Santana Tribute Band "MILAGRO" in Concert at BNL, Oct 14th "Dedicated to the Songs of Carlos Santana"

In celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month, the BERA Hispanic Heritage Club will host a Latin-Rock concert featuring Milagro, a Santana tribute band. The public event will take place in Berkner Hall, October 14, 2006 at 7:30 pm. Milagro is a seven-piece band with a full percussion section. The band will cover Carlos Santana's songs from the 1960s to the present. In addition, the group will cover songs from the famous Latin percussionist, the late Tito Puente. Juan Antonio (lead guitarist and vocalist), Pedro Robles (congas, percussion and timbales), Eddie Velasquez (keyboards), Joe Lopez (drums), Julio Claudio (vocals and hand percussion), Juan Rodriguez (congas) and Frank Tasielli (bass) have performed throughout Long Island at colleges and clubs with great response. Carlos Santana

Mexican-born guitarist, who became a superstar in the late 1960s with a string of hits and appearances at Woodstock in 1969. Then, after several quiet decades, he experienced a huge popular renaissance. Santana's 1999 album *Supernatural*, featuring collaborations with stars such as Lauryn Hill, captured a record-tying eight Grammy Awards and sold millions of copies.



Tito Puente

(April 20, 1923 - May 31, 2000) was an influential Latin jazz and mambo musician. The Puerto-Rican native from Spanish Harlem in New York City is often credited as "El Rey" (the King) of the timbales, "The Mambo King" and "The King of Latin Music". He is best known for the dance-oriented mambo and Latin jazz compositions that helped keep his career going for some fifty years.

Did You Know...

Luis Alvarez, known as the "Wild Idea Man" by his colleagues was involved in a wide range of research topics, from the refraction of light to the discovery of a new element (tritium). In 1943 he joined the Manhattan Project research team where he developed the detonating device used in the first plutonium bomb.

Dr. Carlos Juan Finlay discovered that yellow fever is transmitted by the bite of one species of mosquito and invented a method for the extinction of the disease.

Ellen Ochoa was the first Hispanic woman to become an astronaut. A veteran of two space flights, she first flew in space on the shuttle Discovery in 1993. Ochoa is not only an astronaut but also an inventor, holding three patents.

- 5. In 1999 I won a record-tying 8 Grammys, including the "Album of the Year" Award.
- 6. What year was Brookhaven National Laboratory's Hispanic Heritage Club established?
