

I've worked at BPA for fifteen years now. Being a regulatory economics type, I never really looked at the medical issues of neurological diseases. Then several years ago, I had to watch my Mother die of Lou Gehrigs Disease. Now fast forward 13 years, and the effects of a sedentary life was setting in and I was given strong advice from my doctor and coffee buddy, Fev Pratt, to get active. Then one day in early 2004, I got a wake up call. I started to feel numbness in my toes and then eventually throughout my right leg.

I thought I had tweaked a nerve doing Pilates or biking. Things got worse and I started crashing my bike and falling down while walking. I felt like there was a hole that someone had forgot to fill in or something. Going down stairs became events of daring the fates. I was also losing my ability to drive. Try driving when you cannot feel the gas or brake pedal and you don't have control over where the foot is heading. I tried driving with the left foot, but that was not very effective. In addition to the balance problems and numbness, fatigue levels were increasing. A walk across a room was enough to make me want to sit down and rest. So after I got to the point of not being able to ride, drive or walk very well, I decided to seek the advice of a doctor. MRI tests showed I had MS. This is not something you want to hear, but then at least it explains the symptoms. Of course, there were lots of fun steroids treatments and the latest in MS therapies.

During one of my many visits to the doctor's office, I saw an article on the MS 150 Cycle ride. It described how it was a national two-day bicycle event that raises money for MS research and assistance for people with MS. I talked with my doctor about doing this ride in 2005 and he said "Go For It!". His message to me was that I should never let MS stop me from being as active as possible. So I joined an MS 150 Cycle Team and was told to raise lots of money. I reached out to many of my co-workers and friends here at BPA and realized that no matter what the stresses or issues that were pressing at the workplace, they generously gave to this cause. I also heard stories from some about friends and relatives that also suffer from MS. Many were sad and often telling me that there were very courageous people fighting this disease. At the time I was not telling people of my MS and felt that I was doing just fine. Denial is a sometimes a comforting place to be when you are facing something like MS. It has a way of sneaking up on you and saying, "Remember Me?" At times I experience a bit more numbness and fatigue that I work hard to manage, and for the most part am successful. My riding may be not as powerful as last year, but I keep hearing the recommendation of my doctor telling me to "Go For it" and am gearing up for another push to ride the Oregon MS 150. He reminds me that I have cranked 8,800 miles since being diagnosed and I should not back down. The push is on for the many miles of training and the all important fundraising. My first attempt was a success with the Federal Employees Associates Group making a generous donation to the National MS Society. My team will proudly have the Associates logo placed on our jersey along with all the other sponsors. To all those who donated last year, well your donations were important to this fight and are being used to fund research for finding cures. And yes I will be asking you again to be generous. What I found out this year is that children and young teens are being hit with MS. The result is that children with dreams are facing a disease that is robbing them of their mobility, vision, balance and ability to enjoy life in the fullness they deserve. So this year I am riding to say lets draw a line in the sand on this disease.



The Federal Employees Golf Association (FEGA) is an Associate Club (Club without real estate).
