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Sugar

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Report Highlights:

MY 2007 sugar production forecasts have been increased to 6.3 million tons, driven largely by good weather conditions and government-controlled domestic prices set by Thailand's Cane and Sugar Board. Additionally, the Royal Thai Government continues to pursue their ambitious plan to have all premium gasoline in Thailand be replaced by gasohol.

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Executive Summary

MY 2007 sugarcane production is revised upward to 59 million tons in anticipation of yield improvement from favorable weather conditions. Most sugarcane is used for sugar production as cane/molasses-based ethanol plants are still working out trial runs of sugarcane-based ethanol production. Ethanol production will rely on molasses, a by-product of sugar production. According to an ambitious plan by the Royal Thai Government, all premium gasoline will be replaced by gasohol, with ethanol demand expected at around 850,000 million liters/day, by early CY 2007. Currently there are eight ethanol plants, which are primarily producing molasses-based ethanol, that are planning to supply future gasohol demand. The Government set a three-year plan (2007-2010) to increase sugarcane production to over 72 million tons in order to meet increasing demand for cane/molasses-based ethanol.

MY 2007 sugar production is forecast to increase to around 6.3 million tons, following bumper sugarcane crops. Sugar exports are also expected to recover from the previous year due to increased supplies at lower prices, and recovery in import demand from Asian countries.

Since March 2006, the Government's Cane and Sugar Board has kept wholesale domestic sugar prices 1-2 cents/lb. above world prices in an effort to prevent smuggling to border countries. Low world prices of sugar of 15-16 cents/lb. have largely ended incentives for the aforementioned smuggling activities seen in the previous year.

1. Production

1.1 Sugarcane

MY 2007 sugarcane production is revised upward to 59 million tons, up significantly from the previous year, due to favorable weather conditions. Average yields are expected to increase to around 8.8 kg/rai (55 tons/hectare), as compared to 7.5 kg/rai (46.7 tons/hectare). Meanwhile, the flood during the beginning of cultivation has reportedly had only a marginal impact on sugarcane. The damage from flooding in the early stage of cultivation was expected to be limited at around 3,000 rais (480 hectares), out of the total affected areas of around 23,000 rais (3,680 hectares). The present flood in September is unlikely to affect sugarcane production as cane has reportedly grown strongly and flood waters normally recede quickly.

1.2 Sugar

MY 2007 sugar production is forecast to increase to 6.3 million tons, up significantly from the previous year, in anticipation of bumper sugarcane crops. However, the average extraction rate of cane for sugar is revised downward to around 106 kgs./ton of cane, compared to the previous forecast of 108 kgs./ton of cane, due to excessive rain falls. Losses in the decreased extraction rate however, are offset by the significant gains in yield. Meanwhile, supplies of molasses, a by-product of sugar production, are expected to recover to 2.8 million tons. Molasses prices will likely remain high due to increasing demand from molasses-based ethanol manufactures.

2. Consumption

2.1 Sugarcane

Almost all sugarcane will be used for sugar production in MY 2007. Meanwhile, the utilization of sugarcane for ethanol is still limited, as sugarcane production is still far below the optimal levels of 80 million tons. In MY 2006, one sugar miller, who invested in sugarcane/molasses-based ethanol plant, utilized sugarcane of around 22,500 tons for ethanol production in the test running sugarcane-based ethanol production line.

Also, the expansion of sugarcane-based ethanol is considered not to be cost effective as domestic sugarcane supplies are available only 4 months. Therefore, ethanol production will be mainly from molasses over the medium term.

2.2 Sugar

MY 2007 sugar consumption will likely continue the upward trend. Annual per capita consumption of sugar is currently at 21 kilograms, of which 9 kilograms are direct consumption, accounting for about 30 percent of total sugar consumption. Sugar shortages arose in MY 2006 currently ease due to less aggressive sugar smuggling into neighboring countries when world sugar prices currently decline to 15-16 cents/lb which is approximately equal to 12-13 baht/kg. However, local consumers still have to pay high domestic sugar prices, regarding the government approval of an increase in wholesale prices and retail prices of sugar by 3 bath/kg (roughly U.S.\$ 4 cent/lb) on March 7, 2006 in order to bridge the gap between export prices and controlled domestic prices. The current domestic prices for sugar remain at 14.98 baht/kg. (roughly U.S.\$ 17 cents/lb) wholesale, and 16.50 baht/kg. (roughly U.S.\$ 19 cents/lb) retail.

