

§ In addition to these five FMPs, the NPFMC also is responsible for developing regulations governing Pacific halibut fisheries in and off of Alaska under authority of the Northern Pacific Halibut Act of 1982 (Halibut Act). These regulations, which are in addition to and not in conflict with regulations adopted by the International Pacific Halibut Commission, primarily allocate halibut fishing privileges among U.S. fishermen. Although the NPFMC develops halibut management regulations according to principles of the Magnuson-Stevens Act, no halibut FMP exists because the Magnuson-Stevens Act does not apply to management of the Pacific halibut fisheries. In 2006, the commercial catch of halibut in and off Alaska was 24,535 metric tons, net weight. This catch was made by 2,381 persons permitted to harvest halibut under the Individual Fishing Quota (IFQ) and Community Development Quota (CDQ) Programs.

* 2006 salmon catch data are from the State of Alaska; these data represent only the southeast AK hand and power troll fisheries that are governed by the Salmon FMP and managed as one fishery, inside and outside State waters by the State of Alaska. The most recent catch data for the BSAI crab fisheries are from the BSAI Crab Rationalization Program Report for Fishing Year 2005/2006, prepared by the Alaska Region, NMFS (dated 12/14/2006). In 2005, a new IFQ program replaced the LLP license requirement for most BSAI king and Tanner crab fisheries. A total of 490 distinct persons were initially issued one or more types of harvesting quota share for eight crab fisheries. Some LLP crab licenses were re-issued to authorize fishing not managed under the IFQ system. Of the approximate total 2,185 current LLP permits, most (1,837) authorized fishing for groundfish in the BSAI or GOA or both, and 348 still authorized fishing for BSAI crab species not under IFQ management. A number of permits were "interim" and will be revoked following final adjudication of claims.

Also, a total of 598 persons were authorized to harvest sablefish at the end of 2006, with fixed gear in the GOA and BSAI under the IFQ Program. The salmon permit data are from the State of Alaska and represent the number of individual permit holders of hand and power troll permits in 2006. Not all permits holders landed fish in 2006.
