MOTHER SETON HOUSE, 600 N. Paca St., c. 1807-1808, attributed to Maximilian Godefroy, architect. Brick, 2 1/2 stories, rectangular, gabled roof, interior end chimneys with arcaded caps, gabled dormer, slightly projecting off-center entrance with transom, flat arched opening. Federal. Home of Elizabeth Ann Seton, who established a girls' school at St. Mary's Seminary, took her religious vows at St. Mary's Seminary Chapel (see also St. Mary's Seminary Chapel, MD), and founded the order of the Daughters of Charity; she later became the only American-born woman to be beatified (1963) and canonized by the Roman Catholic Church, Sept. 14, 1975. *Private*.
