




Cooperative Authority Control Proposal (Latin America & the Caribbean)

- 3. If approved, the records are loaded into a regional authority file





e.g.The Luis Angel Arango Library (Colombia) – a CD ROM database




Personal names should be:

- Use the guidelines, but allow flexibility


