One truck was heavily damaged from being swept off Main Street. Deport received nearly 11 inches of rain in the last 7 days. **Cooke County** Countywide 04 0930CST 0 0 Flash Flood Heavy flooding was reported in the northeast part of the county. One road was closed. Water did not begin to recede until 2 pm C.D.T.. Over 8 inches of rain fell at Dexter. **Hunt County** Quinlan 04 1025CST Flash Flood Water was reported over roads south of town. **Anderson County** Palestine 04 1030CST Flash Flood Water from one to one and a half feet deep was reported on streets in town. One foot of water was reported over roads south of town. Several streets were closed and two motorists were stranded and had to be rescued. **Grayson County** Whitesboro 1035CST Heavy Rain Highway 377 at Sandusky north of Whitesboro was impassable due to high water **Grayson County** Van Alstyne 04 1258CST Flash Flood Streets in town flooded. **Grayson County** 1400CST Gordonville 04 Flash Flood Flood waters were beginning to recede. Over 10 inches of rain fell. **Tarrant County** Ft Worth Flash Flood 04 1550CST 9 high water rescues were required in southwest part of city. The intersection of Lancaster and Henderson streets was closed. Flooding was reported at 8th Avenue and Rosedale, as well as Interstate 30 and University. **Dallas County Dallas** 1625CST Heavy Rain Heavy rain caused two mud slides, blocking west bound lanes of Interstate 635 at Plano Road, and blocking the east bound lanes of Interstate 635 at Miller Street. A wet weather pattern continued in North Texas during the first part of September. Numerous slow moving showers and thunderstorms developed over the region, bringing heavy rain and flooding. One thunderstorm developed near downtown Fort Worth during the evening rush hour on the 4th. This storm brought very heavy rain and flash flooding, forcing road closures and some high water rescues. In Dallas County, another slow moving thunderstorm brought heavy rain which caused the closure of a portion of an interstate highway by two mud slides.

The tornado moved north-northwest for 1.5 miles then dissipating just north of Frankford Road and east of Old Denton Road. Roof damage occurred at theMcCoy Elementary School, to a church, and 23 homes. **Collin County** 1 E Frisco 05 1405CST 0.1 20 Tornado (F0) Fire department personnel observed a brief tornado touchdown in an open filed just east of Frisco. **Collin County** Celina 05 1430CST 50 0 30K Tornado (F1) The tornado first touched down just north of Prosper and moved due north before dissipating near Celina. Seven homes with roof damage, one home with windows blown out, a storage shed and a greenhouse was destroyed. Showers and thunderstorms remained in North Texas, but became more scattered, as a slow moving upper level low pressure system began to exit the region. This upper low spawned three tornadoes in Dallas and Collin Counties which caused damage to structures. Montague County
