#### Biography

Journalist and collector Ulysses "Jim" Walsh (1903-1990) was born in Richmond, Virginia on July 20, 1903. Best known for his "Favorite Pioneer Recording Artists" column that appeared in *Hobbies* magazine for over forty years, Walsh was recognized as one of the greatest collectors and authorities on popular acoustical-era recording artists and their recordings.

Walsh took an early interest in records, amassing a sizable collection and encyclopedic knowledge by the time he was a teenager. Walsh began writing for newspapers in the late 1920s and had articles published in specialty magazines about recording artists. In 1934, Walsh moved to Johnson City, Tennessee to become a reporter for the *Johnson City Press*, a job he would hold for nine years. Ulysses Walsh acquired the nickname "Jim" which he went by for the rest of his life, while working for the Press. While living in Tennessee in 1939, Walsh began hosting a radio program on local station WJHL. His program "Wax Works" showcased old recordings from his collection and gave him a forum to discuss the lives and accomplishments of the artists whose music he played.

In 1942, Walsh began writing his column on early recording artists for *Hobbies* magazine. The column, originally called "The Coney Island Crowd," was soon renamed "Favorite Pioneer Recording Artists," the name under which it continued to be published through 1985. The column focused particularly on popular and vernacular recordings made before 1909, including jazz, humor, minstrel and vaudeville; the focus was later broadened to include those artists who recorded before the dawn of electric recording techniques in 1925. In the following years, Walsh became well-known among collectors as the authority on these early popular recordings. Although best known for his *Hobbies* columns, Walsh reached an even wider audience through his contributions to *Variety* and *The New Yorker*, among other publications.

In 1943 Walsh moved to the town of Vinton, Virginia, adjacent to Roanoke, and joined the staff of the *Roanoke World News*. At the same time, he made connections with radio station WDBJ in Roanoke and resurrected his show "Walsh's Wax Works" on the new station. After a short run, he moved the show to radio station WSLS, where it was broadcasted through 1960.

Walsh continued to collect recordings, playback equipment, and reference resources such as record catalogs, magazines and advertisements. For many of his favorite artists, such as Billy Murray, Al Jolson, Harry Lauder, and Vernon Dalhart, Walsh collected nearly every recording they had ever made. Walsh became a great correspondent, fostering relationships with recording artists, collectors, dealers, and his readers and listeners. In later years, Walsh traveled to gatherings of early recording artists and collectors, meeting many of the artists he had idolized as a child.

Walsh was a lifetime bachelor, and had a deep devotion to his many cats. He gave updates on his "family of cats" in much of his correspondence and occasionally in his columns; he even arranged to have poems published under the name of his favorite cat: Professor Plum Duff Walsh, Ph.D.

During the late 1970s and 1980s Walsh's health declined, and he complained of memory losses. In May, 1985 his last column was published in *Hobbies*. He died in 1990 after several years of residence in nursing homes. Walsh was posthumously awarded the first Lifetime Achievement Award given by the Association for Recorded Sound Collections (ARSC) in 1991.

#### **Scope and Content**

Jim Walsh devoted his life to collecting, researching and writing about early popular recordings and recording artists. These papers make up part of a much larger gift of early recordings, audio equipment and related items donated by Walsh to the Library of Congress between 1965 and 1987. The collection consists of approximately 40,000 discs, 500 cylinders and 23 early phonographs. Recordings in the collection are primarily of popular and vernacular music, recorded during the acoustical era (pre-1926). It includes a nearly complete run of 5,000 to 6,000 Edison "Diamond Disc" recordings as well as many early Edison cylinders.

This portion of the collection consists of documents and other paper records produced by Mr. Walsh that relate to his career and collecting efforts. They consist of correspondence with prominent artists and collectors, research notes, photographs of performers, scripts for Walsh's radio shows, drafts of his columns and articles, clippings, bound journals, advertisements, scrapbooks and ephemera. The collection also holds a wealth of biographical information about Jim Walsh, including a diary, scrapbooks, photographs and writings. This collection has been divided into the following series: Correspondence/Research Files, Writings, Radio Scripts, Ephemera, Photographs, Oversize Materials, and Volumes.

Researchers are cautioned to wear gloves when handling these materials; this collection was stored in unsanitary conditions prior to its transfer to the Library of Congress.

#### **Series Descriptions**

#### Series I. Correspondence/Research Files (1913-1987, n.d.), 2.94 linear feet

This series consists of correspondence, notes, copies of birth and death records, obituaries and other materials collected by Walsh as he researched performers and recordings. The collection is divided into two subseries: Correspondence, and Research Files.

