The Office of Domestic Pro grams, Returned Volunteer Services (RVS), in conjunction with the Career Center in Rosslyn, VA, coordinated a total of five RPCV career events in May. RVS sponsored and hosted events on Wednesday, May 24 and Thursday, May 25, while Chemonics International invited pre-registered RPCVs to attend an information session at their site on Friday, May 26.

On Wednesday, staff from Peace Corps' recently established Office of HIV/AIDS welcomed and facilitated panel dialogue between a group of expert panelists from Africare, USAID, ORC/Macro, Chemonics, and the Peace Corps' Office of Medical Services. Audience members were able to personally engage panelists and learn about a diversity of work opportunities centered on the fight against the HIV/AIDS pandemic. Panelists consistently stressed the importance of gaining work experience in preparation for entry-level positions and advanced degree programs. Dr. Paul Jung, Peace Corps' Chief of Epidemiology and Surveillance, remarked that an accomplishments-driven résumé holds more value than both a near perfect grade point average and a

prestigious university alma mater. Before entering a graduate program in public health, he noted, the candidate should seek and secure related jobs and internships. The work experience helps solidify interest in a demanding industry and strengthen the quality of admissions materials. A career fair followed the panel discussion featuring organizations specializing in public health.

Day two began with an expert panel of RPCVs active in the agriculture and environment field and also ended with an industryfocused job fair. Panelist Tim Resch, RPCV Morocco '70-'74 and Bureau Environmental Advisor for the USAID Bureau for Africa, offered a 3-dimensional approach to conceptualizing the agriculture and environment industry. In exploring related jobs, he advises that candidates should consider: location of interest (i.e. region or country); type of institution (i.e. federal or state government, large non-profit, consulting agency, and communitybased organization); and primary occupation or job function (i.e. natural resource management, environmental policy/advocacy, and community education). As a hobby, Tim maintains a website called the Electronic Job Seekers Guide to International Environmental Careers (<u>http://ejobs.</u> home.att.net/).

Kate Raftery, RPCV Paraguay and Peace Corps Chief of Operations for the Inter-America Pacific Region, presented opening remarks on Thursday. Her opening remarks reflected her many Peace Corps experiences as well as her work with a wide variety of management professionals. Kate's presentation was consistent with the panelist's heed for job-seekers to market the unique qualifications RPCVs bring to the workforce:

- Practical, hands-on experience in the industry;
- Demonstrated dedication, resourcefulness, and creativity;
- Challenges and successes beyond those most common in related domestic work;
- Familiarity with budding approaches used by development organizations and local leaders;
- Fine-tuned ability to meet and deal effectively with people of widely varying backgrounds and work responsibilities;
