(E)-2-[[6-(2-Cyanophenoxy)-4-pyrimidinyl]oxy]-α-(methoxymethylene)-benzeneacetic acid, methyl ester (pyroxystrobin) (also known as "Azoxystrobin Technical") is a synthetic organic chemical based on naturally occurring fungicides called strobilurins. It is used in formulations of fungicides that control plant pathogens from all major fungal groups. It has both protectant and systemic properties, allowing greater flexibility of use than many other fungicides. It has a low ecological risk to non-target organisms such as birds, mammals and fish. This product is formulated into fungicides in Yuma, Arizona. The proponent imports this product from the United Kingdom.
