

Statement of Senator Feinstein on Internet Ad Attacking AARP February 24, 2005

Washington, DC – U.S. Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif.) today spoke out against a "test" Internet ad launched by USA Next that viciously attacked AARP.

"This is a vile and despicable ad. It preys on fears and prejudice against gays to make its point. It reaches deep into the basement of American politics.

The question of how we reform Social Security is one of the most important questions facing our nation. It is my hope that there can be a civil dialogue and an honest exchange of ideas about how to ensure Social Security continues to provide Americans with a secure safety net.

In my view, there is no place for these types of ads, which only serve to destroy efforts at bipartisanship and polarize our nation even further.

I understand that this ad was released as only a 'test.' It is my hope that those who have produced it recognize that their test has failed and choose not to air this or similar ads in the future.

I call on President Bush to oppose this ad and to publicly denounce efforts to support his privatization plan with lies, prejudice, and distortion."
