TABLE/REASONS OF EXCLUDED STUDIES

For the sake of brevity we do not separately list here all the studies which were retrieved but excluded from the present systematic review. Nearly all can be found on the web site for this report, and the interested reader is referred to this source for specific information about excluded articles.

Here we provide the various criteria used for exclusion. As indicated in the main body of the evidence report, many of the articles met more than one exclusion criteria. In no particular order, the specific exclusion criteria we used are listed as follow.

Articles not written in English

Articles published before 1986

Articles not satisfying Agency for Healthcare Research Quality (AHRQ) level II-2; for example, case reports

Articles having less than 30 subjects total

Duplicate articles

Traditional narrative reviews/overviews and practice guidelines

Letters to the Editor/Editorials

Human in situ studies

Animal studies

In vitro studies

Caries status not clearly defined

Salivary status not clearly defined

Lack of appropriate comparison group

Use of pooled saliva samples

Articles or portions of articles whose primary outcome measure was the number of microbes in saliva; for example, bacterial transmission/infection from parent to child

Article whose focus was treatment or prevention; for example, fluoride studies, chlorhexidine studies, dentifrice studies, mouthwash studies, and chewing gum studies

Articles whose focus was immunization/vaccination

Articles whose focus was antibiotic treatment

Articles whose focus was food, diet or nutrition

Articles whose focus was dental materials

Articles whose focus was oral soft tissues

Articles whose focus was computer/mathematical modeling

Articles whose focus was validation or analysis of diagnostic or research model systems

Articles whose focus was synthetic/artificial saliva
