 billion pieces produced in 1998. Other tobacco products, like pipe tobacco, cigars and snuff, account for less than 0.1 percent of consumption and are mainly imported. The production and sale of snuff is prohibited.

Cigarettes are produced in 11 plants owned by 7 independently-managed companies. Since early 1998, all manufacturing plants are owned or controlled by private investors. According to privatization agreements, the companies are required to invest in modernization of the industry, which they have successfully accomplished. To respond to a growing demand for light cigarettes with low tar and nicotine content, cigarette manufacturers have introduced modern production lines and provided technical assistance to farmers in switching to new tobacco varieties.

Ninety-nine percent of cigarettes available on the Polish market are produced in Poland. Sixty-five percent of all cigarettes on sale are traditional Polish brands in which a large part of the tobacco is Polish.

Smuggling of cigarettes reportedly increased in 1999 which may be partly reflected in official statistics indicating that legal sales of cigarettes decreased by 6.1 percent relative to 1998.

One development stemming from privatization is that employment in tobacco processing companies dropped by 11 percent from 12,000 people in December 1998 to 10,000 people in December 1999. An additional 10 percent of tobacco industry employees are expected to be laid off in 2000.

Production policy

Poland's excise tax accounts for around 41 percent of cigarette prices but is still lower than the 57 percent required by the European Union. The excise tax on cigarettes increased by 27 percent in 1999. An additional 28 percent increase is planned for 2000. In 2001 a 30 percent increase is planned. Excise taxes on cigarettes differ based on the type of cigarette. Four separate categories of cigarettes have been established for excise tax purposes.

A new excise tax system will be introduced as of June 1, 2000. It will consist of a per unit tax fixed for each trimester and equal for all cigarettes and an additional tax of 25 percent of the sales value in 2000. The 25 percent tax will be applied to a maximum retail price which must be printed on the cigarette packaging. In addition, the excise tax on any cigarettes sold cannot be lower than 90 percent of the excise tax for the most popular cigarettes sold in the previous year. In cases where no retail price is shown on the package, excise taxes of 70 percent and 230 percent will be applied to locally produced cigarettes and imported cigarettes, respectively. The requirement that retail prices must be printed on the package will be in force after June 1, 2001.

The new excise tax system is expected to generate over PLN 7.9 billion (\$ 2 billion) in tax revenues from cigarette production in 2000. In 1998, tax revenue from tobacco products was PLN 5.3 (\$ 1.5 billion) with PLN 6.3 billion (\$ 1.7 billion) estimated in 1999. The income from VAT and excise tax from the tobacco industry represents 6 percent of the government's budget.

In 1998 new norms for harmful substance content in tobacco products were introduced with 15 mg of tar and 1.5 mg of nicotine allowable in cigarettes. After 2003 these norms are to be reduced respectively to 12 mg of tar and 1.2 mg of nicotine.

Consumption

There are about 10 million smokers in Poland of which 45 percent are adult men and 22 percent are adult women. Per capita consumption is 2,500 cigarettes per year. Legal sales of cigarettes dropped by 6.1 percent in 1999 compared to 1998 levels. However, actual sales of cigarettes may not have decreased as much since smuggling reported increased sharply. Tobacco companies claim that the decrease in officials sales and increases in smuggling resulted from the frequent increases in excise taxes and limits on advertisement adopted in 1999 by the Polish parliament.

As a result of an annually anti-smoking campaign, over 2 million Poles are estimated to have given up smoking since 1995. At the same time, the amount spent by the health service on illnesses caused by tobacco-smoking has risen. According to the Central Statistical Office, tobacco products account for about 2 percent of the typical Polish household budgets rivaling expenditure on alcohol (1.1 percent). The percentage of income spent on tobacco products has risen from 1.9 percent in 1997. The average monthly expenditure per capita on tobacco products was PLN 10.21 (\$ 2.96) in 1998 and increased to PLN 11.24 (\$ 3.21) within first nine months of 1999. Increased expenditures reflect the fact that prices of tobacco products rose 16.4 percent in 1999 while prices of other products increased only by 8.7 percent in average.

Trade

Cigarette imports continue to decline due to increasing domestic production of Western brands in Poland. Official statistics on total imports and exports of cigarettes in 1999 are not yet available. However 364 million pcs were imported in the first nine months compared to 549 million pieces in CY 1998. Cigarette producers mentioned smuggling among the threats for their sales. Penalties are high for smugglers or those who sell cigarettes without excise tax labels, but there is a very poor control. In 1998 there were 3,429 cases opened against smugglers with the value of goods confiscated estimated at PLN 8,090,364 (\$ 2.3 million). In 1999 there were 4,678 cases opened and goods confiscated were valued at PLN 10,696,278 (\$ 2.9 million). These figures include all products classified under CN heading 2402.

Polish exports of cigarettes represented 4.6 billion pieces in 1998. During the first nine months of 1999 cigarette exports leapt to the unprecedented level of 26.3 billion pieces of which 22 billion pieces were exported to Russia. Total cigarette exports in 1999 are expected to reach 32 billion pieces and are expected to increase to 35 billion pieces in 2000. The largest importers of Polish cigarettes in 1998 were Belgium and Slovenia, and in 1999 - Russia, Ukraine and Switzerland.

Marketing

According to an amended act on health prevention against the results of tobacco smoking adopted in November 1999, tobacco companies must removal all advertising with their logos from news-paper kiosks, shops, cafeterias, restaurants, pubs and other public places. Additionally, all outdoor tobacco promotion or promotions through sponsorship is prohibited. Cigarettes cannot be sold in schools, health care institutions and sports halls. Advertisement in print media will be prohibited in 2002. Health warnings must cover one-third of all labels or advertisements for tobacco products. As might be expected, consumption is not very dependent on price fluctuations.
