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## RSC FORMS TASKFORCE TO MONITOR NEW HOMELAND SECURITY DEPARTMENT

Republican Study Committee's Security First Taskforce will ensure new department is consistent with President's vision

WASHINGTON, DC – The Republican Study Committee today announced the formation of the Security First Taskforce to monitor the creation of the Department of Homeland Security. The Taskforce will seek to ensure the new department remains true to President Bush's vision of improved homeland security without creating a bloated new bureaucracy.

As the President's proposal makes its way through the legislative process in the House and Senate, the Security First Taskforce will analyze whether each committee's recommendation remains true to the President's vision.

The criteria for the Taskforce's evaluation system are as follows:

- 1) Does the recommendation actually strengthen homeland security, as the President proposed?
- 2) Does the recommendation hold the line on the federal budget and the size of the bureaucracy, as the President proposed?
- 3) Does the recommendation include adequate protections for civil liberties, as the President proposed?
- 4) Does the recommendation include reasonable measures to ensure accountability and flexibility, as the President proposed?
