## Fisheries Service Announces Public Hearings

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has scheduled community hearings to get public input on proposals to designate critical habitat for salmon and steelhead protected under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and on a proposal to change the status of Umpqua River cutthroat trout.

Critical habitat are those areas where special management can correct problems and help restore conditions that bring back the species. Coho and steelhead mature in the ocean and need healthy streams and rivers to spawn and grow up in. Ocean conditions vary up and down based on climate while estuarine and freshwater conditions are greatly influenced by a whole suite of development activities.

Critical habitat is proposed for Oregon coast coho, and Upper Willamette, Snake River, Upper Columbia, Middle Columbia, Lower Columbia, Central Valley California, Central California Coast, South-Central California Coast, and Southern California steelhead. Because these same areas are also important to chinook, chum, and sockeye salmon, and cutthroat trout, critical habitat designation will benefit these species too. Based on new scientific information, NMFS is also proposing that Umpqua River cutthroat change from endangered to candidate status. NMFS is soliciting specific information, comments, data, and/or recommendations on any aspect of these proposals. There will be opportunities to give oral and written testimony at the public hearings. Those unable to attend are encouraged to send comments to the address below. The agency will consider all information, comments, and recommendations received before it reaches final decisions on these proposals.

Comments on the steelhead critical habitat proposal are due by July 5, and on coho critical habitat by July 9. Comments on the coastal cutthroat trout de-listing are due by July 6.
