The Coast Guard's 110-foot patrol boats are used for a number of missions, such as enforcement of fisheries laws, and the interdiction of migrants and illicit drugs. As part of the Coast Guard's initial plans to replace many of its vessels, it intended to convert its 110-foot patrol boats into 123-foot patrol boats with increased capabilities until the replacement vessel, the Fast Response Cutter (FRC), became operational. However, structural problems on the eight converted 123-foot boats led the Coast Guard to remove these boats from service. Faced with a loss of operational hours, especially in the Coast Guard's Florida-based District 7 where these boats operated, the Coast Guard implemented mitigation strategies to recover lost operational hours. This report provides information on Coast Guard patrol boat operations and, in particular, addresses: (1) operational challenges created by the removal from service of the 123-foot patrol boats and the Coast Guard's strategies for mitigating their loss; (2)

Abstract Technological advances have led to an increasing convergence of previously separate networks used to

transmit voice and data communications. While the benefits of this convergence are enormous, such interconnectivity also poses significant challenges to our nation's ability to respond to major disruptions.

Two operations centers--managed by the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) National Communications System and National Cyber Security Division--plan for and monitor disruptions on voice and data networks. In September 2007, a DHS expert task force made three recommendations toward establishing an integrated operations center that the department agreed to adopt.

Abstract Since 2002, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)

has distributed almost \$20 billion in funding to enhance

the nation's capabilities to respond to acts of

terrorism or other catastrophic events. In fiscal year 2007, DHS provided approximately \$1.7 billion to states and urban areas through its Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) to prevent, protect against, respond to,

and recover from acts of terrorism or other catastrophic events. As part of the Omnibus Appropriations Act of 2007, GAO was mandated to review the methodology used by DHS to allocate HSGP grants. This report addresses (1) the changes DHS has made to its risk-based methodology used to allocate grant funding from fiscal year 2007 to fiscal year 2008 and (2) whether the fiscal year 2008 methodology is reasonable. To answer these questions, GAO analyzed DHS documents related to its methodology and grant guidance, interviewed DHS officials about the

grant process used in fiscal year 2007 and changes made to the process for fiscal year 2008, and used GAO's risk

Hurricane Katrina, homeland security risks vary widely. The nation can neither achieve total security nor afford to protect everything against all risks. Managing these risks is especially difficult in today's environment of globalization, increasing security interdependence, and growing fiscal challenges for the federal government. Broadly defined, risk management is a process that helps policymakers assess risk, strategically allocate finite resources, and take actions under conditions of uncertainty. GAO convened a forum of 25 national and international experts on October 25, 2007, to advance a national dialogue on applying risk management to homeland security. Participants included federal, state, and local officials and risk management experts from the private sector and academia. Forum participants identified (1) what they considered to be effective risk management practices used by organizations from the private and public sectors and (2) key challenges to applying risk management to homeland security and actions that could be taken to address them. Comments from the proceedings do not necessarily represent the views of all participants, the organizations of the participants, or GAO. Abstract The Coast Guard's Deepwater Program, under the

Department of Homeland Security (DHS), has experienced serious performance and management problems. Deepwater is intended to replace or modernize Coast Guard vessels, aircraft, and the communications and electronic systems that link them together. As of fiscal year 2008, over \$4 billion has been appropriated for Deepwater. The Coast Guard awarded a contract in June 2002 to a lead system integrator, Integrated Coast Guard Systems

system integrator, Integrated Coast Guard Systems (ICGS), to execute the program using a system-of-systems approach. On July 17, 2007, at about 9 a.m., an explosion and fire occurred at the Barton Solvents Wichita facility in Valley Center, Kansas. Eleven residents and one firefighter received medical treatment. The incident triggered an evacuation of Valley Center (approximately 6,000 residents); destroyed the tank farm; and significantly interrupted Barton's business. An investigation by the U.S. Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board (CSB) has concluded that the initial explosion occurred inside a vertical above-ground storage tank that was being filled with Varnish Makers' and Painters' (VM&P) naphtha. VM&P naphtha is a National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Class IB flammable liquid that can produce ignitable vapor-air mixtures inside tanks and, because of its low electrical conductivity, can accumulate dangerous levels of static electricity. The CSB is publishing this Case Study to help companies understand the hazards associated with static-accumulating flammable liquids that can form ignitable vapor-air mixtures inside storage tanks. In addition, the CSB wants to urge companies to take extra precautions to prevent explosions and fires like the one at Barton. This Case Study also examines industry Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) hazard communication practices and makes recommendations to ensure that MSDSs identify these hazards and outline appropriate precautions.

The fire service is always seeking ways to improve its operations. At training classes and seminars, fire service members seek out insight into tactics and discuss new technologies for their applicability to other jurisdictions. Lessons also are learned from each response to an emergency incident. Unfortunately, many of those experiences and lessons are limited to those who were involved directly in responding. Unless feedback on incident response and command is shared with other personnel in the fire department, a valuable learning opportunity can be lost. The fire service has a duty to its members and the community it serves to evaluate problematic incidents, as well as those that go extremely well, and communicate the findings (including the lessons learned), to all relevant emergency personnel. An effective way to accomplish this is through a postincident critique. The critique can be a powerful tool for effecting change. A noted fire service expert observed that, "the post incident critique allows emergency responders to get a clear idea of the effects of their actions on the outcome of the operation. By comparing the expected outcome to the actual consequences, the fire department can make personal as well as organizational adjustments. And by assessing what worked, and what did not, improvements can be made." A critique is a fact-finding exercise and a chance to relate and record pieces of information that collectively form a picture of the event and how personnel responded from both a command (tactical) and line (operational) standpoint. It is a tool to assess firefighting, rescue, and training effectiveness, and should include tactical plans and command decisions accompanied by how well they were followed. Lessons learned from the experience should be used constructively to correct deficiencies and influence training and education. Changes made to the department's plans and procedures typically occur per the outcome of incident critiques. Management must be willing to act upon the lessons learned and correct the

problems as quickly as possible; otherwise, subordinate personnel will think the critique process is a waste of time, and future critiques could suffer accordingly. The term "critique" may carry a negative connotation for some personnel in the fire service. Critiquing an incident may be perceived as a way to assign blame for mistakes that were made. The postincident critique, (or perhaps a less threatening term such as debriefing, after-action review, or postincident analysis (PIA)) should be viewed as a constructive way to obtain helpful feedback and positive suggestions. The process should be considered an important tool for improving firefighter safety and health, as well as a means for ensuring that the public is receiving quality services.

Based on our findings, we are now proposing an alternative training model that combines cognitive and behavior aspects when preparing the FR. Consequently, the third project component - developing a training module based on both engineering (cognitive readiness) and sport psychology (mental skills training) - was added.

The Fire Service is at an important crossroads in its history. The increasing threat of terrorism, along with the need for the Fire Service to make a major contribution to the Homeland Security effort, compels firefighters to expand upon their traditional mission requirements. Schools in the United States are at risk of a terrorist attack and the country is unprepared. The recent history of terrorist attacks illustrates that the methodology and audacity of terrorists is evolving and increasing. Terrorists no longer differentiate between civilians and military personnel, nor do they discriminate amid gender and age. While the thought of deliberately focusing an attack on children might seem unconventional, or even taboo, terrorism and terrorist tactics have fundamentally changed and terrorists are no longer fearful of taking such drastic action. This research indicates that we are unprepared and major improvements need to be made. Until serious and significant changes are made, schools remain vulnerable, unprotected targets of terrorist attacks. Abstract In this paper the benefits from fire protection
