## 3 Pronged Approach to Reduce Emissions

# 1. Good Equipment

- promote low emissions models including EPA-certified
- safe, professional installations

### 2. Good Fuel

- well seasoned, clean, dry wood,
- no garbage burning

## 3. Smart Consumer & User

- public education workshops (Burn it Smart!)
- public displays



## **Good Equipment**

- Mainly focused on wood stoves but suggesting alternatives to wood
- Promotion of EPA-certified models over noncertified models
- Working closely with HPBAC with "Burn It Smart" campaign providing workshops and input to materials
- More discussions with other Big Box stores to be planned





#### **Good Fuel**

- "Good Firewood" and "Don't Burn Garbage" fact sheets completed
- Videos on Firewood
- Issues to be addressed:
  - Sustainability & forest certification
  - Legal firewood measurements
  - Proper seasoning/drying
  - Movement of firewood in pest-infested areas
  - Use of clean wood, no garbage
  - Burning garbage produces large amounts of highly toxic emissions ("poison")







#### Smart Consumer & User

- Burn it Smart public education workshops.
- New fact sheet on wood burning in the city focusing on fireplaces
- Displays at public events and tradeshows
- Presentations to professional forums, OHBA
- Development of a brochure for First Nations on wood burning





#### Ontario Results 2004-05

- 7 workshops done in First Nation communities, including WETT training
- 22 workshops completed in rural areas in Ontario and two communities in the United States which were well received.
- 2 Mock-up Stoves of EPA design built for shows and displays
- Videos on Woodstove Operation and Firewood handling, storage and purchase available soon.







#### Ontario Results 2004-05 cont'd

- Survey on impact of Change-out programs.
   Preliminary results show that over half of
   those surveyed had improved their wood
   burning practices and 34% have updated
   their appliance. More stats available once
   report is completed.
- Attended numerous public events with more planned in the summer/fall.

#### Generated Interest

- Municipalities considering by-laws requiring EPA stove in new installations.
- Insurance companies endorsing WETT
- Aboriginal WETT training increasing
- Demand for WETT courses is up
- Attendance at major shows attracting at lot of public interest.







#### EC-OR Plans for 2005-06

- Burn it Smart free public workshops workshops across Ontario being considered
- Burn it Smart "Train the Presenter" workshop to increase "good" wood energy speakers – will look at
- Develop program to have retailers incorporate Burn It
   Smart into their stores proposal being discussed
- Develop a distribution plan for materials made this year such as Good Firewood fact sheet, Wood burning in the City fact sheet, Don't Burn Garbage fact sheet, and videos
  - working with municipalities and other non-government groups to promote the material and their events.