3. Trade

MY 2007 sugar exports are revised upward due to more exportable supplies in anticipation of bumper sugarcane crops. Thai sugar exports to Asian countries are expected to recover as sugar export prices will likely ease. Current export prices of raw sugar shrank to around 12-13 cents/lb (roughly U.S.\$ 264 - 287/MT), compared to record 19 cents/lb (roughly U.S.\$ 419/MT) in February 2006. Meanwhile, Thailand will fulfill MY 2007 U.S. tariff-rate quota (TRQ) of raw sugar of 17,943 metric ton (raw value), up slightly from normal allocation of 14,743 metric tons (raw value), in order to maintain historical shares.

MY 2006 sugar exports are revised downward due to contraction in import demand for raw sugar from major importing countries. This was seen primarily in Indonesia and Russia where domestic production of sugar increased. Also, white and refined sugar exports to Malaysia also declined sharply due to competition from Brazilian sugar. Meanwhile, white and refined sugar exports to Cambodia increased significantly. Also, some sugar has reportedly been smuggled into Vietnam through Cambodia. Thailand currently fulfills raw sugar exports to the U.S. under 2005/06 TRQ, which increased to 25,154 metric tons (raw value), compared to normal TRQ of 14,743 metric tons (raw value).

Sugar imports in MY 2006 and MY 2007 is expected to be marginal due to sufficient available domestic supplies. The government import policy on sugar follows the WTO agreement, which is limited to a 65 percent tariff rate (roughly U.S.\$ 15.95 cents/kg.) under the quota of 13,760 tons. Meanwhile, the out-of-quota tariff is 94 percent (roughly U.S. 23.06 cents/kg.).

4. Stock

MY 2007 sugar stock is forecast to be at low levels in anticipation of recovery in sugar exports.

5. Policy

Despite current weakening world sugar prices, the authorities will likely maintain MY 2007 minimum sugar prices for sugarcane at a record 800 baht/ton (roughly U.S.\$ 21/MT, ex-

factory prices). On March 7, 2006, the government increased wholesale and retail prices of sugar by 3 baht/kg (roughly U.S.\$ 4 cents/lb) to halt the sugar shortages brought on by smuggling in the last quarter of CY 2005. Presently, domestic sugar shortages are no longer a problem as there is no incentive for sugar smuggling into neighboring countries when world sugar prices have eased to 11-12 cents/lb since the beginning of the second half of CY 2006.

The Government's Cane and Sugar Board has recently set a three-year plan (2007-2010) to increase sugarcane production to a minimum 72 million tons in order to have enough cane and molasses supplies for domestic ethanol production. Also, the target is to improve the extraction rate of cane for sugar to 109 kgs./ton of cane. The plan additionally aims to reduce sugar production costs by 10 percent in order to push the sugar market liberalization plan on track.

According to the government policy on ethanol production, the Government has recently approved 15 additional ethanol producers out of 49 applicants with total production capacity of around 5 million liters/day. As a result, there are altogether 33 ethanol producers with total production capacity of around 10 million liters/day. However, only half of the approved ethanol producers are will likely be able to operate the plants with production capacity of around 4 million liters/day. At the moment, there are five ethanol plants producing around 550,000 liters/day, which are sufficient for current gasohol demand of around 3.5 million liters/day. These ethanol plants are classified into three molasses-based ethanol plants with production capacity of 375,000 liters/day, one cane/molasses-based plant (150,000 liters/day), and one tapioca-based plant (7,500 liters/day). By the beginning of CY 2007, all premium gasoline will be replaced by gasohol, and demand for ethanol should increase to 850,000 liters/day. Demand is expected to be fulfilled by three additional ethanol plants with production capacity of 400,000 liters/day. All of them will be from cane/molasses-based ethanol plants.

The military-led Council for Democratic Reform under Constitutional Monarchy (CDRM), who seized control of the Thai government and declared martial law on September 19, 2006, is expected to support current cane and sugar policy in order to secure cane and molasses supplies for ethanol production.
