Gulf of Mexico Marine Debris Project Update

On February 22, 2008 NOAA's Office of Coast Survey (OCS) and Office of Response and Restoration (ORR) met in Baton Rouge with the US Coast Guard, FEMA, and State of Louisiana representatives to present NOAA's plans for offshore survey and information management under the Second Supplemental. This supplemental funding from Congress allows NOAA to survey offshore areas in Louisiana, known to have marine debris deposited by hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and to provide survey data to debris removal operations and the public. OCS will survey nearly 1,000 square nautical miles of offshore areas identified by the state as high priority, and will have a dedicated survey personnel working with the removal vessels to help identify target and provide removal verification. ORR will provide a team member in the USCG command post to facilitate project execution and enhance communication, and will post maps and survey data on the project's website. The plan calls for the USCG-managed removal operation to follow the survey closely. Preparations for the offshore survey and removal are under way, with surveys scheduled to begin on March 2008.

Derelict Fishing Net Recycling in Washington

On February 12th, the NOAA Marine Debris Program (MDP) visited the <u>Skagit River</u> <u>Steel and Recycling Company</u> near Burlington, WA, to learn about their derelict gear recycling efforts. This company is one of a handful in the US that recycles fishing nets. Lois Young, manager of the recycling division, stated that in the past recycling efforts included cutting fishing nets into smaller pieces and sending them overseas for smallscale fishing operations, as well as sending nets via rail to Chicago for recycling. Currently fishing nets are collected, bailed, and then sent overseas for recycling into plastic products such as packaging, plastic seats, and a variety of other plastic products. Clean nets are accepted at no charge, and dirty nets – those containing lead lines or excess organic material – are usually accepted, but are charged for the labor to clean them.

The facility is currently recycling approximately 200 tons of nets per year, but the capacity exists to increase it to a yearly total of 1,000 tons. Skagit River Steel and Recycling Company has accepted a large shipment of nets from derelict fishing gear cleanup operations in Alaska, and is encouraging similar operations to explore recycling option by this company or others before sending the nets to a landfill.



Marine Debris Research Cruise Under Way from Hawaii

A 17-day cruise on the NOAA ship OSCAR ELTON SETTE is under way to test a number of technologies to detect and possibly remove marine debris from the North Pacific Subtropical Convergence Zone. The cruise is being led by the <u>Coral Reef Ecosystem Division of the NOAA</u> <u>Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center</u>, with support from the <u>Papahanaumokuakea Marine</u> <u>National Monument</u>. Personnel from the NOAA Marine Debris Program and <u>Airborne</u> <u>Technologies, Inc.</u>, a company based in Alaska, round out the marine debris scientific crew.

Debris will be spotted using powerful binoculars and from an unmanned aerial system (*Malolo I*) that can stream video camera back to the ship. The scientists will attempt to attach tracking buoys to large bundles of debris, mainly derelict fishing gear. Smaller pieces of debris will be brought on board the ship and transported back to Oahu.




