MacDONALD: First speaker, Douglas 5 6 7 Denni nger. MR. DENNINGER: My name is Douglas Denninger, D E N N I N G E R. I live at 225 Erin 8 9 Road, E R I N Road, East Taunton, Massachusetts. I'm a sailor, a scuba diver. I've a Bachelor in Zoology from the University of New Hampshire, and 10 11 12 I'm a member of the Ocean Conservancy. I am most concerned about the ecosystem 13 14 alteration and habitat protection and especially the harvesting of orange species such as sandlances. S I encourage everything that can be done to ban the harvesting of those species that are the base for 15 16 17 the whales and the other creatures on, the marine 18 19 mammals and fish on the sanctuary area, and also the 20 habitat destruction and degradation that affects all Thank you. MR. MacDONALD: 21 the species. 22 Thank you very much. 23 Next speaker is Brad Stevens. 0003 MR. STEVENS: Brad Stevens. I'm an 1 2 3 associate professor of marine science here at U Mass Dartmouth. I have documents that I will send you by email, but I wanted to address a couple of items in 4 5 6 7 the plan that I think are good. And I just want to re-enforce them. And these are Items E A 2.1 which 8 refers to establishing reference areas of õ undisturbed sea floor, and these would be used for comparing recovery efforts from impacts of fishing. 10 11 I think this is an excellent idea. The only way you 12 can do those kind of studies, you need controlled 13 areas, and hopefully that you can also form a basis for some protected areas from commercial fishing as 14

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15 well. 16 Item MH 312 would be to establish heritage preservers, similar idea established areas 17 around cultural heritage sites that are open to 18 19 destructive human activities. I think this is very important and very critical. 20 21 Also under Breen heritage, Item 3.3, establishing partnerships, you don't mention it 22 there but I think it's very critical to establish 23 0004 1 partnerships with diving organizations and diving --2 3 dive shops because protection of archeological resources is everybody's issue. And you can't enforce it. You have to get all the divers involved to buy into the idea that it's their resources that they should be protecting. It's the only way to 4 5 6 7 prevent divers from removing things from the reefs 8 and from the shipwrecks. 9 And finally MH 3.5 establishing mooring 10 buoys at those sites is an excellent idea to keep 11 the dive boats from dropping anchors on the sites 12 and tangling and creating more problems. I will send you some written comments, but those are the ones I wanted to point out 13 14 15 tonight. 16 MR. MacDONALD: Thank you very much. 17 These two folks are the only ones that signed up. 18 Anybody else who wants to give some comments? 19 Thank you very much. All right.
