PREFACE

Purpose of the Installation Guide.

This document describes new features and functionality of the Equipment/Turn-In Request Module V. 1.0, and is included among the following mandatory components of DHCP software documentation.:

- Installation Guide/Release Notes (combined or as separate documents)
- Technical Manual
- Package Security Guide
- User Manual(s)

Reference Numbering System

This document uses a paragraph numbering system that helps the reader understand how the sections of the document relate to each other. For example, suppose this paragraph was section 1.3. Under the numbering system, this paragraph would be the main paragraph for the third section of Chapter 1. If there were two subsections to this section, they would be numbered sections. 1.3.1 and 1.3.2. A paragraph numbered 1.3.5.4.7 would be the seventh subsection of the fourth subsection of the fifth subsection of the third subsection of Chapter 1. Actually, what you have is a tool (numbering system) in place that allows the reader to more easily follow the logic of sections of information that contain several subsections.

Preface

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CHAPTER 1 RELEASE NOTES

1.1 Overview

The Equipment/Turn-In Request Module has two components; it includes the ability to request new non-expendable equipment and replacement equipment and also the ability to turn-in old equipment. Non-expendable equipment must go through many stages of review and approval before it can finally be ordered. This module is meant to help track a request through each step and also to maintain important information about requests that can be used later for reports. Turn-Ins must also go through several stages of review and approval before equipment can be removed from inventory.

1.2 New Functionality

This module introduces a new type of official to IFCAP, the Consolidated Memorandum of Receipt (CMR) Official. This is the person who is ultimately responsible for non-expendable equipment that currently exists at the Medical Center and who will be reponsible for any new equipment that will be ordered.

The Equipment/Turn-In Request Module has very close ties to the Engineering package, particularly for the Turn-In part of the module. Removal of old equipment may generate a work order for removal and final disposition will remove the item from inventory. Engineering plays a part in an equipment request also, providing information about the installation, training, and maintenance impact of any new equipment that may be purchased.

CHAPTER 2 PRE-INSTALLATION

2.1 Overview

Equipment/Turn-In Request Version 1.0 introduces new functionality in IFCAP to track both equipment requests up to 2237 processing and turn-in requests through final Personal Property Manager disposition. Please review Chapter 1 Release Notes and the User Manual for more detailed information on this new functionality.

2.2 General Information

2.2.1 Namespace

The Equipment/Turn-In Request Package has been assigned PRCN as its namespace.

2.2.2 Package Dependencies

Installation of the following packages must be accomplished for Equipment/Turn-In Request V. 1.0 to function properly.

2.2.4 Global Placement/Description

The PRCN global is created when loading as a virgin install. PRCN should be defined with access privileges; RWD for System, World, Group and UCI, using %GLOMAN for DSM and %GCH for MSM. This should be the same access level as the Engineering and IFCAP globals.

2.2.5 Required Resources (Hardware/Software)

No special hardware or software is needed for this package.

2.2.6 Special Instructions for Equipment/Turn-In Request Version 1.0

Before you begin the installation, please get together with potential users to determine who will be assigned which menus and security keys. Signature codes may also have to be entered. Please ensure that your CMR file in AEMS/MERS is complete and up-to-date as this module depends on the CMR responsible officials. Some of the users of the Equipment Request/Turn-In File are as follows:

- Requestor
- CMR Official
- Personal Property Manager (PPM)
- Engineering
- Concurring Officials
- Equipment Committee
- Warehouse

If you are a beta or alpha site, please make sure you do not have Equipment/Turn-In users on the system and that a backup has been made of your system before running the installation. Other users can be on the system during installation of this package.

4.2.1 CMR File in Engineering (AEMS/MERS)

During the install a check will be performed on the CMR File (6914.1). This check will look for the following problems; no CMR Official, no CMR Service, non-pointer data, and non-existing data in the pointed to file.

Note: Please ensure that there are valid entries for the Responsible Official and the Alternate Responsible Official before using the Equipment/Turn-In Module.

Load Error Messages

- 1. VERSION 5.0 OF IFCAP HAS NOT BEEN LOADED
 - Your site has not loaded version 5.0 of IFCAP or the version number has not been set correctly in the Package file (9.4).
- 2. VERSION 7.0 OF ENGINEERING HAS NOT BEEN LOADED
 - Your site has not loaded version 7.0 of Engineering or the version number has not been set correctly in the Package file (9.4).
- 3. Engineering Patch 25 not loaded yet!
 - Two Engineering programs released in patch 25 are missing. Please load patch EN*7*25 and start installation again.

CMR File Report

Prior to release of Engineering v.7.0, the RESPONSIBLE OFFICIAL and the SERVICE fields were defined as free text fields but were changed in version 7.0 to point to their respective files; #200 and #49. If you receive a message about a pointer, it means that the free text was never edited to the correct entry. Please be sure that the appropriate A&MM person has menu option, CMR File Enter/Edit [ENCMR] so that the entries may be corrected.

The install report:

- 1. Lists CMRs with no defined CMR Responsible Official.
- 2. Lists CMRs with no defined Service.
- 3. Lists CMRs with non-pointer CMR Responsible Official.
- 4. Lists CMRs with non-pointer Service.
- 5. Lists CMRs with missing pointer value for CMR Responsible Official.
- 6. Lists CMRs with missing pointer value for Service.
