Part of the Reservation is also in California. The reservation consists of 280,000 acres of land. Members of the Mohave, Chemehuevi, Hopi, and Navajo Nations are members of CRIT, consisting of over 8,000 members (1990 census). Agriculture and tourism are the primary industries on the reservation. Program Activities

- Integrated components for and saw passage of new traffic safety code and worked with law enforcement to stress importance of strict ordinance enforcement.
- Distributed 400+ child safety seats and conducted check points.
- Installed 80+ smoke detectors in homes.
- Distributed 120+ bicycle helmets at bicycle rodeo events.
- Fostered collaboration with other programs, particularly the police and La Paz county health departments.
- Worked with La Paz County to establish a clearer 911 numbering system.
- Developed and coordinated a local Injury Prevention Advisory Coalition.
- Held a Level I Injury Prevention course in Parker, AZ and hosted the IHS IP Fellowship Field Course.
