

Charles Baad, baritone, originally from Sacramento, CA has made Manhattan his home for the last four years. Last year he debuted with Anchorage Opera in Der fliegende Holländer and teamed with Anchorage's own Kate Egan in Sweet Betsy from Pike for the Opera Guild. Charles graduated from The

Boston Conservatory and went on to develop a regional career in New England performing with such companies as Opera UnMet, OperaFest New Hampshire, Cambridge City Opera, Boston Academy of Music, Opera North, Fiddlehead Theatre and the Historical Musical Theatre Co., as well as with Sarasota Opera, Virginia Opera, Sacramento Opera and Dayton Opera.



Thomas Getty, pianist, joined the Anchorage Opera staff in 2004 as Music Administrator and Chorus Master after three years as principal coach at Utah Opera (now Utah Symphony and Opera). He is currently on the music staff of Central City Opera in Colorado as pianist, coach, accompanist and supertitle coordinator, and has also been a staff coach

for Pittsburgh Opera Center, Rutgers University, and a staff pianist for the American Repertory Ballet Company. For many years he was also a singer and actor in "Opera Works," and educational program sponsored by Young Audiences of New Jersey



Rebecca Skaar, soprano, currently resides in Chicago. She received a Masters Degree from Northwestern University, where she portrayed Susanna in Le Nozze di Figaro and Beth in Little Women. Ms. Skaar spent the summer of 2003 performing in scenes from *Rigoletto* and Don Giovanni. In the summer of 2004, she was a resident artist at Pine Mountain Music

Festival, where she performed as Norina in Don Pasquale. Her undergraduate degree was from Luther College, where she sang Papagena in The Magic Flute and Fiordiligi in Cosi fan tutte.


