Eugene O'Neill: Three Plays

Three major works are presented in this volume: Desire Under the Elms, Strange Interlude, and Mourning Becomes Electra. Desire Under the Elms, where O'Neill first revealed his full maturity and addressed the eternal tragic problems of man. In Strange Interlude, O'Neill explores the use of "asides," a technique for probing unexpressed and inexpressible thoughts and feelings of his characters. Mourning Becomes Electra is a trilogy of plays: Homecoming, The Hunted, and The Haunted, set at the end of the civil war. It parallels the structure of Aeschylus' Oresteia.
