Abstract In this paper the benefits from fire protection

services provided by several jurisdictions in the Washington Metropolitan Area are allocated to

jurisdictions and distributed within jurisdictions to

eight separate income classes. Benefits to

non-residents in the metropolitan area are taken into consideration. These benefits are used to compute net flows of fire protection benefits between the District of Columbia and both the Maryland and Virginia suburban jurisdictions. Two alternative assumptions are used concerning the proportion of benefits accruing to people as opposed to property. The first assumes that 90% of

benefits from fire protection services accrue to

property and 10% accrue to people. The second assumes

that 50% of benefits accrue to each. These two different proportions are used to obtain some index of sensitivity of the expenditure benefit estimates to the

assumption regarding the distribution of total benefits to people and property. The study concludes that

suburbanites under all different assumptions considered have a considerable net gain from D.C. through fire protection services. Estimated net flows of benefits

are given.

Given that the current world population is more than three times as large as that of 1918, an influenza pandemic, regardless of its severity, could result in millions of deaths. Morbidity rates during past pandemics reached 25 - 35 percent of the total population. A similar morbidity rate in a future influenza pandemic could result in millions of Americans seeking medical care. Such a pandemic could quickly overwhelm U.S. hospitals and emergency departments. assist communities planning for a pandemic, the Federal Government has developed a Pandemic Severity Index. The Index uses 5 categories of increasing severity (Category 1 to Category 5) to characterize a pandemic. The categories are primarily determined by case fatality ratio, i.e., the rate of death among persons who already have a particular disease. Communities will have different combinations of responses and interventions depending on the severity of a pandemic. Every sector of the U.S. health care system must be prepared for the

challenge of increased demand for services in the face potentially scarce resources and possible disruptions in infrastructure. Preparedness will mean different things for different sectors. Hospitals, clinics, emergency medical services, private practice, longterm care institutions, hospices, and home health care agencies, for example, all will have distinct challenges. Federal Government agencies have been working together to help ensure that each health care sector has information necessary to that specific sector on how to prepare for and respond to a pandemic. This report serves as a discussion piece for home health care agencies and others to consider; this is not a Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) guidance. The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), with funding by the HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) and in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), convened an expert panel meeting on July 12-13, 2007, in Washington, DC. The meeting brought together governmental and nongovernmental experts in the fields of home health care and emergency and disaster planning. During the meeting, the expert panel reviewed the work currently being done in home health care planning and preparedness and explored the key issues and challenges of providing home health care services during an influenza pandemic. This report had its genesis in the rich discussion among these experts. It is hoped that the information and resources here will be of value not only to home health care agencies, but also to State and local pandemic influenza planners.

The Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) is an agreement among member states to provide assistance after disasters overwhelm a state's capacity to manage consequences. The compact, initiated by the states and coordinated by the National Emergency Management Association, provides a structure for requesting emergency assistance from party states. In 1996 Congress approved EMAC as an interstate compact (P.L. 104-321). EMAC also resolves some, but not all, potential legal and administrative obstacles that may hinder such assistance at the state level. EMAC also enhances state preparedness for terrorist attacks by ensuring the availability of resources for fast response and facilitating multi-state cooperation in training activities and preparedness exercises. In June of 2008, a bill to reform mutual aid agreements for the National Capital Region (P.L. 110-250) was enacted to expand the types of organizations and agencies in the region that are authorized to enter into agreements and ease the requirements for agents and volunteers to respond to an incident. Legislation in the 110th Congress (S. 1452) would require EMAC to ensure that licensed mental health professionals with expertise in treating vulnerable populations are included in the leadership of the National Disaster Medical System and are available for deployment with Disaster Medical Assistance Teams. In 2005, as a result of Hurricane Katrina, more than 1,600 people lost their lives and more than a million were driven from their homes on the Gulf Coast. Tens of thousands of homes in New Orleans were flooded, many requiring either demolition or gutting before reconstruction. Nearly 3 years later, the New Orleans area still faces significant debris management issues and challenges. For example, the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) stated that while the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) estimated in July 2008 that it had funded about 16,900 home demolitions, an estimated 6,100 homes remained to be demolished around the New Orleans area. The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Stafford Act) establishes programs and processes for the federal government to provide major disaster and emergency assistance to states, local governments, tribal nations, and others. FEMA has the responsibility for administering the provisions of the Stafford Act, including approving and funding the assistance provided under it. This assistance has been provided to the Gulf Coast under the Department of Homeland Security's National Response Framework (formerly called the National Response Plan). In New Orleans, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps of Engineers) was the primary federal agency responsible for providing debris removal and disposal until it concluded its response activities in September 2007. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the coordinator of federal emergency support for oil and hazardous materials releases, also assisted the Corps of Engineers and LDEQ with debris removal and disposal and continues to undertake Katrina response activities, such as monitoring landfill operations. The federal law addressing the management of hazardous and other solid wastes -- the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act--addresses nonhazardous solid wastes under subtitle D. The act prohibits "open dumping" -- the disposal of solid waste in landfills failing to meet the relevant criteria -- and requires state plans to prohibit the establishment of open dumps. RCRA provides EPA with limited authority to address environmental problems at solid waste landfills. On June 4, 2007, a 53-year-old male career Engineer participated in physical fitness training as part of the Fire Department's physical fitness program. During the fitness period, his engine company was dispatched to three calls. After the third call, and after completing the fitness training, the crew drove to a restaurant for lunch. While ordering food the Engineer gave his money to a crew member and walked outside to call his wife. As he walked outside, he collapsed. A customer entered the restaurant and alerted the fire fighters that "someone was down on the sidewalk." The crew members found the Engineer unresponsive, with no pulse, and with agonal breathing (1343 hours). Dispatch was notified, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and advanced life support were begun, an ambulance responded, and the Engineer was transported to the local hospital's Emergency Department. Inside the Emergency Department, advanced life support treatment continued with no improvement in the Engineer's condition. The attending physician pronounced the Engineer dead at 1427 hours and resuscitation efforts were discontinued. The death certificate and autopsy (completed by the Medical Examiner) listed "coronary artery heart disease" as the cause of death. The NIOSH investigator concluded that the physical stress of responding to three alarms and participating in vigorous exercise, coupled with the Engineer's underlying coronary artery disease, triggered his sudden cardiac death. The NIOSH investigator offers the following recommendation to prevent similar incidents. (1) Ensure annual medical evaluations that

include electrocardiograms (EKGs) and exercise stress tests are performed for fire fighters at risk for coronary artery disease. The following recommendation is made to enhance safety and health. It did not contribute to the Engineer's death. (2) Eliminate or reduce the frequency of periodic chest x-rays in

asymptomatic fire fighters, unless clinically indicated.

To prepare the nation for potential catastrophic events, including terrorist attacks, the White House's Homeland Security Council has developed fifteen planning scenarios for use by Federal, State, and local homeland security officials in order to help them prepare for, respond to and effectively recover from these potential incidents. National Planning Scenario #11, developed under this inter-agency process, envisions the detonation of a Radiological Dispersal Device (RDD) or "dirty bomb" in a major downtown urban area. That scenario was just played out in a national counterterrorism exercise called TOPOFF, mandated by Congress and conducted every two years. This year, TOPOFF IV (T4) took place from October 14-24, 2007. the exercise, involving thousands of federal, state and local officials and sponsored by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), terrorists detonated an RDD in Guam, Portland, Oregon and Phoenix, Arizona. The exercise tested the handling and flow of operational and time critical intelligence between agencies and the existing procedures and policies for domestic incident management of a major radiological event. One of the key assumptions in National Planning Scenario #11 is that all potentially exposed individuals (an estimated 100,000 people, including 20,000 victims with detectible contamination) will be tested for radiological exposure and/or contamination and that a valid method exists for testing these clinical specimens. Yet, today validated methods to test clinical specimens in a radiological emergency exist for only six of the 13 highest priority radioisotopes most likely to be used in a terrorist scenario. For those isotopes for which "validated" methods do exist screening 100,000 individual clinical specimens in the wake of a radiological attack could take more than four years to complete due to the current shortfall in radiochemistry laboratories, personnel and equipment. Environmental sampling could take as long as six years to complete given the current capacity and capabilities of the U.S. radiochemistry laboratory infrastructure. The analytical requirements for responding to a potential radiological emergency are in stark contrast to the nation's existing capabilities. This drastic shortfall in current radiochemistry laboratory capacity, capability and competency is magnified by bureaucratic inertia in addressing this critical issue and the lack of clear lines of authority and responsibility for responding to a radiological event. A 2005 Department of Homeland Security report on radiological response needs highlighted the potential public health implications of these weaknesses. "Individual dose assessment is essential for predicting the clinical severity, treatment, and survivability of

exposed individuals and identifying those with minimal or no exposure," it said. But, despite the best efforts of many of the radiological experts in the trenches at agencies throughout the federal government the overall government effort to close these gaps have been slow, meek and cumbersome.

