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Thailand Grain and Feed Weekly Rice Price Update 2007

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Report Highlights:

Export prices continued to increase due to the strengthening Thai baht. However, new enquiries for white rice are still coming from Iran and Iraq, and also for fragrant broken rice from African countries.

Market Tone

Export prices for most grades of rice were offered higher around \$3-5/MT due to continued strengthening of the Thai baht to 33.17 baht/\$U.S., as compared to an average of around 33.27 in the previous week. However, some quotations are based on 33 baht/\$U.S. in order to cover the risk of exchange rate losses. Foreign buyers of white rice are still quiet due to current high export prices and tight vessel schedule, except from Iran and Iraq which are reportedly securing rice supplies for domestic consumption. New enquiries from Iran are expected at around 400,000 tons for August – September delivery, half of which will likely be the Government-to-Government deals. Thai rice exports to Iran are expected to reach over one million ton this year. Also, Iraq are reportedly arranging around six vessels for the shipments of around 100,000 tons of 5% grade white rice from Thailand. In addition, African buyers, particularly from Senegal and Cote d'Ivoire, are still buying Thai fragrant broken rice regularly.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. The authority to report fragrant rice exports was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.

Unofficial exports (excluding fragrant rice) for Jul. 9-15, 2007 totaled 110,982 tons, up 19,139 tons from the previous week's total, and up 10,110 tons from the four-week moving average of 100,872 tons. Export during Jan. 1 – Jul 15, 2007 totaled 2,804,155 tons, as compared with 2,612,852 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during Jan. 1 - Jul. 3, 2007, amounted to 4,078,906 tons, up 9.2 percent from 3,734,735 tons in the previous year.
