

CITY HALL (DISTRICT COURTHOUSE), 4th and E Sts., NW, 1820-1849, George Hadfield, architect. Reconstruction of 1916 maintained exterior appearance: concrete, steel, stone; 2 stories on high basement, E-shaped, hipped and gabled roof sections, central projecting pedimented Ionic hexastyle portico, wings with distyle Ionic parapeted pavilions; main floor windows of center block round arched in recessed arched panels; interior from 1916; altered 1935 1966. Greek Revival. Constructed for use as city hall has housed city offices federal offices and the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, among other functions Location of famous trials, including those of John Surrat, one of the Lincoln conspirators; President Garfield's assassin, Charles Guiteau; and the Teapot Dome scandal. *Municipal*: NHL, HABS, G.
