Report Highlights: Cool and rainy weather in August and September is expected to reduce Korea's rice harvest prospects to 4.7 million metric tons; more than 200,000 tons less than the 2002 crop. Delivery of the 400,000-ton rice aid package for North Korea is expected to be completed by early December 2003. MY 2003/04 ending stocks, in turn, are expected to decline to 800,000 tons.

Production:

Cool and rainy conditions during August and September have prompted a reduction in the forecast of rice yields for Korea's 2003 crop. Reduced yield prospects are expected to result in a crop of 4.7 million metric tons (MMT). The estimated yield for the 2003 crop of 4.7 MT/ha (on a milled basis) would be 4 percent less than the five-year-average yield of 4.9 MT/ha. The revised yield forecast is similar to yields for the 2002 crop which were impacted by heavy rains and the effects of typhoon Rusa which struck Korea in late-August of 2002.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) has marginally increased the estimate of harvested area to 1.016 million hectares. Despite the slight increase, harvested area in 2003 is still expected to be nearly 4 percent less than 2002.

Rice Aid For North Korea:

According to the Ministry of Unification (MU), South Korea shipped 143,000 MT of local rice to North Korea from July 3 to September 3 under the 400,000-ton rice aid package. Despite the difficulty of loading and shipping the rice during wet weather, completion of the first 100,000 MT tranche and substantial progress toward completion of the second tranche indicates that the remainder of the 400,000 MT is likely to be shipped by early December 2003. Previous estimates included the first tranche. Accordingly, the estimate for MY 2002/03 exports has been increased 200,000 MT to 574,000 MT and the estimate for MY 2003/04 has been increased to 100,000 MT.
