<u>EDITORIAL NOTE</u>: This occupational history module was designed to be used in a CATI interview. Thus when questions C7-C20 are completed for a particular job, there may be additional questions that are triggered by the answers to C7 and C9 and specific to that industry and occupation. There are 63 modules associated with this section. The job titles are listed at the end of that section. We have included the modules for a chemical industry worker and for a gardener as representative examples. The others are available from Dr. Dosemeci.
