- 5. Title, language and number of pages of the notified document: Interim Marketing Authorization regarding the use of potassium aluminum sulphate as a firming agent in roe of sea urchins (available in English and French; page 2104).
- 6. Description of content: Provision currently exists in the *Food and Drug Regulations* for the use of potassium aluminum sulphate as a firming agent, carrier, pH-adjusting agent, acid reacting material or water correcting agent in a wide variety of food products. Health Canada has received a submission to permit the use of potassium aluminum sulphate as a firming agent in roe of sea urchins at a maximum level of use of 350 parts per million (p.p.m.) calculated as aluminum. Evaluation of available data supports the safety and effectiveness of this new use of potassium aluminum sulphate.

Therefore, it is the intention of Health Canada to recommend that the *Food and Drug Regulations* be amended to permit the optional use of potassium aluminum sulphate as a firming agent in roe of sea urchins at levels up to 350 parts per million (p.p.m.) calculated as aluminum.

As a means to improve the responsiveness of the regulatory system, an Interim Marketing Authorization (IMA) is being issued to permit the immediate use of potassium aluminum sulphate, as indicated above, while the regulatory process is undertaken to formally amend the Regulations. A revision to this notification will be published at the start of the amendment process and Members will be given the opportunity at that time to submit comments on this proposed measure.
