# Pork Imports from the U.S. Exceed 2002 Safeguard 2002

> Report Highlights: On August 12, 2002, Mexico announced that the quantity of select pork products (HS0210.12.01) imported from the United States had exceeded the safeguard quota agreed to under NAFTA. As a result, beginning August 12, 2002, the tariff increased to 10 percent from the in-quota rate of 2 percent. The higher rate will remain in effect through December 31, 2002.

The Secretariat of Economy (SE) announced on August 12, 2002, in the "*Diario Oficial*" (Federal Register) that imports of the following product have exceeded Mexico's safeguard quota for 2002 under NAFTA. As of August 12, imports from the United States above the quota for the following product will be subject to a 10 percent ad valorem tariff.