While the federal government has resources at hand for responding to terrorist attacks, the proximity of state and local first responders insures they will almost always be the first to arrive at the site of an attack. For this reason, the preparedness of state and local governments has become a salient national issue. The President's National Strategy for Homeland Security, issued in June 2002, proposes a number of measures to enhance state and local preparedness for terrorist attacks, particularly those involving weapons of mass destruction. Most of these measures, presently undertaken by FEMA and several other agencies, but will be transferred to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), which Congress authorized in the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (P.L. 107-296). Some observers have also asked for more flexibility with federal funds. Use of risk analysis-The process of risk analysis is generally used by risk experts to identify and evaluate options for reducing risks to human health and safety. usefulness of risk analysis and the appropriate methodology, however, are frequently debated by emergency managers and analysts. Federal training programs-State and local first responders generally rate federal terrorism training as effective and helpful.

Many observers, however, cite a number of faults in federal training, such as lack of interagency coordination, insufficient quantity of course offerings, and lack of course information for state and local officials. Mutual aid compacts-Mutual aid compacts are widely acknowledged to be an effective and efficient means of sharing emergency management resources among different jurisdictions. Federal support for mutual aid could better prepare states and localities for all disasters, including terrorist attacks. Joint training exercises-Exercises can potentially improve emergency preparedness by allowing first responders from different agencies (e.g., law enforcement, fire and rescue, and public health) and different levels of government to become familiar with others' capabilities and practices. Effective allocation of pandemic influenza vaccine will play a critical role in preventing influenza and reducing its effects on health and society when a pandemic arrives. The specific type of influenza that causes a pandemic will not be known until it occurs. Developing a new vaccine in response will take several months and pandemic vaccine may not be available when cases first occur in the United States. Moreover, once vaccine production begins, it will not be possible to make enough new vaccine to protect everyone in the early stages of a pandemic. The U.S. Government is taking steps to minimize the need to make vaccine allocation decisions by supporting efforts to increase domestic influenza vaccine production capacity. Significant funding is being provided to develop new vaccine technologies that allow production of enough pandemic influenza vaccine for any person in the United States who wants to be vaccinated within six months of a pandemic declaration. Until this goal is met, Federal, State, local and tribal governments, communities, and the private sector will need guidance on who should be vaccinated earlier during the pandemic to best protect our people, communities, and country. Issues to consider in drafting guidance on pandemic influenza vaccination are different and more complex than in developing recommendations for annual vaccination against seasonal influenza. In contrast with seasonal influenza, during a pandemic nobody in the population is likely to have immunity to the virus, many more people will become ill, and rates of severe illness, complications and death are likely to be much higher and more widely distributed throughout the population. The greater frequency and severity of disease will increase the burden on health care providers and institutions and may disrupt critical products and services in health care and other sectors. National and homeland security

could be threatened if illness among military and other critical personnel reduces their capabilities. Because the needs that must be addressed by pandemic vaccination differ from seasonal influenza vaccination, the guidance on vaccination differs as well. This guidance is intended to provide strong advice to support planning an effective and consistent pandemic response by States and communities. Nevertheless, it is important that plans are flexible as the guidance may be modified based on the status of vaccine technology, the characteristics of pandemic illness, and risk groups for severe disease - factors that will remain unknown until a pandemic

actually occurs.

The report concludes with a list of 13 recommendations for action in the areas of increased structural integrity, enhanced fire endurance of structures, new methods for fire resistant design of structures, enhanced active fire protection, improved emergency response, improved procedures and practices, and education and training. One of these is new; the other twelve are reiterated from the investigation into the collapse of the WTC towers. Each of the 13 is relevant to WTC 7.
