Exploring Environmental Careers By Sarah Walker (RPCV Lesotho, 1994-96), Winrock International

ithin the past decades, environmental issues and environmental measures have moved from the sidelines of special interests, to garnishing global attention and action. Large technological and scientific advancements have been made, broadening our understanding of our environmental impacts and increasing the tools available to minimize negative effects.Additionally, climate change and environmental degradation are being directly felt by peoples worldwide.

RECENT ADVANCES

With this improved knowledge base and enhanced public awareness, non-traditional sectors have realized the critical role they play in the environmental sector. Local, national, and international governing bodies, the private sector, and nongovernmental organizations have all become active participants in shaping environmental regulations and response. United Nations conventions on air pollution, ozone layer, climate change, biodiversity, and desertification are steps toward worldwide cooperative efforts. Issues such as habitat loss, biodiversity, land cover change, deforestation, desertification. land degradation, chemical and toxic waste

pollution, climate change, fishery depletion, water quality and guantity, and waste management plague our environment. This vast array of environmental issues also has an associated human component, such as food and water security, indigenous rights, health, livelihood preservation, and social discrimination.

PCV ENVIRONMENTALISM

Through their international experiences, PCVs had the opportunity to observe how environmental issues affect local peoples. This exposure led many PCVs to pursue a greater awareness and understanding of the environmental issues seen. often resulting in incorporating an environmental aspect to their primary or secondary projects. These opportunities were not always limited to agroenvironmental projects such as environmental education and awareness, forestry, protectedareas management, agriculture and forestry extension, or applied agricultural science but often began in a disparate field. As projects progressed, PCVs realized the necessity of environmental incorporation. Therefore, it is not unusual to have seen IT projects that enabled resourcepoor communities to use information and communications technology for charting their own environmental development;

business projects wherein PCVs worked with individuals and communities to promote sustainable enviro-based income generating opportunities; education, youth outreach, and community development projects that targeted environmental awareness and health; and public health projects that organized and mobilized communities to improve potablewater storage facilities and heighten awareness of water and sanitation issues.
