Every year, the BERA Concert Committee organizes a concert series that brings recognized artists to Brookhaven. The concerts are open to the public, and they begin at 8:30 p.m. in Berkner Hall.

For each concert, general admission is \$7, students and senior citizens are \$4, and those under 18 pay \$3. For concertgoers who purchase block tickets, the bargain price is \$5 a ticket for five or more tickets. Block tickets are good at any concert, with one exception — only one out of every four block tickets can be used for the first concert, the popular Tokyo String Quartet.

The world-renowned Tokyo String Quartet will open the concert series with a program of Haydn, Beethoven and Brahms. This is the group's fourth appearance at Brookhaven in the last seven years.

These are two outstanding young artists who will appear in a special joint recital with pianist Margo Garrett.

The Rogeri Trio — Wednesday, November 9

Flawless playing and extraordinary ethereal beauty are some of the words used by critics to describe the Rogeri Trio.

The Lucarelli/Norell/Siebert Trio — Wednesday, December 7

Flutist Rene Siebert and oboists Bert Lucarelli and Judith Norell combine their talents in playing music from 18th century Bach to 20th century Berio.

The Herrick Quartet — Friday, March 9

The Herrick Quartet plays works for flute, violin, viola and cello, written by major composers such as J.C. Bach, Mozart and Copeland.

Agustin Anievas, Pianist — Tuesday, April 3

Pianist Agustin Anievas was last at BNL five years ago. Those who recall his magnificent performance will not want to miss this concert.
