

# Big Rocks, Little Rocks

## Key Points:

- Erosion breaks rocks into smaller pieces.
- These small pieces help make up sand and dirt.

### Materials:

- Cookie
- Napkin

### Procedure:

- 1. Give each child a cookie and let them take one small bite.
- 2. Get them to "be erosion" by smashing their cookie into small pieces on a napkin.
- 3. Get them to taste the smashed cookie "dirt" and see if it tastes the same as the big cookie.
- 4. Show them a piece of sandstone, and some sand.

### Discussion:

Explain that the sand is just tiny little pieces of the sandstone, the way their cookie "dirt" was just little pieces of the cookie.

### Questions:

- 1. What kinds of things could break up rocks? (Ice, water, wind)
- 2. Would sand from different kinds of rocks look different?
