The leafer agrees to pay the Producer, starting with egg Production, as sole compensation for the maintenance and care of all said chickens covered by this agreement, a base amount of 8-1/3 cents per pairly per month, and a yearly conversion and egg premium schedule agreed upon as follows:

Mag prices shall be calculated on an average yearly basis for all grades, and these payments shall be made at the termination of law of said chickens, to be determined by the Dealer.

## Example 2

For all service and supplies as furnished, egg receipts are to be divided in the following manner:

- 1. PULLUT SUPPLIER is to receive 29% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and pullet insurance has been paid.
- 2. PRODUCER is to receive 17% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and nullet insurance has been paid.
- 3. FEED SUPPLIER is to receive 54% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and pullet insurance has been paid.

All egg receipts are to be sent to the Pullet Supplier who in turn agrees to furnish a complete audit every 28 days, along with distribution of the receipts as outlined above.

The Pullet Supplier also agrees to furnish a monthly progress report showing production, feed conversion, price received for eggs and other valuable statistics.

## dxample 3

#### PAYMENT TO THE PRODUCER FROM THE COMPANY

- 1. The Company and the Producer mutually agree that the Company will compensate the Producer for goods and services provided under this agreement.
  - a. A flat rate of 1 cent per bird, per week until the birds attain the age of 23 weeks.
  - b. 3 cents per dozen for all salable eggs produced to be paid every 23 days.
  - c. 35% of all profits derived from the project when completed.

## Example 4

# PAYMENT TO THE PRODUCER FROM THE COMPANY

- 1. The Company and the Producer mutually agree that the Company will compensate the Producer for goods and services provided under this agreement.
  - a. The monthly rate of 5 cents per pullet based on \_\_\_\_\_ (size) house capacity. This is to be charged to the project. When

project is closed out, 70% of all profits remaining, including the sale of old hens will be paid to the Producer, 30% will be paid to the Company.
