GOALS:

- Reinforce Necessity of Safety
- Incident Command System (ICS) Development and Proficiency
- Emergency Field Skills (Ground and Air) Development and Proficiency

AIRPORT PROCEDURES AND CONSIDERATIONS:

- "Gnoss Field" (pronounced with a silent G) DVO (<u>http://www.airnav.com/airport/KDVO</u>)
- Runways 13 and 31 (3300 x 75 feet, paved, lighted, VASI, 2ft MSL)
- All patterns are NE of the airport (Right Traffic 31, Left Traffic 13), TPA 1002ft MSL
- Noise sensitive area SE of airport. Avoid straight-in 31/straight-out 13. Calm or direct crosswind use 13.
- TFR expected at Sears Point Raceway 5NM East of Gnoss...check NOTAMS!
- Common reporting points:
 - o "Mouth of the river (where it opens to the Bay)" when inbound from the South
 - "Sears Point (Raceway)" when inbound from the East (if not under TFR!)
 - "Bend in the River" when on the 45 for 31
- Fuel is available via truck (contact "EMC Fuel" on CTAF or 415-897-1653)
- Park in marked spaces (South end of the ramp). Numbers are 410-414 and 610-614, all facing the runway.
- Planes with CAP paint scheme in row 600. There will be no ramp fees for planes involved in the SAREX! <u>Cautions:</u>
 - o Towers East of the airport are 520 feet MSL and just inside the pattern
 - Prevalent winds are from the SW-to-W (brush up on crosswinds before arrival!)

COMMUNICATIONS:

- Airport:
 - o AWOS: 120.675 or 415-897-2236 or 877/ANY-AWOS
 - CTAF: 123.075 (also used for "EMC Fuel")
 - NorCal App: 124.325 inbound, outbound, & IFR clearances (new frequency) NOTE! As of this publication, the old OAK Center Freq 127.8 is still being used! Check NOTAMs.
 - Transponder: As assigned by Center (CAP is trying to arrange dedicated codes for the weekend but this has not yet materialized).
- CAP ("Marin Base"):
 - CAP Acft: Mt Diablo Alternate Repeater (or as assigned)...pre-departure radio check NOTE: Use channel 84 on Tait 2020 radios, check frequency card on Midland radios
 - o Private Acft: 131.8...pre-departure radio check
 - o Ground Teams: Mt Diablo Alternate Repeater (or as assigned) ... pre-departure radio check
 - o Base Phone: 415-897-2777
 - o Flight Releases: Base Phone or 707-235-2524 or 415-336-5196 or 415-302-9384

INBOUND & OUTBOUND CONSIDERATIONS:

- All inbound flights require flight release by Marin Base prior to departure. The use of other Flight Release
 Officers is not permitted. Prepare CAPF 104 in advance (see http://cawg.cap.gov/html/operations/mes.htm).
 Call between 1700 and 2000 the night before the proposed flight for final release.
- All inbound and outbound flights > 50NM require filing and use of FAA flight plan
- If equipped, DF and CAP FM radio will be on and monitored for the entire duration of the exercise, including travel to and from
- All outbound flights require positive closure via flight release numbers noted above or radio
- Driving directions can be found on the Squadron 23 website under "About"

TIMING:

- Friday:
 - o 1700-2000: Meeting of ICS Staff Mentors and phone briefings of Saturday's inbound pilots
- Saturday:
 - o 0730-0830: Check-In
 - o 0845-0915: Briefing for All Personnel
 - o 0930-1700: Ground and Air Crews briefed and sent into the field
 - o 1700-2000: Closure of outbound flight releases and phone briefings of Sunday's inbound pilots
- Sunday:
 - o 0730-0830: Check-In
 - o 0845-0915: Briefing for All Personnel
 - o 0930-1700: Ground and Air Crews briefed and sent into the field
 - o 1700-2000: Closure of outbound flight releases

PERSONAL GEAR:

- Appropriate uniforms are mandatory for all roles.
- ID Card to confirm current membership. ES card to confirm ratings (MMU will also be referenced).
- Gridded charts with numbers confirmed against Marin Base charts
- Bring digital cameras if available

MISCELLANEOUS:

- Please fuel and pay after each flight, including inbounds. Don't leave us to try to work out any unpaid bills!
- Competency checks will be conducted prior to all air and ground sorties...know your regs and equipment
- Restrooms: 2 inside Pilots' Lounge, 1 "mobile" outside Pilots' Lounge, 1 in Piper building
- Cell phone service at the field is very good. There's also a Pilots' Lounge phone for FAA flight plans.
- Computers are available with excellent internet access...please become more familiar with the WMU!
- Emergency: Dial 911. The closest urgent care facility is Novato Community Hospital (Southbound 101 2 minutes to Roland, East over the freeway then left to 180 Rowland Way). (415) 209-1300

FIRST STEPS UPON ARRIVAL AT BASE:

- Register (CAPID, ES Card, \$20, Sign in acft/vehicles, Sign release and get photographed for History Channel)
- Remove all personal gear from airplanes and turn in keys for safety inspection
- Get refreshments (and stay hydrated)
- Confirm chart gridding with master and prepare for general briefing
- Get started on your weight and balance. Don't give the briefers a blank stare when they ask for it.
- Prepare Form 108 for inbound leg. Get Form 104 to prepare for first sortie

- POD How should I calculate it and what does it mean?
- Form 108's How can I accelerate my reimbursement?
- Triangulation What is it, how well does it work, and what are the common errors?
- Past Accidents Why they happened, how hard are they to spot, what we can learn?
- MMU What is it, why should I know how to use it?
- ICS How does it really work, why do we use it, why are there so many forms?
- UTM Why must we know this, is it really this simple?
- Wing Null You mean I can DF effectively with my own airplane?
- Stealth Radio Why didn't anyone tell me this cool stuff before?
- Reporting What are the most common "I found it" reporting errors?
- Panel-mounted GPS That's why I couldn't get it to display my grid?
- Handheld GPS You mean I'm not the only one who didn't know all these tricks?
- Other What little nagging questions do I have that someone here could answer?
