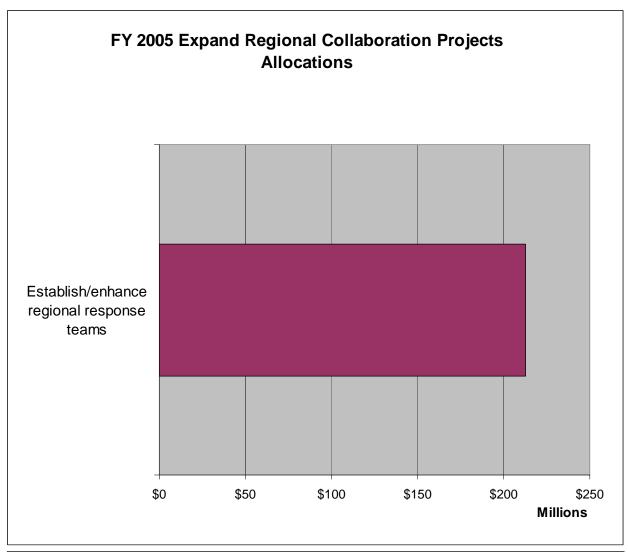
Expanded Regional Collaboration: DHS Funded Activities Total Allocation Summary by state for Fiscal Years 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007.

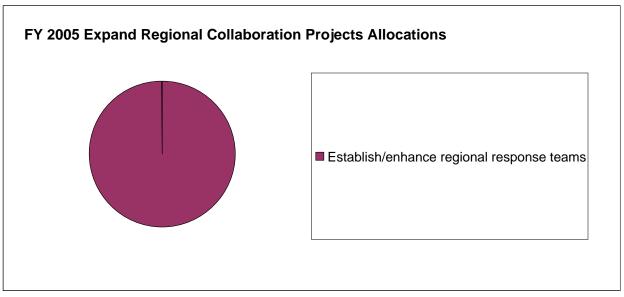


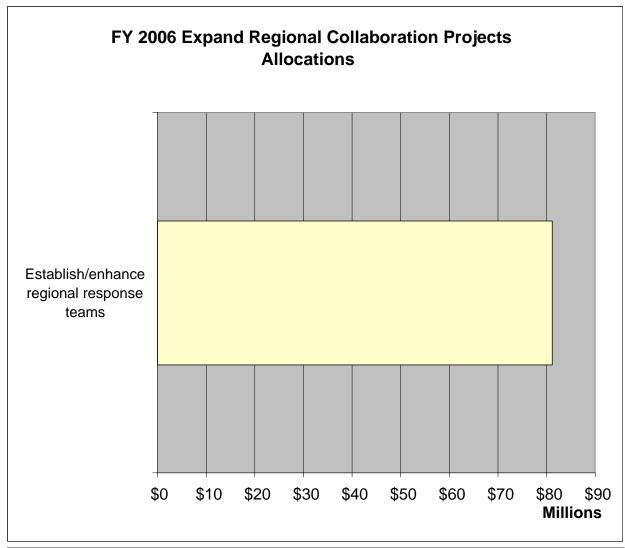


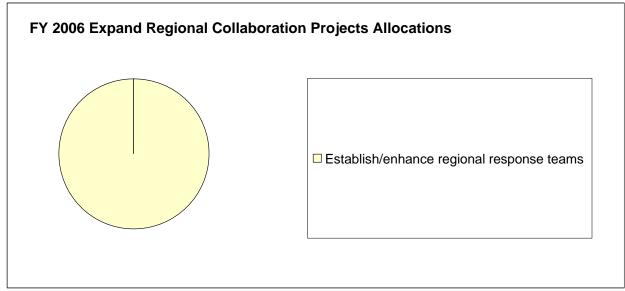


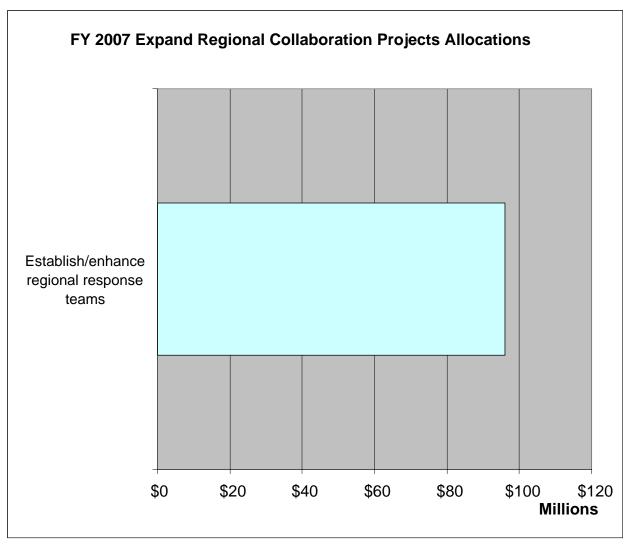


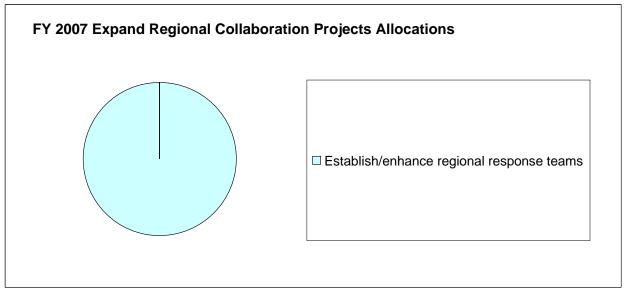


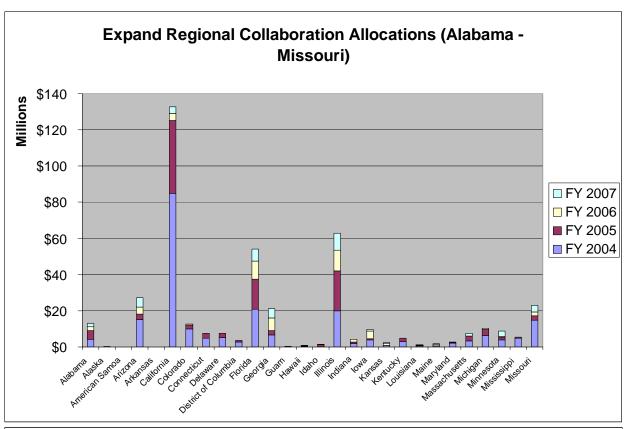


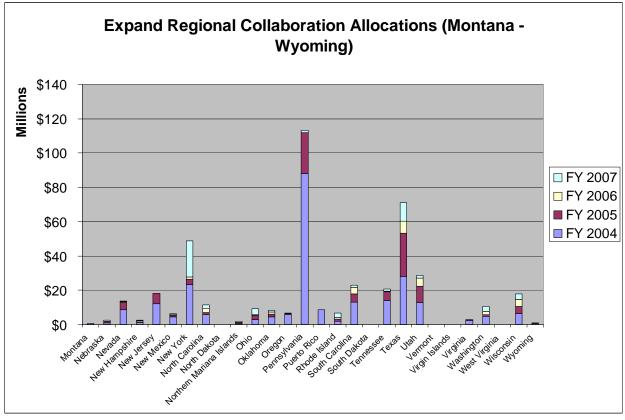
