Introduction The Reprint an Outpatient Label option is used to reprint up to 999 copies of a prescription label. These labels may be required to replace damaged ones or to add to additional containers.

ImportantThe Reprint an Outpatient Label option only makes labels for existing
prescriptions. This option does not subtract stock from inventory. For
example, you may use this option to reprint a label for a prescription that was
dropped and broken. The stock used to replace the damaged prescription is
not subtracted from inventory. A label reprint does not count as workload.
