

## For Crickets, It's Wise to Blend In

lightless Mormon crickets, like those on a road in northeastern Utah, above, are a lot like locusts - except that when they migrate by the millions, they walk and hop.

Observers who are not crickets have always wondered why they would want to be in such a crowd. One idea is that there is safety in numbers. Predators following the crowd should have so many crickets to choose from that one cricket among millions would have good survival odds.

Dr. Gregory A. Sword of the Department of Agriculture's Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory in Sidney, Mont., worked with colleagues from the University of North Carolina and the University of Toronto to test this hypothesis.

They glued tiny transmitters on the inch-and-a-half-long insects and removed some crickets from the horde. All the crickets who stayed with the crowd survived the experiment. But about half the lone crickets died. Their transmitters were found chewed and pecked, in trees and rodent burrows. If you're a cricket, it appears, you need to go along to get along.