The Correspondence subseries consists of Jim Walsh's written communications with collectors, dealers, experts, record companies, readers, and listeners. Many of the letters consist of requests for information, responses to requests for information, discussions concerning equipment, inquiries about particular recordings or companies, and potential purchases or trades. Letters are filed alphabetically by correspondent's name; a few miscellaneous and unidentified folders are available at the end of the subseries. Frequent correspondents include: Duane Deakins, Allen Debus, Milford Fargo, Jim Martindale and Quentin Riggs.

Research files are arranged alphabetically by artist or subject and consist of information about individuals, recordings and subjects. Many of the files include correspondence with or concerning each recording artist or personality, and this is complemented by a wealth of other biographical information. Resources include copies of birth and death records, newspaper and magazine clippings, record lists, obituaries, research notes, brief biographies written by Walsh and other miscellaneous items. Researchers can find photographs of many of the individuals represented here in Series V.

#### Series II. Writings (ca. 1942-ca. 1975), .42 linear feet

This collection of Jim Walsh's writings dates from approximately 1942 through 1975, but the majority are undated. Most of the items found in this series are drafts of articles or columns Walsh wrote for *Hobbies, Variety*, or *The New Yorker*, but several bear no indication of their intended publisher. Writings are arranged alphabetically by subject. The articles relate primarily to the history of recording and more specifically address subjects such as Edison's inventions, songs on particular themes, recording artist biographies, and record collecting in general. One folder of writings on miscellaneous topics is included. Copies of indexes to Walsh's *Hobbies* column "Favorite Pioneer Recording Artists" can also be found here.

#### Series III. Radio Scripts (1943-1954, n.d.), .63 linear feet

Series III includes scripts for Walsh's regular broadcasts on radio stations WDBJ and WSLS in Roanoke, Virginia. The majority of the scripts found here date from 1943 through 1949 and are for *Walsh's Wax Works*; many of the scripts include separate playlists. Walsh's shows usually focused on particular themes (for example, songs about girls named Sue), early comedians, early Edison cylinders, or holiday songs. Many of the shows showcased a particular recording artist or composer; an index to these shows is attached to the end of this finding aid. The few scripts available for Walsh's *Sunlight and Shadows* show date from 1947 and 1948. A folder of unidentified and partial scripts is included at the end of the series.

#### Series IV. Ephemera (1915-1972, n.d.), .21 linear feet

Ephemera in this collection dates from 1915 through 1972; many items are undated. Included in the series are advertisements for equipment and recordings, newspaper and magazine clippings, newsletters, record catalogs and price lists, and a few miscellaneous items. Researchers are advised to see Series VI for oversize ephemera.

#### Series V. Photographs (1867-ca. 1985, n.d.), 1.68 linear feet

Series V consists of approximately 610 photographs of artists and personalities from the early days of recording. Most of the photographs are black and white, but some modern color photographs are included. Many of the photographs are copies (mostly of poor quality) made from earlier prints, books, albums, or posters. Many of the photographs here were used by Walsh to illustrate his columns in *Hobbies*. Oversize photographs are filed in Series VI.

#### Series VI. Oversize Materials (1914-1953, n.d.) 1.2 linear feet

Oversize materials consist of advertisements, newspaper and magazine clippings, scrapbook photocopies, a record sleeve, miscellaneous artwork, and photographs. An series of stand-up cardboard advertising figures are included; figures depicted are Victor Herbert, Irene Bordoni, Georgie Price, Fannie Brice, Will Rogers, Ernestine Schumann-Heink, Tito Schipa, Luisa Tetrazzini, and Titta Ruffo. Artwork consists of a cartoon panel signed by Jimmy Hatlo, a (poor) reproduction of the painting "The Firstborn" by Fagan, and a drawing of Mostar, Bosnia by Josh Newman. A record sleeve from a Theodore Roosevelt address recorded in 1913 can also be found in this series. Oversize photocopies of a scrapbook with clippings on Charley Case are in the final folder. One large poster entitled "Some Columbia Talent" with photographs of various recording artists is housed separately from the collection.

#### Series VII. Volumes 7.6 linear feet

This series consists of scrapbooks as well as bound journals, columns, pamphlets and a diary. Many of the publications in the series include Walsh's notes and hand-written indices. Several published books, bound journals, and record catalogs were removed from the Walsh Collection and integrated into the library's general collections.

#### Provenance

This collection was donated to the Library of Congress by Jim Walsh in several increments between 1965 and 1987.
