This bill renews the temporary duty suspension that was provided for in HTS heading 9902.05.24, which expired on December 31, 2006. In order to be effective, section 1(a), line 6, of the bill needs to be amended by deleting "12/31/2009" and inserting "12/31/2006".

⁴ The Commission may express an opinion on the HTS classification of a product to facilitate consideration of the bill. However, by law, only the U.S. Customs Service is authorized to issue a binding ruling on this matter. The Commission believes that the U.S. Customs Service should be consulted prior to enactment of the bill.
