THIS ANNUAL REPORT CONTAINS DATA THAT COVER MORE THAN SEVEN-POINT-SIX MILLION BUSINESSES WITH PAID EMPLOYEES AT THE NATIONAL, STATE AND COUNTY LEVELS.
