August 7 Meeting

The August 7 meeting had a "Planets" theme. We had two visitors, Marjorie Lamb and Benny Hooda, both of whom expect to join the club. We LOVE new members! Welcome, Benny and Marjorie. Benny has experience in another club and is well along on his CTM.

Ronnie was Toastmaster of the Day, and she offered us information at various points in the meeting about the names and nature of the planets in our solar system. She asked Nancy to present Table Topics. Nancy's questions probed our knowledge of the planets. Not all of us were very knowledgable, but we all responded gamely to Nancy's interesting questions.

Both of the evening's speakers (Amy and Kim) were embarking on their first speeches in advanced manuals, having recently completed the CTM. From the Speaking to Inform Manual, Amy presented "Crate Art, That Great Art." She has a collection of the wooden ends of old fruit crates, bearing interesting, old-fashioned labels. She showed examples of the various themes that typically appear in this crate art: children, American Indians, birds, animals and landscapes. Unfortunately, fruit is shipped with more generic labels now, but there are clubs and websites for people who collect crate art. Amy invited members to stop by her home to see the whole collection.

Kim's speech, from the Speaking to Entertain manual, was entitled "Experience with Extreme Freefall in Six Flags." She had visited the park with her father recently. She described the apparatus and equipment that are used in this ultimate thrill ride. The jumper dons a body harness attached to a frame that helps to keep the body horizontal. A huge structure supports the

platform to which the jumper is hoisted and from which he or she dives. Kim's great body language gave us a very good idea of the feeling of plunging off the platform in free fall, before being caught by the elastic cord. She said that diving was scary but extremely exhilarating too. She conquered her fear and was rewarded by the thrill of the experience. She urged us all to face our fears and reap the rewards. We should all be as fearless and spirited as Kim!

Beth Lin was general evaluator. Margaret evaluated for Amy and Beth evaluated for Kim. The meeting was briskly run, but without any rushing. Nancy announced a tie for Table Topics. Margaret C. gave the Ah counter's report. Beth gave the podium back to Nancy, who closed the meeting.
