## Northern Shrike, Rapacious Songbird of the Arctic by Mark D. Ross, 2006 Artist in Residence

The ornithological term "raptor " refers to diurnal birds of prey such as hawks, eagles and kin: those with strong feet tipped with needle sharp spike-like talons. The shrike, though rapacious in nature, is classified as a songbird. It's feet are more suited for perching than predation.

The **Northern Shrike's** scientific name, *Lanius exubitor* translates to "butcher sentinel". Lethal blows are delivered, not with taloned feet (it's feet are not strong like those of hawks) but with a "toothed" simitar beak. Prey is subdued by hacking and ripping at the base of the skull and neck. Then flying off to a perch the shrike drapes the food in a forked branch of a tree or shrub. In more southern climes the butcher impales the meat on thorny projections.

Shrikes, classified as songbirds, do their deadly business with beaks rather than feet.
